That a Special Committee on Orientals in British Columbia which was appointed on October 1st, 1940, to investigate the position of persons of Japanese and Chinese racial origin, who are resident in British Columbia, and to report upon the problem of Japanese and Chinese in that province from the point of view of national security, with particular reference to the question of military training, made a report on December 2, 1940, recommending inter alia that, both for purposes of civil security and in order to deprive persons hostile to the Japanese, of a constant and effective ground for complaint, there should be a re-Japanese, of a constant and effective ground for complaint, there should be a registration of the Japanese population in

That the Cabinet War Committee con-That the Cabinet War Committee considered and approved such recommendation and by Order in Council P.C. 117, dated January 7th, 1941, a standing committee was appointed to assist the Government by overseeing the execution of such recommendations of the Special Committee as the Committee and the Committee as the committee with the committee of the committee as the committee of the committee of the committee as the committee of t Government might from time to time re-fer to it for action;

14. In this order the expression "person of the Japanese race" shall include a person not wholly of the Japanese race if his father or mother is of the Japanese race and if the Commissioner of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, by notice in writing, requires him to register.

15. No prosecution under this order

No prosecution under this order shall be commenced without the leave of the Attorney General of Canada or of the province in which the offence is alleged to have been committed.
