About 12 p.m., I came home and found the window open and everything turned upside down. There was a small bank there belonging to my wife, and a revolver stolen. Wire netting which was across the window was taken off. (Bank produced and identified. Put in evidence as Exhibit "A."). It contained some money. I can't say exactly how much. I had left 33. on top of the bureau. It was also taken. I don't know who stole it.

Cross-examined: -

I left the house that night at about 6:30 p.m. The bank was at the house when I left. I saw it there in my room at 6 o'clock. There were about twenty people left in the house when I went away. They were there all the time. I returned about 12 o'clock, opened my room and saw the window open. The door had been locked and I had the key with me. None of the guests could get in. The Jurors for our Lord the King present that Charles Donohue, at the City of Vancouver,

in the County of Vancouver, in the Province of British Columbia, on the third day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, between the hours of ten and eleven in the night of the said third day of November, the dwelling house of Y. Aoki, situate in Westminster avenue, in said city, unlawfully and burglariously did break and enter with intent the goods and chattels of the said Y. Aoki in the said dwelling house then being unlawfully to steal, and one iron box, one revolver and ten dollars in cash of the goods and chattels of the said Y.
