

That the sentence I received is unreasonable and to severe for the loss, and nature, of the crime committed.

That the learned Judge did not take into consideration my age, nor previous character, which is not so bad that I deserve a sentence of two years for a theft charge which amounted to five dollars.

That I was destitute at the time of my arrest, and have no relations living, nor any friends to appeal to for aid.

That through desparation and hunger I committed this crime on the impulse of the moment in order to get something to eat.

Be it remembered that on the 5th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, at the City of New-Westminster, Joe Wilson, hereinafter called the accused, being charged before me, the undersigned Henry L. Edmonds, K.C., Police Magistrate in and for the City of New Westminster, is convicted before me, for that he the said Joe Wilson, at the City of New Westminster on the 31st day of May, A.D. 1933, did unlawfully steal from the store of S. Uyeno, 843 Columbia Street in the City of New Westminster aforesaid, five caps of the value of Four Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents, (\$4.75), the property of the said S. Uyeno: Contrary to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and I adjudged the accused for his said offence, to be imprisoned in the British Columbia Penitentiary and there kept at hard labour for the term of two years.
