
Has the B.C. government made any representation in Ottawa with regard to this matter? Or has any fish organization made any publications with regard to this problem?

Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of January 28th, we are forwarding under separate cover a copy of this Department's annual report for 1944 and have to advise that the principal publication of this Department is an annual report, together with reprints of the appendices appearing therein.

With respect to the matter of what the Federal Government is doing in connection with the re-establishment of the Japanese fishing trade, this is a question which should be addressed to the Federal authorities. May I suggest that you communicate with Dr. D. B. Finn, Deputy Minister of Fisheries, Ottawa. I am not aware that the British Columbia Government has made any representation to Ottawa in regard to this matter, nor do I know of any representations which may have been made by any of the fishery organizations on this coast.
