

Dear Sir:

Your letter of March 15th, addressed to Mr. Ceo. Pearson, Commissioner of Fisheries, has been handed to me for reply.

In answering the verious questions with respect to the salmon fisheries of the Province, I can probably do no better than to refer you to literature on the subject. I am, therefore, forwarding under separate cover, a copy of a booklet entitled "The Commercial Salmon Fisheries of British Columbia," also a copy of the Special Fishery Regulations for British Columbia. A perusal of these two booklets will answer most of your questions with the probable exception of what disposal has been made of the vessels formerly owned by Japanese fishermen. In connection with this latter, I have to advise that all of these vessels which were formerly owned by Japanese fishermen and immobolized by the Department of National Defence, have since been disposed of to white fishermen. Practically all of them are back in the fishing industry.

The fishing in British Columbia is, in many respects, similar to fishing in any other part of the world, in that the fish are where you find them. Before investing any money in equipment in the fisheries of British Columbia, I would suggest that you personally visit the coast and, if possible, work for a season in the fisheries, either as a fisherman or in one of the shore plants, with a view to obtaining personal knowledge


