
Dear Mr. Alexander:

Dear Mr. Macgregor,-

I have for acknowledgment and reply your communication of July 16th regarding the system of licensing which has been established in British Columbia.

In so far as licensing is concerned in the fisheries, the actual catching of fish is under the control and regulation of the Federal Government and for detailed information I would suggest that you communicate with the Federal Department of Fisheries, Ottawa. After the fish are caught, however, the processing plants come under the jurisdiction of the Provincial Government. All processing plants must obtain a licence from this Department, the amount of the licence fee varying according to the kind of plant. Certain processing operations have largely come under the control of Japanese and, as the Provincial Government cannot control products for export, very little has been done regarding the control of Oriental activities.

For your information I am enclosing herewith a copy of the Provincial Fisheries Act together with Schedule of Licence Fees - which may be of some value to you in preparing your report.
