

MEMORANDUM:

Hon. John Hart, Premier, Buildings.



Board of Trade, herewith returned, I have to advise that a road has been mooted between Shutty's Bench and Lardeau for some time, and now that the railway grade has been converted into a highway it is quite likely that a through road to Kaslo will be advocated.

We have no surveys of this route, but the approximate distance would be fifteen miles, which would cost in the neighborhood of \$225,000 to construct.

As far as this Department is concerned, it is felt that there are several sections of public highway in the vicinity of Kaslo which require a great deal of improvement, and if Japanese labour should be made available by the Dominion authorities, possibly these roads should receive prior consideration, particularly the main highway between Nelson and Kaslo, which is in many places very narrow, with poor alignment.

With respect to Japanese labour which may be available in the vicinity of Slocan City, there are many improvement projects on the main Slocan Highway adjacent to these settlements where suitable winter work could be carried on, and it might be quite desirable to approach the Dominion authorities with a view to doing as much of this work as may be possible; on the understanding, of course, that there will be no cost to this Government, excepting the costs for right-of-way and location surveys, as has been usual on all previous Japanese National undertakings.
