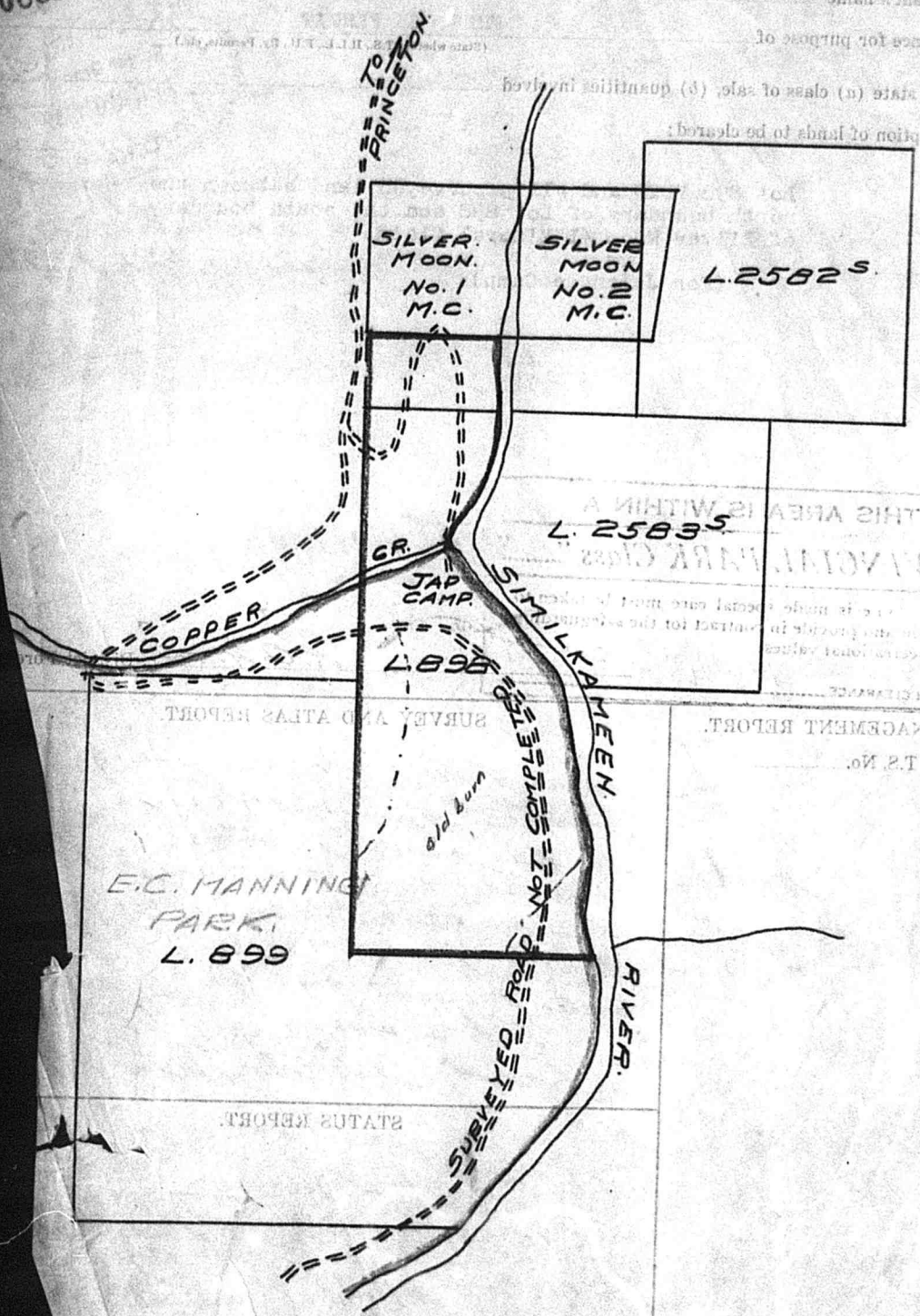

Herewith attached please find request for clearance for Free Use Permit for cordwood for the Department of Mines and Resources for the Japanese road camp.

The south part of Lot 898 is within Manning Park which is a Class "A" park. Most of the area of Lot 898 which is within the Park is an old burn, and cutting of cordwood may be considered an improvement as well as reducing the fire hazard. The area outside the Park has not sufficient cordwood on it to supply the camp. A suitable area several miles away probably could be found, but as transportation is an important factor at this time we recommend clearing the area as requested for Free Use Permit. The camp is on the area as shown on the sketch.



Please refer to your application for permit to cut cordwood for fuel purposes at the Japanese road camp located on Lot 898, Y.D.Y.D., Hope-Princeton road, submitted through the District Forester's Office at Kamloops.


The area applied for lies, for the most part, within the E.C. Manning Park, the remainder being located at the road approach to the park. For this reason it is desired to maintain insofar as possible the scenic values in green timber. Under the circumstances no objection will be raised by this Department to your utilization for camp fuel purposes, free of charge, dead and down timber only, within the area described below and subject to the further conditions:

- (1) that trees shall be cut with the lowest possible stump height;
- (2) all debris shall be piled and burned at least fifteen (15) feet distant from live trees.

The cordwood operation is to be confined to dead and down timber located on Lot 898, Y.D.Y.D., and all unsurveyed land between the north boundary of said Lot 898 and the south boundary of "Silver Moon #1" mineral claim and subject to no encroachment thereon.



Attached herewith please find copy of correspondence between the Deputy Minister and the B.C. Security Commission, Vancouver, B.C.

The Commission are seeking authority to cut fuel wood from vacant Crown lands to supply the fuel needs of the evacuated Japanese now being established in communities in Greenwood, Slocan, Kaslo and Sandon.

This application does not come within the scope of the "Forest Act" but you will note that as a matter of expediency the Deputy Minister is not raising any objection to the utilization of timber without charge for the purposes indicated.

In selecting the various areas we would request that you be guided wherever practicable by the following considerations:

- (a) that the cutting should be in the nature of a salvage and confined to dead and down material;
- (b) that this may offer an opportunity for reduction of hazard areas.

Please submit an application for clearance in all cases in the usual manner before allowing cutting.

Subsequent to receipt of clearance approval will you please write a letter to the various officials in charge advising them that this Department will have no objection to the cutting of fuel wood without charge on the cleared area, giving the description. It may also be advisable to attach a sketch of the area to your letter.

Operations should be conducted in such a manner as to obtain as complete utilization as possible and having always in mind the reduction rather than the creation of any hazard, therefore please incorporate in your letter any necessary conditions to that end and any others you may deem advisable or necessary.

As apparently an early commencement of operations is desirable will you please get in touch with the various officials as quickly as possible.

Your letter of the 3rd instant addressed to the Honourable Mr. Pearson having reference to an application for a fuel supply for the Japanese housing project has been handed to me for attention.

In reply I have to advise that insofar as this Department is concerned no objection will be raised to the cutting of fuel wood without charge for camp purposes from suitable Crown lands to be selected under the direction of the District Forester at Nelson.

It is considered however that insofar as practicable the wood utilized should be dead and down material not suitable for the manufacture of other forest products.

We are communicating with the District Forester, Nelson, instructing him to get in touch with your officials in charge of the various communities in order to arrange for the selection of satisfactory areas so that operations may commence at an early date.

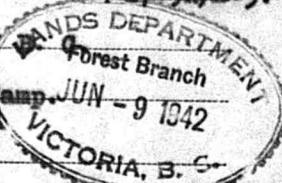

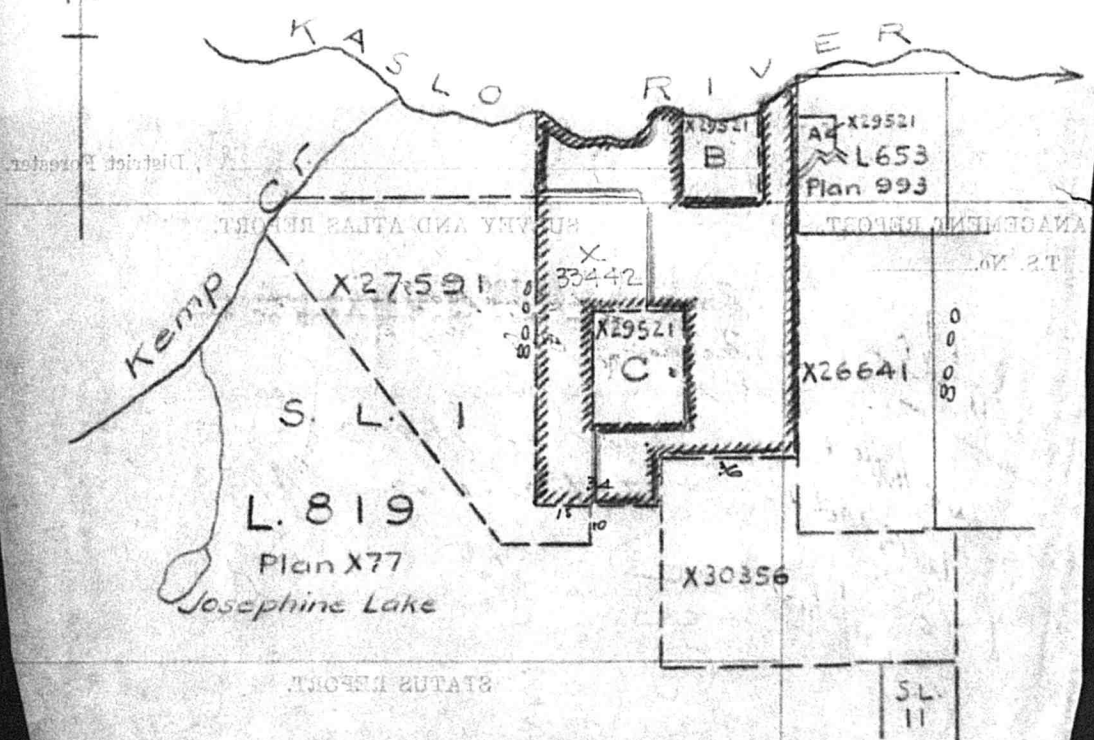

With respect to request for permission to allow Japanese coming under my jurisdiction and living in the vicinity of Kaslo to cut fuel wood without charge for their own personal use should same be granted I agree to comply with the following conditions which I understand will be strictly enforced and that failure to comply with said conditions will warrant cancellation of this concession without previous notification:


Your letter of the 10th instant, with enclosure, in reference to the supply of cordwood for the Japanese camp at Bridge River, is received.

We take it from your letter to the District Forester at Kamloops that you have made arrangements with the Indian Department to obtain your wood supply from Indian Reserve No. 1-A, which you indicate as Block A in your letter, and that the only service you require from us is confirmation of the going stumpage rate for cordwood in this vicinity. In this connection, we wish to advise that on timber sales the average charge is 25¢ per cord for stumpage, plus 35¢ royalty. As wood cut from an Indian Reserve carries no royalty, the stumpage would therefore be proportionately higher.

Should it be your intention to obtain your fuel supply from Crown land, and in this connection please refer to the Deputy Minister's letter of June 6th last, upon receipt of further advice from you, we will communicate with the District Forester at Kamloops in order that suitable arrangements may be made for the cutting of fuel on Crown land.

With reference to your memo of above date re Japanese cutting cordwood.



The only place that the Japanese are now cutting wood is on B.C. Power Co. land at Bridge River. So far this has been only a small amount and for their own use.

W. Davidson at Minto enquired re obtaining area for Japs to cut on near Minto and the only place that would appear to be suitable is ~~the~~ the South side of Bridge River about 2½ miles below Minto. There is some timber on South portion of L. 3011 and on CL. immediately South of this. Would suggest that if permit is issued that cutting of birch be prohibited as there is some Birch in that locality that might be utilized for peeler logs, though the quantity of this material is not large.

The price of Cordwood in the Bridge River Valley is \$8.00 per Cord. At Bridge River \$ 7.00 to \$7.50 and \$7.00 at Lillooet.

Asst. Ranger Strangward advises that in the Bridge River Valley the sawmill and wood dealers can supply all requirements and any cutting permitted here should be only for the use of the Japanese themselves.

I understand that the camp near Lillooet has made arrangements for obtaining coal from Hat Creek and it is not likely that they will require and permit to cut wood.

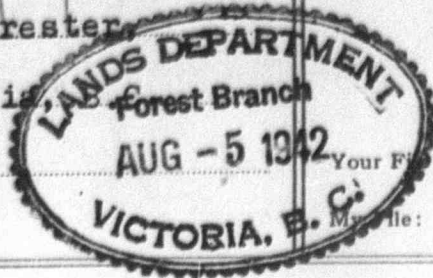

As you requested when I called on you on Monday the 10th instant, I am writing you further with reference to the matters then discussed.

I am informed by Yojiro Takimoto that he and his family together with seventy other Japanese families who have been removed from the protected areas of the Province of British Columbia are now living on the east bank of the Fraser River immediately opposite its confluence with Seton Creek, that is to say in the close vicinity of the town of Lillooet. Their exact location appears to be on lot 1290 as shown on map issued by your Department and styled Pre-emptor's Map, Lillooet Sheet 1938.

Takimoto, who says he is the spokesman for this Japanese group, informs me that they are living there with the permission of the B. C. Security Commission which Commission, as you know, has been charged with the duty of removing the Japanese from the protected areas in British Columbia. Takimoto, for example, has built a home there for his family and I suppose the other Japanese there have done likewise. He tells me that all seventy families are living in the same area on lot 1290.

Takimoto says the Japanese would like permission to cut firewood for their own use on the adjoining lot 1291 or on some other approved location. He informs me that there is no commercial timber in this area, but that it consists of scrub jack pine that would serve no other use than firewood.



While I know it is not the policy of your Department to allow the Japanese in the woods of British Columbia, and certainly agree with that, it seems to me that as the Japanese are already being permitted to live on lot 1290, their engaging in cutting firewood on an adjacent lot would create no further danger than exists now by virtue of their living there. It also seems to me that it would be better for the country and for our war effort to have these Japanese cutting their own firewood, rather than wasting the time of Canadians in cutting and delivering fuel to them.

Should you come to the conclusion that it would be better to have these Japanese cutting their own wood rather than having it supplied to them by some outside agency, possibly the provisions of subsection (2) (c) of section 24 of the "Forest Act" might be invoked.

As I mentioned to you the other day, I believe that Mr. Taylor of your Department has some knowledge of the facts of this case.



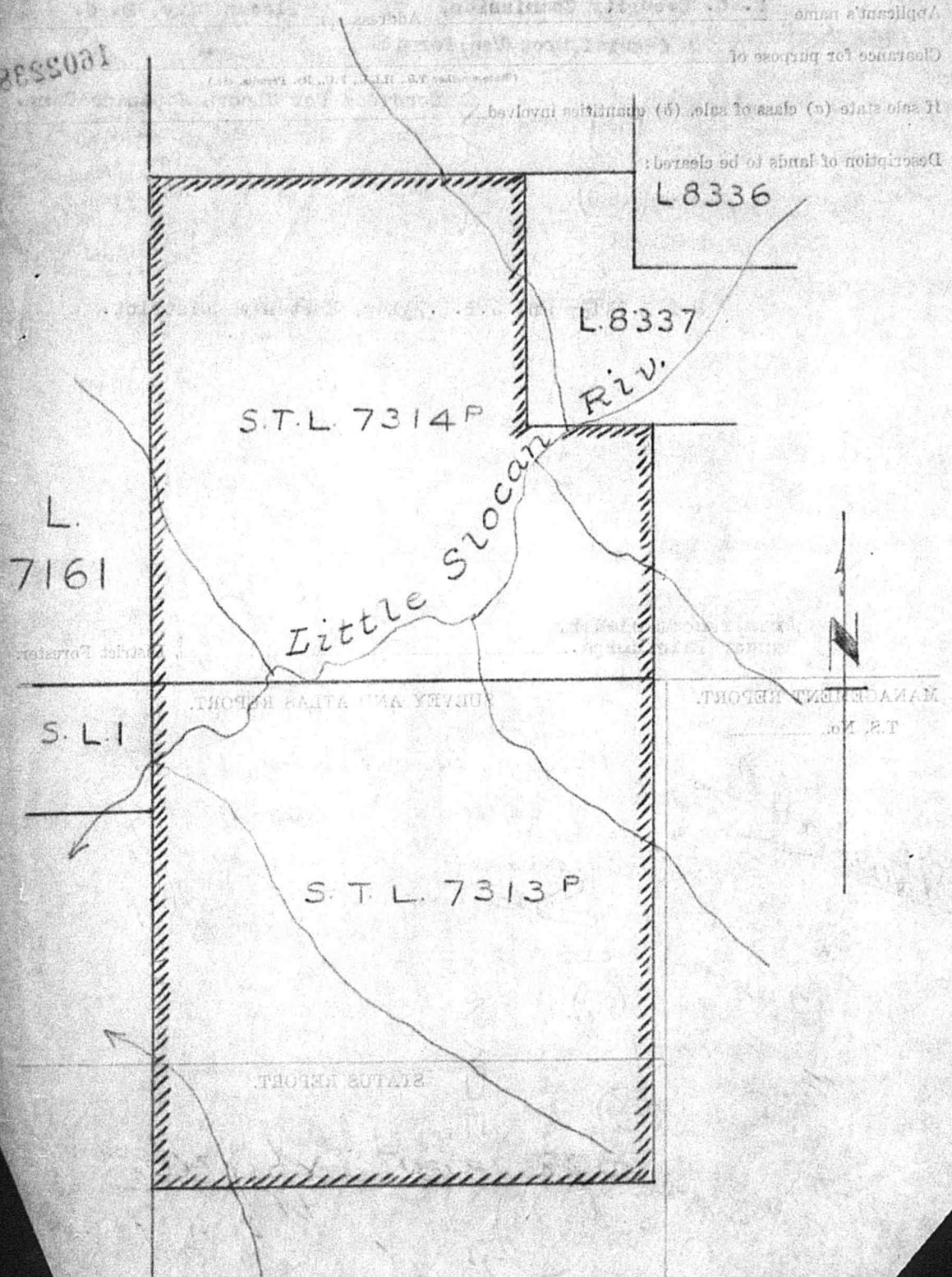

- (2) Cut shall be restricted to dead timber standing or down, unless otherwise specified by the Forest Officer in charge.

We enclose herewith Ranger Mahood's logging inspection report covering cutting by the B.C. Security Commission in the vicinity of the Japanese camp at Tasme on the Hope-Princeton Highway, together with his covering memo of the 9th instant.

You will note that the old Trites Mill is in operation by the Japs for the cutting of construction lumber from right-of-way logs and that the Japanese are cutting fuelwood and shakes on the Ranch area and on adjacent vacant Crown land. According to our records all the cutting is so far confined to the Ranch area except that in L.S. 4 of Section 6.

We are unaware of any agreement in respect to the cutting of timber by the B.C. Security Commission on Crown lands and as to whether or not royalty charges are effective on any of their cutting. Will you please advise in this respect in order that we may take up the matter of timber marks and our charges on material cut on the areas of various status with the Commission here.

In order that you may be clear as to our policy in reference to timber requirements of the Japanese communities established outside the Coastal area as a war measure we are enclosing herewith copy of correspondence between the Commission and the Deputy Minister relating to fuel requirements of Japanese communities established in the Interior.

The question has also arisen in reference to timber requirements in public road construction being carried on by the Japanese, in which case we are applying the policy applicable to the Public Works Department as per page 36A of the "Management Manual".

In reference to the question of camp construction and fuel requirements in these Japanese communities on vacant Crown land the Deputy Minister, as a matter of expediency, is not raising any objection to such utilization of timber as is required for these purposes, without charge. However, in selecting the various areas of vacant Crown land it is requested that you be guided wherever practicable by the following considerations:

1. That the cutting should be in the nature of a salvage and confined to dead and down material;

2. That advantage be taken of the opportunity, where feasible, for a reduction of hazard.

Application for clearance in all cases should be submitted in the usual manner before cutting is permitted and upon receipt of the clearance a letter should be written to the various officials in charge advising them that this Department will have no objection to the cutting of camp requirements without charge on the various areas cleared, which should be fully described in your letter and with sketch map attached. You will find enclosed the form letter adopted for this purpose by the District Forester at Nelson. /9

Operations should be conducted in such a manner as to obtain as complete utilization as possible, bearing in mind at all times the reduction rather than the creation of any hazard. Operating conditions should therefore be incorporated in your letter to this end.

In order to put the matter on a proper basis it will be desirable for you to get in touch with the officers in charge 14 Mile Ranch or the Security Commission's office in Vancouver. You will understand, of course, that any letter permits granted will involve only vacant Crown land desired. It might be advisable to secure for record purposes as complete returns as possible of all timber cut including both private and Crown lands.

Pursuant to conversations of the 19th instant between yourself, Commissioner Shirras and the writer relative to timber cutting operations in the vicinity of the Japanese camp "Tasme" on the Hope-Princeton Highway, we would advise that insofar as this Department is concerned timber cut on the Highway right-of-way or on the Mile 14 Ranch property, or other property under your jurisdiction, will not be charged for as long as the said material is used in connection with this project and not disposed of commercially.

Any cutting of Crown timber outside of the areas referred to above shall be confined to an area selected by the local Forest Officer and cutting thereon shall be conducted according to specified conditions generally similar to those put into effect under similar circumstances by the District Forester in Nelson, B.C. in connection with Japanese camps in that forest district.

In the latter connection our Ranger Mahood has been requested to contact your Superintendent Curry at Tasme and to define for him a suitable area of vacant Crown land containing suitable timber for your requirements. With reference to your letter of the 10th inst., the areas listed by you as suitable for the cutting of fuelwood for the Teshme Camp leaves some doubt in our mind in two instances.

- (1) The S.W. 1/4 of L.S. Sec. 5, should this not be Section 6 ?
- (2) Portions of Sec. 31 in addition to L.S. 4 of Sec. 6 are shown as in Tp.4 R. 24. Is not Sec. 31 in Tp.3, ?

With reference to the conditions you recommend for this permit we are not quite clear as to what you have in mind. You indicate selective cutting of all species except Cedar over 12" dbh, except that all jack pine may be cut. Please advise what species are involved. You understand that our major objective is the reduction of hazard while supplying fuelwood and, therefore, dead and down material should be specified wherever possible. We assume that in recommending cutting of green timber you have reference to an emergency condition that will not apply when the snow goes and makes that area west of the Sumallo available. Possibly, therefore, the cutting east of the Sumallo should be restricted to a period of one or two months or whatever time it will take to make the westerly area available.

In granting this permit we would prefer to retain the general clause used in Free Use Permits, namely "only such live timber shall be cut as is marked or otherwise designated by the Forest Officer in charge".

Please also advise as to the maximum stump height we should require.

The proper system of submitting returns for material cut in all operations here is required. Will you please advise by return mail in order that we may apply for a clearance to cover this application *promptly*.

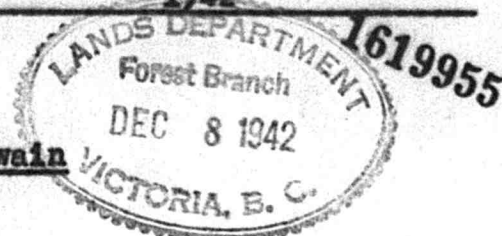

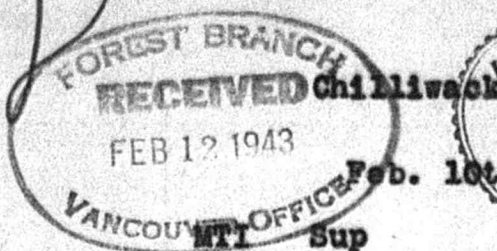

As the timber on the East side of the Sumallo is small and dense it was considered that if the cutting was confined to thinnings of fir, hemlock and balsam with clear cutting of Jack Pine and of course removal of all dead and defective timber that the stand would be much improved. This should only be a temporary permit.

On the West side of the Sumallo a considerable portion of lower hill sides and flats was over run by The Trites fire a few years ago and there is ample fuel to meet the expected needs of this camp. Mr Hartley agreed that as soon as conditions permitted cutting would be restricted to this side. I expect to request him to move to the burnt area on my next visit in about three weeks from now. If we can get around the woods at that time Mr Hartly and I will mark out the boundaries of the cutting area.

With reference to your letter of the 10th inst., the areas listed by you as suitable for the cutting of fuelwood for the Tashme Camp leaves some doubt in our mind in two instances.

- (1) The S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of L.S. Sec. 5, should this not be Section 6 ?
- (2) Portions of Sec. 31 in addition to L.S. 4 of Sec. 6 are shown as in Tp.4 R. 24. Is not Sec. 31 in Tp.3, ?

With reference to the conditions you recommend for this permit we are not quite clear as to what you have in mind. You indicate selective cutting of all species except Cedar over 12" dbh, except that all jack pine may be cut. Please advise what species are involved. You understand that our major objective is the reduction of hazard while supplying fuelwood and, therefore, dead and down material should be specified wherever possible. We assume that in recommending cutting of green timber you have reference to an emergency condition that will not apply when the snow goes and makes that area west of the Sumallo available. Possibly, therefore, the cutting east of the Sumallo should be restricted to a period of one or two months or whatever time it will take to make the westerly area available.

In granting this permit we would prefer to retain the general clause used in Free Use Permits, namely "only such live timber shall be cut as is marked or otherwise designated by the Forest Officer in charge".

Please also advise as to the maximum stump height we should require.

The proper system of submitting returns for material cut in all operations here is required. Will you please advise by return mail in order that we may apply for a clearance to cover this application *comply*.

Further to our request for cancellation of Special Use Permit in the name of the British Columbia Security Commission covering S.T.L. 7313p and S.T.L. 7314p, Kootenay District, please refer to your letter of September 28th, 1944 wherein you deleted the Special Use Permit in order that we might make timber sale over this area.

At that time we had an application from Mr. W. F. Anderson of Vallican to cut fence posts and shingle bolts. Mr. Baird of the British Columbia Security Commission called to see us and he states it is the intention of the Commission to go into the Little Slokan Valley to get their wood supply for 1945-46 and wanted to know if it would be possible to renew their Special Use Permit over the above area.

As you may know, this area is a burnt-over area and most of the timber that has been burnt is wind-thrown and lying on the ground. If the Commission were given a Special Use Permit to cut cordwood in there, they would clean up this hazard and they are also willing to take out whatever fence posts there are and pay stumpage and royalty for same.

If this area was made a timber sale only fence posts would be taken out and in view of the poor road and long distance from markets, it is very doubtful if much would be accomplished. I would, therefore, recommend that this area be held in abeyance until the Commission have completed their plans for next year's operation. We have had the area cruised and was going to put through the timber sale but in view of the verbal application from Mr. Baird, we have held it up. Unless otherwise advised we will withhold this area from timber sale as stated above.

We are now advised that the Commission has acquired a shingle mill and proposes to cut shingles for sale and, in fact, has cut a quantity of bolts from various areas in the vicinity of Tashme particularly on the right-of-way of the Hope-Princeton Highway.

We assume that royalty is definitely applicable to such material but would like to have your advice as to whether or not stumpage should be charged. In your letter mentioned above, it would appear that such cutting is to be considered as comparable to cutting by the Provincial Public Works Department, in which case stumpage apparently does not apply. However, we would like your specific advice at your early convenience.

Paragraph 4, page 2, of our letter of March 2, 1944, deals with charges on timber cut and sold by the B.C. Security Commission, the rate of stumpage and royalty being governed by status.

Referring to timber cut from the right-of-way of the Hope-Princeton Highway or any other public road, royalty is due the Crown and stumpage, if any, may be payable to the Public Works Department as they deem advisable. This applies whether the timber is sold by the Public Works to a purchaser or whether the timber is being removed by contract.

In this particular case, it seems likely that the B.C. Security Commission has received authority to cut and remove this timber from the Public Works Department and are probably being given the timber free of stumpage for the removal of same.
