Remarks On August 14/42 at 9.15 A.M. the Vancouver City Police went to Hastings Park Internment Camp re the death of Ginpachi Nakamura, 24 years of age. This man had been admitted to the Hastings Park Hospital, on May 19/42 suffering from Tuberculosis. He was cared for by Dr. H.E. Cooke, physician in charge there, and died at 6.30 A.M. this date. Dr Cooke stated that the deceased was an interned Japanese and had been admitted from St Josephs Hospital, Vancouver, B.C. to the T.B. Section in Hastings Park, Japanese Internment Camp. On admission to Hastings Park he weighed 98 lbs and was definately established as a Tubercular case.
