Remarks On September 19th 1942 at 10.15 a.m. the R.C.M. Police Dept. reported to the Coroners office that Mrs. Chisako Kabayashi aged 25 years of age had died in the Internment Camp Hospital of Hastings Park early that morning. She was a Japanese National No. 00200 and had arrived in Canada in 1938. According to the police records of the Internment Camp she had been admitted to the Tuberculosis unit in Hastings Park on June 12th 1942 and had been there until she died. Dr. E.H. Cook in charge of the hospital reported that the deceased had active tuberculosis of both lungs, this being confirmed by X-Ray examination and positive sputum tests. The records of St. Joseph's

KOBAYASHI, Mrs. Chisako (00200) born in 1916.

Tuberculosis of both lungs diagnosed on November 17, 1941. X-Ray Report as follows: "There is a dense exudative type of infiltration in the upper 1/2 of the right lung. There is also a similar infiltration in the upper 1/2 of the left lung with what appears to be thickened pleura in the upper and lateral portion of this area. FAR ADVANCED."

April 1, 1942 X-Ray report as follows: "X-Ray shows heavy infiltration in both lungs. Not materially changed."

She was admitted to the Tuberculosis Unit in Hastings Park on June 12, 1942. From that time until her death, her temperature varied between 97 and 102. She had repeated haemorrhages, cough, expectoration, and sputum was positive for tuberculosis. Towards the end she became extremely dyspnoeic and cyanosed, and pulse rapid.
