KOBAYASHI, Mrs. Chisako (00200) born in 1916.

Tuberculosis of both lungs diagnosed on November 17, 1941. X-Ray Report as follows: "There is a dense exudative type of infiltration in the upper 1/2 of the right lung. There is also a similar infiltration in the upper 1/2 of the left lung with what appears to be thickened pleura in the upper and lateral portion of this area. FAR ADVANCED."

April 1, 1942 X-Ray report as follows: "X-Ray shows heavy infiltration in both lungs. Not materially changed."

Hastings Park on June 12, 1942. From that time until her death, her temperature varied between 97 and 102. She had repeated haemorrhages, cough, expectoration, and sputum was positive for tuberculosis. Towards the end she became extremely dyspnoeic and cyanosed, and pulse rapid.
