Report of INQUIRY as to Cause of Death of

AOKI, Hideo

Age 18 Sex Male Birthplace Mission, B.C. Date of death Oct. 4th/42.
Nationality Canadian, Race Japanese.

Remarks On October 4th 1942 at 8.30 A.M. the R.C.M.P. Police phoned the Van. City Coroner concerning the death of Aoki Hideo, aged 18 years of age. This man was admitted to the Detention Camp Hospital at Hastings Park, Vancouver B.C. on August 28th 1942 suffering from Tuberculosis, and was placed on the serious ill list on August 31st. 1942. He died at 8.30 A.M. on October 4th 1942. He was originally at St. Joseph's Hospital, and had lived at Mission B.C. previously.

Opinion of Coroner Investigation and examination shows the body of this young man to be very emaciated. He had had tuberculosis for a long while and died while under Detention at Hastings Park Detention Camp for Japanese. Death was due to Tuberculosis.



Admitted from St. Joseph's Hospital August 28, 1942

Diagnosis - tuberculosis. Temperature on admission -
101. Placed on the seriously ill list on August
31st. Pain and distention of abdomen.
Diarrhea persistently. Pulse rapid. Weakening
rapidly. Profuse diaphoresis at times.
Very emaciated condition. Ceased to breath
8:30 A.M. October 4, 1942.
