She had lived at 1258 Franklin St. and was admitted to the Hastings Park Detention Camp on May 23rd 1942. On May 25th 1942 it was found that she was suffering from tuberculosis and on September 3rd 1942 she was placed on the serious ill list. Before admission to the Detention Camp she had been under the care of Dr. Shimo Takahara.


