Remarks On November 21st 1942, the Sisters of St. Joseph's Hospital advised the Coroners office that Mrs. Yukiko Sagura a Japanese under detention of Hastings Park Internment Camp had died on November 19th 1942 at 11 P.M. This lady had been ill for several months and due to her extreme seriousness had been transferred to St. Joseph's Hospital Vancouver B.C. from Hastings Park Internment Camp on November 17th 1942. Previous to her internment she had lived at 1633 West 2nd Ave. Van. B.C. She was ill for several months and in October 1942 her condition was diagnosed as tuberculosis, then later in November of 1942 it was found out that she actually suffered from metastases of the lungs from a carcinoma of the breast. It is not known who attended her before her death. St. Joseph's Hospital.

Post-mortem findings Autopsy done at the Van. Gen. Hosp. November 20th 1942 by Dr. H.H. Pitts, shows, Carcinoma of breast, with secondary metastasis to both lungs.
