Security Commission phoned the Vancouver Coroner and stated that Gorosuke Mukai, a Japanese from Tashme, #08023 had died en route to Vancouver, B.C. somewhere between Tashme, B.C. and Vancouver in an ambulance. He was certified dead at the V.G.H. Dr. Arthur further stated that the deceased had been ill at Tashme and had been attended to by Dr. Miller at this place. Dr. Miller knew that the Japanese had a carcinoma of the stomach and that this was an old condition and had metastasized. He also concluded that the man was much too ill to be moved as surgical operative procedures were of no use at that late stage. However, his friends and countrymen hired a
