Evidence of Iwa Mukai, wife of Yichido Mukai. and Tokuichi

Mizuyabu, farmer.

Yoshinô Mukai was splitting wood near the kitchen on Thursday afternoon the 17th. He came into the house at about 10.30 p.m. and took a bath. At about 11 he laid down outside. He soon called to us and said he had a very bad headache. We carried him to his room and laid him down in bed. He slept, but started to vomit about 11.30 at twenty to twelve we sent of the Doctor The Doctor did not arrive until about 4.a.m. He pronounced Mukai dead.

Fukujiro Koyama age 36 Farmer gave the same evidence, also Iwa identified the body as that of Yichido Mukai, and said he had been suffering from high blood pressure. He had been a Storekeeper at Steveston.

Constable Weelsman, says I was informed of the death on the morning of the 18th. I examined the body and notified the Coroner.

Dr Patterson says I was called to the Pugh ranch about midnight and arrived there about 4 a .m. I found the body of Yichido who had died before my arrival. I found he had died of a strokes, cerebral haemorrhage, brought on by high blood pressure.
