Whereas Yoshio Takigawa. formerly  
of JAPAN. and now of GOLDEN. in  
(Name of Country.) the Province of British Columbia, Labourer.  
(Occupation.) has complied with

the requirements of the "Naturalization Act," and has duly resided in Canada for the period  
of three years. : And whereas the particulars of the Certificate

granted to the said Yoshio Takigawa. under the fifteenth  
section of the said Act have been duly announced in Court, and thereupon by order of the  
said Court the said Certificate has been filed of record in the same pursuant to the said Act.

This is, therefore, to certify to all whom it may concern, that under and by virtue of the said  
Act Yoshio Takigawa..... has become  
naturalized as a British subject, and is, within Canada, entitled to all political and other rights,  
powers and privileges, and is subject to all obligations to which a natural-born British subject  
is entitled or subject within Canada, with this qualification that he shall not, when within the  
limits of the foreign State of which he was a\* subject. previous to the date  
hereof, be deemed to be a British subject unless he has ceased to be a\* subject. of  
that State, in pursuance of the laws thereof, or in pursuance of a treaty or convention to that  
effect.

# THE NATURALIZATION ACT, CANADA.

## CERTIFICATE UNDER SECTION 10.

39 of 1912

I, Hugh Macdonald  
of Golden BC, Notary Public, do certify that  
that Yoshio Takigawa, formerly of Miyagi Ken, Japan,  
but now residing at Golden BC, an alien, on  
the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1912, subscribed and took before me the  
Oaths of Residence and Allegiance authorized by the thirteenth section of *The Naturalization Act, Canada*  
and therein swore to a residence in Canada of three years; that I have reason to  
believe, and do believe, that the said Yoshio Takigawa  
within the period of three years preceding the said day, has been a resident within Canada  
for three years; that the said Yoshio Takigawa  
is a person of good character, and that there exists, to my knowledge, no reason why the said  
Yoshio Takigawa should not be granted all the rights and  
capacities of a natural-born British subject.

## OATH OF ALLEGIANCE.

—:—

I, Yoshio Takigawa of Golden B.C. Laborer., formerly  
of Miyagi Ken, in Japan, and known  
there by the name of Yoshio Takigawa, and now  
residing at Golden B.C., do sincerely

promise and swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King George V., as lawful Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the Dominion of Canada, dependent on and belonging to the said Kingdom, and that I will defend Him to the utmost of my power against all traitorous conspiracies or attempts whatsoever which shall be made against His Person, Crown, and Dignity, and that I will do my utmost endeavour to disclose and make known to His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, all treasons or traitorous conspiracies, and attempts, which I shall know to be against Him or them; and all this I do swear without any equivocation, mental evasion, or secret reservation. So help me God.
