Minister of National Defense apprising ^{him} ~~him of the Minister~~
of British Columbia's endeavours to curtail the rapid
penetration and infiltration of Orientals in British Columbia

AND FURTHER that we obtain if possible from the
Federal Authorities an assurance that certain privileges
now denied Orientals in Vancouver and British Columbia will
not be granted as a result of their serving in His Majesty's
Forces for Home defense.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT This ^{Committee} ~~Council~~ seriously
recommends to the Honourable Minister that Orientals trained
under the forced Draft, be dispersed throughout Canada, and
not concentrated on the Pacific Coast, where an alarming
proportion of the Population is of Japanese racial origin.

Whereas.

The assurances of the Prime Minister (Hon MacKenzie King) to the effect that the Govt are satisfied of the loyalty & devotion of Japanese in British Columbia to Canada and the Empire is reassuring to this Council.

And whereas Federal Authorities are anxious to dispel any antagonistic suspicion, or doubt which may be harboured by British Columbians against Japanese resident in Canada

And whereas this Council is desirous of cooperating, provided the Government is prepared to take such steps as will sever the close bonds which bind Japanese in Canada to Japan, and Japanese Customs, traditions and standards, with a view to a greater inculcation of Canadian ideals and standards.

∴ be it resolved that this Council request the Federal and Provincial Authorities to investigate the curriculum of Japanese national schools and in the interest of National Unity take the necessary measures leading to their abolition.

Further be it resolved that this Council pray that the Federal Authorities take immediate steps to renounce the so called Gentleman's Agreement, which permits the entry of Japanese settlers into Canada.

Whereas the danger of a Japanese
invasion of ~~British~~ ~~the~~ ~~Pacific~~ ~~Coast~~ becomes increasingly
imminent.

And whereas large numbers of
Japanese nationals and Canadians
of Japanese racial origin possessing
Japanese citizenship are resident
within a designated defense zone
and whereas in the opinion of
many the actions of the Federal
government appears insufficient in
dealing with the Japanese menace
on the Pacific Coast and may well
prove to be too late and too little.

Therefore be it resolved that
this meeting of delegates representing
associations interested in the
preservation and promotion of the
British way of life in ~~British Columbia~~ ~~the~~ ~~Province~~
records itself as in favour of each
organization represented and to others
willing to lend support that they join
together in a united action to impress
upon Ottawa the need for the removal
from British Columbia of its entire
Japanese population.

Further be it resolved that
a copy of this resolution be sent to
each organization for endorsement.
