And finally, Gentlemen, you and I after the war will have to fight as British Columbians on more things than trade. We will have to, fight a United front on taxation- on Bur ^{on} ~~on~~ the Japanese problem----- that in itself will be something to think about- after peace is declared no longer will you and I be willing to sit down and have these people in our midst. It will be our duty no matter what the rest of Canada may say to see that these people are sent back to the land of the RISING SUN- Native born and otherwise- we are no longer going to be willing to let a weak kneed administration tell us that it is not in the national interests to do so- I give you ~~my~~ assurance on that point but you are equally as interested. And with all that the Manufacturer is the first man interested- much more than the retailer- he has his problems it is true- but the manufactur~~er~~er- or as I call him- the first foundation of our economic structure carries the real burden. Is it not worthy of effort-- JOINT EFFORT--- to protect his work and his investment.
