# ALIEN REGISTRATION

The Special Committee appointed by the Finance Committee on May 21st, 1940, in the above matter, met on Thursday, May 23rd, 1940, at 1.50 p.m.

Alderman Cornett (Chairman), His Worship Mayor J. Lyle Telford, M.D., M.L.A., Alderman Jones and Alderman Wilson.

Also Present:

The Corporation Counsel, the Medical Health Officer, the Acting Chief Constable and Detective E. W. Morris.

Consideration was given to the letter from His Worship the Mayor, dated May 21st, 1940, with respect to the responsibility of providing information and guidance to individuals who have Germans and other alien employees in their service.

Your Special Committee begs to recommend as follows:

WHEREAS there is a widespread apprehension that persons of alien origin in the Country may be engaged in subversive activities aimed at giving assistance to the enemy;

AND WHEREAS many of these persons are not actually alien enemies by reason of their birth in Canada or of their naturalization here and hence are not readily kept under observation and control by the ordinary means;

AND WHEREAS the gathering at once of full information as to their antecedents, activities and contacts will enable them to be kept under proper surveillance;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Council make representation to the Prime Minister of Canada (c) Urging that the Dominion Government forthwith inaugurate nation-wide compulsory registration of all persons in Canada aged fifteen (15) years and upwards; (b) and Urging that the Dominion Government prange immediately for the nation-wide compulsory disclosure and registration by all persons in Canada of explosives, fire arms, and other offensive or destructive weapons or material.

> The Committee then adjourned to meet in the Mahogany Room at 11.00 a.m. on Monday, May 27th, 1940.

It was agreed that His Worship the Mayor and the Acting Chief Constable should take the following action, viz: (a) meet with representatives of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, informing them of the contemplated action by the Committee, and enquiring as to whether they have any information which might be announced for the information of the public at the present time; (b) take up with Col. #### Re Alien Registration

I beg to notify you of the following resolution passed by the Vancouver City Council on the 27th Instant:

"WHEREAS there is a widespread apprehension that persons of alien origin in the Country may be engaged in subversive activities aimed at giving assistance to the enemy;

and whereas many of these persons are not actually alien enemies by reason of their birth in Canada or of their naturalization here and hence are not readily kept under observation and control by the ordinary means;

AND WHEREAS the gathering at once of full information as to their entecedents, activities and contacts will enable them to be kept under proper surveillance;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Council make representation to the Prime Minister of Canada urging that the Dominion Government (1) Forthwith inaugurate nation-wide compulsory registration of all persons in Canada aged fifteen (15) years and upwards; and (2) Arrange immediately for the nation-wide compulsory disclosure and registration by all persons in Canada in possession of explosives, fire arms, and other offensive or destructive weapons or material."

Dear Sir:

Pursuant to your telephone enquiry of this afternoon am writing to tell you of the precautions we take and have done so ever since the outbreak of war on Sept. 3rd.

We ship and deliver explosives only to those whom we know or, if we have any doubts whatever, we make enquiries from the authorities in the district, or that failing, refer to the Commissioner of Provincial Police, Victoria, before making shipment. In addition we have contacted, personally, the officers of Mc-Lennan, McFeely & Prior Ltd., Marshall-Wells B.C. Ltd., the Westminster distributors and others who purchase from us for resale, warning them of the Dominion Inspector of Explosives ruling and the precautions to be taken.

In a few instances where we felt reasonably sure that the explosives were to be used for bona fide mining or agricultural work, we have taken the additional precaution of informing the Provincial Police, locally, to follow up and investigate, which they have done and reported back to us.

We feel that we have been vigilant and have safeguarded every means that might be used in getting explosives illegally, yet should there be anything occur to you that we could further do, we would appreciate you advising us.

Institutes through the Province who have storage of explosives have been warned by the Provincial Police and by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture on all precautions they must take; and all merchants throughout the Province, who have stocks of explosives, have been written by Col. Leach, Chief Inspector of Explosives, Ottawa, and they have reported back to him, and we also in making our calls and inspection of their magazines keep a close check on them. The Railroad companies have consolidated their stocks of explosives at certain magazines and keep them under guard.


