8 Corporation Counsel, submitted the following report:
 9 "On July 7th last Mr. H. M. Drost appeared before the Finance
 10 Committee on behalf of the Central City Mission Limited and made
 11 an application for a grant, and your special committee appointed in
 12 this matter begs to submit the following report:
 13 It is recognized that the Central City Mission Limited is
 14 carrying on a socially useful work in providing accommodation and
 15 recreational facilities for a large group of under-privileged men.
 16 However, there are other organizations which are carrying on work
 17 of a similar character and which receive no financial assistance
 18 from the City.
 19 Some years ago, when a request was made to the City by the
 20 Central City Mission Limited for a grant, rooming house operators
 21 registered very strong protests, pointing out that, as the Mission
 22 makes a charge for its services to those persons who are able to
 23 pay, it is in competition with the rooming houses; and a ratepayer
 24 took legal proceedings asking that the City be enjoined from giving
 25 financial assistance to the Mission, on the ground that there is no
 26 authority in the City Charter which would support the making of a
 27 grant. Your Special Committee would therefore
 28 RECOMMEND that the application for a grant made by the
 29 Central City Mission Limited be not entertained.
