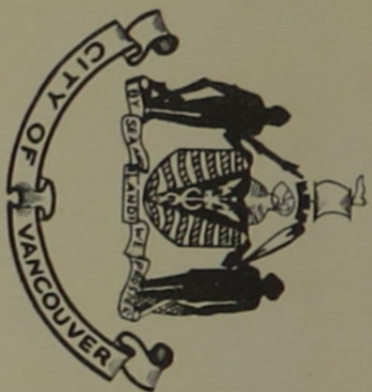

Building Inspector


Medical Health Officer


At a meeting of the Commission held today, attention was drawn to the condition of properties recently occupied by Japanese, and in some cases still occupied by Japanese.
