Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of yesterday's date and in reply, Order in Council "P.C. 1457" passed under authority of the "War Measures Act Chap. 206, R.S.C. 1927" prohibited persons of Japanese race from acquiring or holding land in Canada after date of the regulations. The Minister of Justice may if it appears to him to be in the interest of the public so to do grant to a person of the Japanese race licence to acquire or hold land. The regulations state that "a person of the Japanese race means "as well as any person whobly of the Japanese race, a person not wholly of the Japanese race and if the commissioner of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police by notice in writing required him to register pursuant to Order in Council", P.C. 9760 of December 16th, 1941. So far as I am aware these regulations are still in foree
