REPORT OF THE CITIZENS COMMITTEE
To the Kaslo City Council June.1st.1942

A meeting of the citizens committee was held on Wednesday May 20th. at which time Mr. G.W. Tinkess was elected as Chairman and F. Aydon as Secretary. Mrs. G.S. Baker stated that she wished to resign, as she felt it too much for her health to carry on as a member of this Committee.

Mr. Tinkess and myself met Dr. Hodgins in the Security Commission Office, and talked over such matters, as, Procuring Playgrounds, Garbage Dump Ground, Fire Protection, Wood Lot and several matters pertaining to the Welfare of the Japanese and the Citizens of Kaslo.

In regard to the Playgrounds, the Chairman and myself would like to ask the City Council to allow the Commission the use of the property adjacent to the Drill Hall, and any other City owned lots that may be of use for this purpose. We have asked the C.P.R. for permission to use the Vacant property, formerly occupied by the Shell Service Station ~~at~~ at the top of Front Street.

In regard to the Garbage Dump Ground, a piece of land has been located on the Shubby Bench Road, at the Top of the Hill, beyond the Lookout point, which is Crown Land, and for which permission has already been asked from the Lands Dept. In this particular Spot the Garbage will be put down a Chute, Out of sight of the Road, and out of sight of the Lake, it is a Mile at least in either direction from any Dwelling House.

In regard to Fire Protection, We hereby respectfully request the City Council to ask the Fire Warden to make an extensive survey of the Fire Protection facilities in all buildings occupied by the Japanese and bring same before this committee, so that we in turn may present same to the Security Commission so, that we may obtain adequate protection and facilities for same. This we believe to be of the utmost importance.

In regard to a Wood Lot for the use of the Japanese, The Forest Branch has been approached on this matter, and permission has been asked of them by the Security Commission for a Section of Lot 819 being the Old Howland and Waltz Flat.

We respectfully request the City Council to accept this report in its entirety, although we realize that there are still many matters to be gone into with the Commission, such as use of the Park, Bathing Beaches etc.

We further request the Council to authorize us, i.e. Mr. Tinkess and myself, to add to our numbers, as the occasion arises, as we believe that we have a great task before us to keep peace and harmony among the Citizens and the Evacuees.
