an American money order and rather than go to this ex-  
pense, we have taken the liberty of donating the re-  
maining fifty four cents to the Greek War Relief Fund.  
The receipt of which is enclosed.

I am afraid I cannot claim any relation  
living in England. I imagine that you would notice  
quite a few changes in Kaslo at the present. We have  
approximately one thousand Japanese here who have been  
evacuated from the Coast. Mr. Hartin, the former City  
Clerk, is now in Trail.

Trusting our action in making the donation  
will meet with your approval.
