Your letter of June 3 addressed to the Honourable Humphrey Mitchell has been referred to this Board. Enclosed is a copy of Bulletin No. 2 containing interpretative rulings on the Wartime Wages and Cost of Living Bonus Order from which at page 5 you will note that under Clause 2 of the Order municipalities are excluded from its provisions. Your city government is, therefore, free to arrange wages and bonus matters without regard to this Board, having in mind, of course, any provincial legislation that may affect the situation.

I have for acknowledgment your letter of the 24th instant, re the above, and beg to advise that P.C. 8253, being the Wartime Wages and Cost of Living Bonus Order of the Dominion Government, specifically exempts from its provisions the employees of any municipality.

The position therefore, is that a municipality is free to adjust the wages of its employees or to pay any cost of living bonus that it may desire. With respect to a municipality and its employees, there are no restrictions so far as the Provincial Department of Labour is concerned.

NATIONAL WAR LABOUR BOARD COST OF LIVING BONUS

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has found that the cost of living index number for April 1, 1942, of 115.9 [adjusted index 115] has not risen by one whole point or more over the index number for October 1, 1941, of 115.5 [adjusted index 114.6]. Accordingly, the National War Labour Board, pursuant to the provisions of Section 12 of Order in Council P. C. 8253, determines and announces, for the period May 15, 1942, to August 15, 1942, subject to the right of employers or employees to apply to a War Labour Board for authorization of payment of such an amount of cost of living bonus as a Board may determine to be "fair and reasonable," under the provisions of the Order, that:

- (a) There shall be no change in the amount or percentage of cost of living bonuses presently being paid;
- (b) An employer who has not been paying cost of living bonuses may not begin to pay such bonuses.

Dear Sirs:- National Defence Tax.

The Income War Tax Act, Subsection six of Section ninety-one, provides as follows:-

"91. 6. Every employer shall, on or before the
"fifteenth day of the month next following that
"in which the earnings were due, pay to the Receiver
"General of Canada the full amount of the taxes so
"deducted, the first remittance to be made on the
"sixteenth day of September, 1940."

You will observe that the Act is mandatory, and your attention is drawn to the fact that your last remittance covered deductions on account of National Defence Tax from payments made in the month of May and that apparently your account is now in arrears.

Two copies of Form N.D.T.2. are enclosed herewith. Please complete these up to the end of last month and forward the original to this office without delay, accompanied by a remittance for the amount of tax due. If you did not have any employees from whom National Defence Tax should have been deducted subsequent to the above date, please return the Forms and advise me accordingly.

This matter should receive your immediate attention otherwise it will be necessary to refer your name to the Legal Department as delinquent.
