MAGOZO MATSUMOTO, the claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BREWIN:

Q. Mr. Matsumoto, your claim is in respect to a long list of chattels?

QA. Yes.

Q. And in order to identify what we are speaking about I would ask my friend to produce the analysis of personal property claim. We found there are six and a fraction pages containing a long and detailed list of personal chattels in respect of which the claimant is making a claim.

MR. CHRISTIE: I tender as exhibit 1 Analysis of Personal Property Claim.

(ANALYSIS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY CLAIM, MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1)

MR. BREWIN: Q. This long list which appears on Exhibit 1, is taken, as I understand it from a list which you furnished the custodian at or about the time of your evacuation?

A. Yes.

Q. Apparently you were evacuated on June 3, 1942?

A. Yes.

Q. And you gave the custodian a very lengthy and detailed list of all of your personal chattels which you were leaving behind?

A. Yes.

Q. And did you at that time put opposite the items listed the valuation which you placed on the

1 items? A. Yes.

2 Q. And how did you arrive at those valuations?

3 A. I calculated those on the cost price.

4 In case of new goods I put down the cost price.

5 Where they were used goods I reduced the price by
6 20, 25 or 30 percent.

7 Q. Where did you leave these items, Mr.
8 Matsumoto?

9 A. At the Boothby Transfer, Mission.

10 Q. I think there is a little misunderstanding
11 there. It is the Boothby Truck Lines office at
12 Mission, is it not? Am I right about that?
right;

13 MR. CHRISTIE: That is the right name is
14 the Truck Lines Office.

15 THE WITNESS: Yes. It was daily transfer
16 line with truck transfer from Vancouver to Mission.
17 At their warehouse I left these goods.

18 MR. BREWIN: Q. I am showing to you a letter
19 dated July 29, 1942, from Mr. H.F. Green of the
20 Custodian's office. Did you receive that letter?

21 A. Yes. I received that letter.

22 MR. BREWIN: Your honour, this letter is
23 addressed to Mr. Matsumoto, and it is from the
24 Custodian's office, on their stationery, signed by
25 Mr. Green, and it starts with:

26 "Our agent has investigated your property
27 and reports finding goods and chattels as
28 shown on the duplicate list attached hereto.
29 With your registration you gave us an
30 itemized list or your personal effects but you

1 "will appreciate that we cannot check this
2 itemized list with the packages how stored
3 at Boothby's Truckline office. However,
4 you will probably be able to identify these
5 goods, as yours. Will you kindly return to
6 us a signed copy of the list enclosed? We
7 understand that nothing of value was left
8 in your place of business at Mission."

9 I had better put that in. I will wait until I get
10 him to identify this list.

11 Q. And did you at the same time receive a
12 list with the letter?

13 A. I received this before I received the
14 other letter.

15 Q. You received this before you received
16 the other letter. About the same time. This is dated
17 August 7.

18 I point that out to you. A. I made
19 a mistake.

20 Q. This was the list probably which you got
21 in the letter? A. This came separately.

22 Q. Separately? A. Yes.

23 Q. And, has it your signature on it?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. And it says at the bottom: "Please sign
26 and return one copy to the Custodian's office."

27 You did that? A. Yes.

28 MR. BREWIN: The letter, your honour, refers
29 to a signed copy of a list enclosed. The witness

1 says he returned the list at about the same time,
2 so perhaps they should both go in together.

3 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Make them all Exhibit 2.

4 MR. BREWIN: Yes. I point out the list may
5 not be very helpful because it is pretty vague.
6 It refers to 11 wooden boxes, "ctns (4)" meaning
7 containers "contents unknown, tea chest" and so on.

8 (LETTER AND LIST, MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2)

9
10 MR. CHRISTIE: I think perhaps that in filing
11 that as an exhibit we had better date the letter and
12 say who it is from as I will be filing some letters,
13 too.

14 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: All right.

15 MR. BREWIN: Yes. It should be. The letter
16 is dated July 29.

17 THE SECRETARY: Dated July 29, 1942.

18 MR. BREWIN: Q. You later, I think wrote to
19 the custodian and asked to have some of these chattels
20 returned to you?

21 A. Yes; but, I did not receive a reply to
22 that letter.

23 Q. Did you not subsequently receive at a
24 much, perhaps, later date, a letter from the Custodian
25 dated June 17, 1946? I am showing you a copy.

26 In this letter it is said that the Custodian
27 made arrangements for the sale of your effects by
28 public auction? A. Yes. I received that

29 letter.

30 Q. What was your occupation? A. I was the

1 branch manager of a grocery store.

2 MR. CHRISTIE: I am just wondering about these
3 letters, which would be the better procedure. I think
4 they all relate to a course of dealing with this
5 case. My only question is whether they should be
6 filed as one exhibit, as Exhibit 2, or whether
7 your honour thinks it would be better to file them
8 separately.

9 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: I think probably you
10 could file them together.

11 MR. CHRISTIE: Is that all right?

12 MR. BREWIN: Yes.

13 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: What is the date of the
14 other letter?

15 THE SECRETARY: June 17, 1946.

16 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: All part of Exhibit 2.

17 MR. BREWIN: Very well.

18 MR. CHRISTIE: I think perhaps my friend has
19 filed a letter of the Custodian in reply and it might
20 keep the record more complete if I file the letter
21 of the claimant in which this letter in reply was
22 sent.

23 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: All right.

24 MR. CHRISTIE: A letter dated May 3, 1946,
25 from Matsumoto, the claimant, to the office of the
26 Custodian.

27 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Very well.

28 MR. BREWIN: .Q. Have you completed a form
29 entitled Personal Chattels, setting out some details
30



1 in regard to some of the main items in your claim
2 and other information about your claim?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. And this is your signature (Indicating)?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And, the facts stated in this form are
7 correct? A. Yes.

8 MR. BREWIN: It will be Exhibit 3, your
9 honour.

10 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Very well.

11 (PARTICULARS OF PERSONAL CHATTELS, MARKED
12 EXHIBIT NO. 3)

13 MR. BREWIN: Q. I see on this form you have
14 made the statement "All chattels left at Boothby
15 Transport office, Mission, B.C., acknowledged by
16 Custodian, D--" I suppose that means "date", "August
17 12, 1942, as received by Custodian." To what did
18 you refer there? Have you a letter of August 12,
19 1942 which acknowledges receipt of those things?

20 A. The letter was received from the Custodian
21 acknowledging receipt of these articles.

22 Q. Have you got the letter?

23 A. I do not appear to have it here.

24 Q. I suggest that you try and find it and
25 let us have it, and perhaps if you can get the letter
26 we can put it in.

27 A. Yes.

28 Q. You were saying you were manager of a
29 grocery store?

30 A. Yes, sir.

1 Q. Where; at Mission?

2 A. Yes, sir.

3 Q. What is the name of the company?

4 A. M. Furuya.

5 Q. That was an incorporated company?

6 A. A company.

7 Q. With quite a number of branches, branch

8 stores in British Columbia? A. Yes.

9 Q. So that I take it your experience as
10 manager would enable you to tell the value of various
11 merchandise? A. Yes, I have experience in those
12 things.

13 Q. M. Furuya and Company Limited was dealing
14 with all sorts of articles?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. What was the condition in which these goods
17 were at the time they were packed?

18 A. The condition was good.

19 Q. Yes. Did you ever receive any report
20 from Boothby Company or from the Custodian that
21 any of these goods had disappeared or been stolen,
22 or anything of that sort?

23 A. I received no information of that sort.
24 I just got a letter to the effect that they had been
25 sold.

26 Q. This is a letter dated June 11, 1947. I do
27 not know that it is necessary to put it in. It sends
28 you a cheque for \$54.63, "which sum represents your
29 full remaining credit balance at this office derived
30

1 from the sale by auction of chattels left by you
2 at Boothby's Garage."

3 Did you ever receive any letter suggesting
4 that any of the items which you had put on the list
5 which you gave to the Custodian were not there.

6 A. I did not receive anything of the sort.
7 That was all I received.

8 MR. BREWIN: Thank you.

9
10 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

11 Q. I produce here a J.P. Form. Is that your
12 signature? A. Yes.

13 Q. And looking at the Statement of Personal
14 Property owned you say "Household furniture, fixtures,
15 kitchen utensils, carpenter tools, garden tools,
16 personal effects." That was just a general statement
17 of what you had at that time?

18 A. That was just roughly written at the
19 time.

20 MR. CHRISTIE: I am filing this as Exhibit 4.

21 (STATEMENT OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED,
22 MARKED EXHIBIT NO.4)

23 Q. I think you told my friend that you were
24 manager of a store?

25 A. Yes.

26 Q. What goods did you sell in that store?

27 A. Groceries and dry-goods, tobacco, soft
28 drinks. There were three departments in the store.

29 Q. Did you sell any china-ware?

30 A. Yes.



1 Q. Did you sell any hardware, like carpenter's
2 tools or utensils of any kind?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Did you sell clothing?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Both for children and adults?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. Did you sell electrical goods?

9 A. Yes. I sold electric light globes and
10 fuses.

11 Q. Did you sell furniture?

12 A. No, I did not.

13 Q. Well, now, when you said you sold hard-
14 ware would you sell axes and chissels, screw-drivers
15 and all those items?

16 A. Yes. I sold those; also logging
17 equipment.

18 Q. Now, Mr. Matsumoto, how were these goods
19 transported to the Boothby Trucklines office?

20 A. The Boothby Trucklines premises was right
21 next door to mine and the heavy articles were taken
22 by truck and the others were taken by hand, in which
23 I assisted.

24 Q. How many trips were made?

25 A. About 20 or 30 trips. About 15 or 16 times.
26 The space inbetween was about 20 or 30 feet.

27 Q., In respect of these 11 wooden boxes,
28 contents unknown, how large were these boxes?

29 A. There were a number of different sizes, but
30



1 the largest was 18 by 24 and there was another 30 by
2 28. Those were light articles like electric light
3 globes and things which were liable to break.

4 Q. In these 11 wooden boxes were there any
5 large articles?

6 A. I do not know the size of those 11 cases
7 exactly. I put the heavy things in small boxes and
8 the light things in large boxes.

9 Q. I think you told us that the largest box
10 was a certain size. That was the largest.

11 Is my memory correct in that?

12 A. I have given the size as probably this
13 square, this part of the table square (Indicating).

14 Q. Would you estimate that measurement?
15 For court purposes I do not think we can refer to the
16 table.

17 A. The size I would estimate about 28 ~~by~~ 30.

18 Q. 28 inches? A. Yes.

19 Q. By 30? A. Inches.

20 Q. Now, did you put on the outside of any
21 of these boxes a list of the contents which were in
22 each box?

23 A. Yes, I did.

24 Q. Was there a list on each box of the
25 contents of that particular box?

26 A. I put a list of the larger articles and
27 the more important articles, but not of the smaller
28 things.

Q. But, that was mailed on to each box?

A. They were written in chalk outside the cases.

Q. Well now, referring to Exhibit 2, a memorandum attached to a letter dated July 29, 1942, you signed this memorandum and you say "11 wooden boxes, contents unknown"?

A. Yes. I signed that.

Q. Did you mean when you said "unknown" that they were unknown to you or that they were unknown to the Boothby Truck Company?

MR. BREWIN: He did not necessarily mean either; the document was prepared by somebody in the Custodian's office.

THE WITNESS: I knew the contents of the boxes, but as they were there I could not say item by item what were in those boxes.

MR. CHRISTIE: Q. Did you receive any receipts from the Boothby Trucklines for these boxes?

A. No.

Q. I suppose you took them there in a hurry?

A. There was not much time and I delivered them in a hurry.

Q. This is your valuation. You did not receive any expert valuation apart from your own?

A. That was my own estimation.

Q. And these goods represent a collection of household goods and effects accumulated over a period of years?

A. They were purchased between 1938 and 1942.



1 Q. How long have you been married?

2 A. Since 1936. I think 1936.

3 Q. 1936. Not married very long.

4 MR. BREWIN: Might seem like a long time.

5 MR. CHRISTIE: Q. Would not some of these
6 goods be goods which you accumulated from the time
7 you were married in 1936?

8 A. I was in an apartment house. I got married
9 and after I took charge of the Mission branch I
10 purchased these goods. I lived in an apartment
11 house in 1936 and when I took charge of the Mission
12 branch of the Furuya Company branch I purchased the
13 goods.

14 Q. Were none of these goods purchased between
15 your marriage and the time that you took charge of
16 this store?

17 A. I was living at my brother's before
18 and for that reason I practically bought nothing.

19 Q. And, have you received any word from
20 the Custodian apart from the proceeds of the sale
21 as to what became of these goods?

22 A. I wrote to the Custodian and asked him
23 to send me some of these goods.

24 Q. I think we have that.

25 Do you know whatever became of these goods
26 apart from the ones which were sold?

27 A. I received no information and I do not
28 know what happened to them.

29 Q. That is all, thank you.

MR. BREWIN: That is all, thank you.

MR. CHRISTIE: You have no other evidence?

MR. BREWIN: No other evidence.

MR. CHRISTIE: It is submitted, your honour, that those goods which were sold were sold at a fair market value; and, it is further submitted, that the custodian can assume no responsibility for goods of which it had no record and that those goods other than the goods which were sold have been valued exorbitantly.

MR. BREWIN: One reference to what my friend has said, to ask him if it is disputed, what appears on the Personal Property Claim Analysis, that the Custodian was furnished with a long chattel list presumably prior to evacuation, undated. It says: "This itemized list has not been inscribed hereon due to its length and also due to the fact that all items claimed were previously noted on this inventory."

I take it from that there is in the Custodian's file a list furnished by the claimant, probably the same list as has been put in here, that it was prior to the evacuation. I would ask my friend about that because he says that one of his defences is that they have no responsibility for goods for which they had no record. I would like to know if it is contended that they did not have that list. The claimant said he sent the list. I would like to recall the witness on that point.

2 MR. M. MATSUMOTO, resumed.

3 RE-EXAMINATION BY MR. BREWIN:

4 Q. One of the points which has been raised by
5 the Custodian in this case has to do with the list
6 of the goods which you furnished. Attached to your
7 claim form - I had better have the actual claim form -
8 is a list of goods with the values set against them.
9 When did you first send this list or a list of which
10 this is a copy to the Custodian?

11 A. I am not certain of the date, but the last
12 of May 1942.

13 Q. You were evacuated on June 3, 1942?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Was it a few days before that?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And I take it that the correspondence from
18 the Custodian indicated that he had received the
19 long list which you sent him?

20 A. I was told by the Custodian, I received a
21 letter from the Custodian to the effect that he had
22 received that list.

23 Q. And, how did you send the list to him?

24 A. I delivered it personally.

25 Q. To the Custodian's office in Vancouver?

26 A. Yes.

27 Q. In Vancouver? A. Yes.

28 MR. BREWIN: That is all, thank you.

RE-CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

Q. Mr. Matsumoto, in the letter of July 29, 1942 written by the Custodian's department to you it says: "Our agent has investigated your property and reports finding goods and chattels as shown on the duplicate list attached hereto. With your registration you gave us an itemized list of your personal effects but you will appreciate that we cannot check this itemized list - these items listed in the packages now stored at Boothby's Trucklines office. However you will probably be able to identify these goods as yours, so you will kindly return to us a signed copy of your list."

In the list which was filed as Exhibit 12, is the contents of 11 wooden boxes, contents unknown. Did you receive any other acknowledgement apart from this from the Custodian as to any other list of goods which you gave to them? It is a difficult question but I hope to receive an answer.

A. I do not think I received any other letter but this.

MR. CHRISTIE: That is all.

Do you want any further examination?

FURTHER EXAMINATION BY MR. BREWIN:

Q. You did tell us before in your examination that you received a letter on the 12th August from the Custodian acknowledging the receipt of chattels



1 left at Boothby Transport office. You said you had
2 not that letter with you but you would try to get it.
3 I ask you to let us have that and if necessary re-
4 attend to be cross-examined on the letter, if my
5 friend wants to cross-examine you on it.

6 A. What is it you want?

7 Q. Get that letter and produce it for your
8 counsel. A. Yes.

9 MR. BREWIN: If he will get in touch with me
10 when he finds the letter, I will draw it to the
11 attention of the Commission.

12 This is the letter referred to in his form as
13 being an acknowledgment by the custodian dated August
14 12, 1942.

15 THE WITNESS: 1942?

16 Q. Yes; that is right.

17 A. Yes.

18 MR. BREWIN: Thank you.

19 MR. CHRISTIE: I wish to file as Exhibit 5
20 a letter from the Custodian's field agents. I suppose
21 this will be subject to proof in Vancouver.

22 MR. BREWIN:, Yes.

23 MR. CHRISTIE: It is a memorandum.

24 MR. BREWIN: May I see it before you file it?

25 MR. CHRISTIE: Yes, surely.

26 MR. BREWIN: I think this last paragraph should
27 be read into the record so that anybody who studies
28 this record later may understand it.

29

1 " Mr. Boothby says that he cannot give
2 any storage receipts as the chattels were
3 not checked in. Matsumoto just rushed them
4 inthere, and did not ask Mr. Boothby to sign
5 any, etc. No one is taking responsibility
6 for the goods at the moment and Mr. Boothby is
7 just leaving them piled in a corner and pays
8 no attention to them at all.

9 Went to Lawrence the second-hand
10 dealer, Mission, and requested a copy of what
11 he had bought from Matsumoto, the list is
12 attached.

13 Saw Mr. James Plumridge, Mission,
14 owner of the building in which the Japanese
15 operated their business and nothing of value
16 was left in the building."

17 We are not concerned with the last paragraph.

18 I think there is a good deal in that note
19 which explains what happened.






