**MEMORANDUM** 

Staff members dealing directly with Japanese

Subject: Instructions to Japanese - Defence of Canada Regulations

All Japanese nationals and all Japanese who have become naturalized Canadians since 1922 must report each month to their nearest Registrar of Alien Enemies.

It is becoming evident that in some cases this is not being done and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police have requested us to emphasize to the Japanese the necessity of reporting regularly, otherwise, prosecutions will have to follow.


It is therefore desired by the Commission that all members of the staff who deal personally with the Japanese should inform those classed as alien enemies that their parolecertificates must be endorsed by the local registrar to whom they have been reporting when they are about to be evacuated to some Commission project and that, moreover, on their arrival at such project, they must immediately report to the nearest Registrar of Alien Enemies at such point. They can easily discover who he is by asking any of our representatives or the local postmaster.

It is quite likely that the failure of many Japanese to continue reporting on their removal from their homes is because of ignorance so it is desired that the above remarks be made as public as possible. Low
