Dear Mr Wright,

Our office closed in an actual "cloud of dust". Monday March 31st at about 5 o'clock the plasterers moved in to divide the office and erect a new wall for incoming tenants. We had packed 5 large boxes of office records ledgers etc and on the morning of April 1st day- ten years from the day on which I came, the Crone Storage people picked these up. There are to put a wire band around each and ship to Mr Arpin. Cronos also picked up a 4 drawer filing cabinet containing the files and will crate and ship at the same time by freight. The charges will be "collect" as we are void of any funds after the transfers which were recently made to Ottawa when the auditors were here.

I am enclosing information concerning the contents of these boxes and memos regarding the files and other matters. I had no sooner sent the filing cabinet to Cronos than Mr Lefeu informed me that his client Tsuida was bringing a suit against a Mr Arithson. I know the circumstances of the deal between these two men in connection with the sale of a "float house" and I don't think we should be drawn into the dispute. However I thought I had better get the file so I went to Cronos and obtained it before they started getting the cabinet ready for shipment. The file is 3343 and appears on Memorandum of files sent to Ottawa (page 3)

Files have been sent in those cases where we still hold funds or there appears to be some unfinished business. While they fill three drawers I am hoping that in most cases at least it will not be necessary for you to study all the contents of any file. A brief reason of the reason funds are held is shown on the memoranda and generally speaking may be sufficient when future handling is necessary.

You will note my feeling in memo regarding the amounts being held in various "Suspense Accounts"

I believe the index in regard the microfilming will enable you to locate any file that may be required but I am hoping this will be a very rare need.

In so far as the Deep Bay affairs are concerned I only recently received P.S. Ross' final report. No money is available for shareholders. Final distribution has been made for accounts payable due to E. Kagetsu & Kagetsu and Co. The distribution to shareholders of Kagetsu & Co has also been made. A small enemy interest in this case has been taken care of a cheque being sent to Mr Arpin on March 26th for \$392-30 covering 70 shares of Tomokichi Maikawa. The final amount due to E. Kagetsu is in his account and shows on Memo re files page 1) File No. 12787 \$3471-74

I still have to wait for some information from Mr Field in regard to the share set up in Deep Bay. This is necessary for the proper distribution of the award under the Claims commission. They have recently written to Victoria and when I am advised what the share interests are I will then prepare what I think would be the necessary wording in a Form of Release to be executed by those to whom the award is distributed. It is practically all for E Kagetsu of course but there is some doubt in regard to the ownership of a few shares which Mr Field is trying to clarify.

While I do not know to what extent I can be helpful now that the films and files are at Ottawa you will hesitate of course to write for any help I may be able to give. Please continue to write to 3906 West 12th as I do not yet know when I will be moving into 4615 West 9th. I have to sell this place and there are a lot of repairs to be done at west 9th. The location is next we hope better for Mrs Shears as it is more level and less ground although it is still 66 feet. However it is not on a corner with all the boulevard we now have. As you will know it will be adjacent to the golf course but golf has not meant a thing to me during the past several years.

I was sorry Pat Good decided against going to Ottawa as I think he would have fitted in very well and been helpful. He will drop a line to Mr Arpin and give some suggestions in regard to payment of claims and accounts.

As most matters are interrelated between yourself and Mr Arpin the correspondence and memos I am enclosing are sent in duplicate. Will you please hand Mr Arpin the batch marked with his name.

Dear Mr. Wright:

Re: Index of Microfilming

The material which has been microfilmed is contained on 182 films. These films are being expressed to you with other records. Each roll of film is contained in a small cardboard box, each box being plainly numbered from 1 to 182. An indication of what the film contains is written on each box.

We are enclosing herein an index covering these 182 films and are giving you some information which may be helpful. You will notice that films Nos. 1 to 6 are described as "Name Cards in Alphabetical Order". We made a card for every Japanese of whose name we became aware. The cards are microfilmed in strictly alphabetical order both as to family and to given names. These alphabetical cards give the name, police registration number and family relationships, and where a file was opened, the file number is shown. These alphabetical cards were mainly microfilmed for the purpose of finding a person's file number when required. If for example, you require the file of Katsuji NAKASHIMA, reference to the index will show that his alphabetical card would be on film No. 4. This film when examined, would show that his file number was 10249. Then by referring to the index it would be seen that file No. 10249 was microfilmed on film No. 101 and all available information would be shown on that film. If no file number was shown on the alphabetical card, the card would likely show some member of the family - father, mother, husband or wife - who had a file and that file could then be examined for any information it might contain concerning the enquiry being made.

Microfilming of the files begins on film No. 6 and continues to film No. 136. You will notice that some files have an "X-I" prefix. The files with this designation concern persons who were originally internees; however, in process of time all internees were released and we designated those persons as "ex-internees" or "X-I's". The numbers of some files are therefore duplicated. For example, the file for one person is No. 200 and for another person who was once interned, X-I 200.

After our files had been microfilmed, in certain cases additional letters and material was received which required to be microfilmed. This extra material appears on films Nos. 167 and 168 and 182 and when referring to any file number, it would also be necessary to check to see if the same file number was also listed among the additions.

our Miss Norrington went to their office and had the use of a machine they had there.

In addition to the above, other material has been micro-filmed, such as material in connection with the sale of real property, V.L.A. Property sale Statements, paid cheques, General Evidence in connection with the Claims Commission and considerable other material which is listed in the index, showing the film on which this can be located.

The Index is first typed progressively according to film number, but we have also made an alphabetical Index which may be of service in locating miscellaneous material.

I would suggest that if any enquiry is received, that even before referring to the Alphabetical name Cards in order to discover the file number, you should first refer to an Alphabetical Card Index which has been packed with the records, being sent to Ottawa and which covers every Japanese who had an account in our ledgers. The ledger record might be sufficient to give the required answer, or if not, you would have the file number and by reference to the Index you would be able to locate the number of the required film. You will understand that the Alphabetical Name Cards which were microfilmed contain all Japanese names in alphabetical order, whereas the Card Index which is being sent to you only covers Japanese who had ledger accounts.

About 550,000 documents have been microfilmed. Considerably more than this was destroyed which was not microfilmed, but the nature of this material had no permanent or essential value, such as routine correspondence, or was of such a nature that if it was required it could be obtained again from its original source - for example, Land Registry documents which could again be procured from the Land Registry Office, Tax records which could be obtained from the municipal authorities.

Nothing was destroyed up until now, but during the last last week it has all been taken to the City incinerator. Either Mr. Good or myself went with the trucks in order to see that everything was actually destroyed, and about six tons of correspondence has been consumed.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. STEIN

Re: Japanese Evacuees in Vancouver.

Mr. Duggan very kindly arranged for me to examine the Microfilming work which is being carried on in the Citizenship Branch.

In the course of this morning's interview I stated that in my opinion it would be advisable to preserve Vancouver Office Japanese Evacuee records in similar fashion.

When Mr. Justice Bird completes his report to the Government and awards, if any, are dealt with, some 18,000 files may be closed and transferred to Ottawa.

This office is cramped for space and there are no storage facilities available in the Victoria Building.

I favour the idea which you advanced today, viz. permit the Vancouver staff to go through the files and eliminate unnecessary material before shipping the records to Ottawa.

I realize that the time is not ripe for shipment and that nothing should be done until the inquiry is closed and claims have been settled.

You will be in Vancouver towards the end of August, and it occurs to me that this would afford an opportunity for you to review the situation, and it for this reason that I bring the matter up now.

As you know Mr. Mathieu is absent on holidays, but it is my intention to discuss this with him prior to leaving for my vacation August 28th.



Re. Vancouver Office Suspense Account

Received your letter of the 5th inst., in connection with
Suspense Ordinary Account \$2,120-16 as at December 1951.

You state that this account was increased during 1951 by the
sale of 3 properties of real estate. I feel sure that there is some
mistake or misunderstanding here as I can only think of one property
which was sold during 1951. In the make up of this Suspense account
however there are amounts which do cover the sale of three properties but
two of them were prior to 1951.

Assuming that these are the three properties on which information
is required I think I can give you the reasons why the sale proceeds are in
this suspense account.

1. During 1947 a vacant Lot owned by S. Nishikawa was disposed of. I think
we were unable either to locate or identify this person. Taxes had not been
paid on the property for a number of years even before we took over. We
finally sold this vacant lot to the North Vancouver Municipality for I think
\$100 from which they deducted arrears of taxes and we received a net of \$10-30,
and this is one of the amounts in the suspense account.

2. This property was listed in the Catalogue No. 310 and from this I see that
the file number would be 3367. This was also a 1947 transaction I think.
In this case we received an offer to purchase this property and a deposit of
\$100 was enclosed. The offer was from a Mr. N. Tsumake which has some resemblance to
a Japanese name but may have been Hladu. In any case, strange as it may seem,
we were never able to locate the man who sent this deposit. Letters to the
address from which it was sent were, I am sure returned either not known or
left or some such notation, moreover we never had any further enquiries from
this person, whoever he was. This property was later sold to an entirely
different party for a \$1000 I think and the Japanese owner (File 3367- whatever
this name may be) was credited and paid. This still left us with the first
deposit of \$100 which remains in the suspense account.

3. The third property was dealt with in 1951 and would be the "South Port Mann
Association property". The file would be 14582. This was a case where we had
to bow to the decision of the Commissioner although his decision created a unique
situation. You will remember that we retained a small corner of a property
belonging to a Japanese, upon which there was a building belonging to this
Association. The rest of the property owned by the Japanese was sold to the
V.L.A. This fraction of land and the association building on it was not sold
at the time the Commissioner was considering claims, and in our judgment the
claim made by this association was entirely outside the terms of reference and
we should simply have withdrawn our vesting and returned the property to them.
The Commissioner however took the attitude that whether or not this property
was a part of a sale made to the V.L.A., and he considered that originally it
was included, an equitable disposition of the claim would be to provide a

In connection with this credit of \$513-79 in the suspense account there also appears an amount of \$13-38 related to adjustment of Fire Insurance premium on the property and also a small amount of 81 cents transferred from the South Port Mann account. These items therefore appear in suspense account in 1951. Is it possible that these three items are referred to as three pieces of real estate which increased the suspense account in 1951? They of course concern the sale of the one property.

You further state that awards were made to the owners of these properties at the time of enquiry. I am positive there were no awards made tax in connection with the first two properties I have dealt with in this letter. The only award was in regard the South Port Mann property which as stated above represented its full value according to the Commissioner and which we did afterwards sell for the sum mentioned.

Mr Arpin has an itemized copy of the Suspense account ordinary as at March 31st 1952 but as I have a copy I am enclosing it and have marked the three credits which have been dealt with in this letter.

Of course if I have been barking up the wrong tree and the Auditor General's Department are referring to some other three properties you would have to give me another lead before I could attempt to be helpful, but the above appear to me to be the only ~~pieces~~ pieces of real estate which are ~~reflected~~ reflected in any way in the suspense account.

I am sending this letter in duplicate and you may wish to send a copy to the Auditor General's Department and find out if what I have written does relate to and answer the questions they have raised.
