


SUMMARY

Jan. 26, 1952.

This is the Japanese who served on the Japanese Fishing Vessels Dis-Posal Committee and the Rural Properties Advisory Committee.

Our letter of 8th August, 1951 - attached - to which we have received no reply, sets out fully the source of the balance of \$24.91 standing to the credit of Kimura's account.

It is probable that the 1 share in T. Matsuyama Co. Ltd. was registered in Kimura's name for voting purposes, but that he held no beneficial interest. His J.P. Form clearly states that he was working, before evacuation, for Toyozo Matsuyama and was living rent free in a house owned by the Matsuyama Company.

The distribution from the liquidation of the J. Kasho Co. Ltd. requires confirmation from Kimura that the firm owed him \$100.00 but, judging from experience, this would appear to be a mere matter of form. If he claims it I do not see that we can do otherwise than pay it to him.

His present whereabouts is unknown, and our letter of 8th August, 1951 has not been returned to us.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 13409

June 24, 1947.

Re: Mr. Kishizo KIMURA, Reg. No. 00232

On October 29, 1942, this man signed a declaration to the Custodian. He was evacuated on October 30, 1942.

In his declaration the only chattel declared was a refrigerator left with Bowman Storage. On July 28, 1945, Mr. KIMURA informed this office that he had requested Bowman storage to ship this refrigerator to Mr. K. SAIMOTO, of Revelstoke, and he asked that this article be removed from our records of his property. It is understood that shipment was made by Bowman Storage, as authorized. It is revealed in the file that a Northwest Fire Insurance Policy for \$1500.00 on chattels stored at 2627 McGill St. was cancelled and coverage of \$750.00 transferred to Alpine Lodge, Christina Lake, B. C., so it would appear that this man removed to Christina Lake and otherwise disposed of the remainder of his chattels.

Mr. KIMURA reported that the Canadian Salt Herring Exporters Limited were indebted to him in the amount of \$1600.00. On March 3, 1943, he sent to this office a statement attached to his proof of debt. A copy of this statement is filed under date of March 10, 1943. This statement shows that the indebtedness was \$1,724.59. The sum of \$1,768.33 has been received in full settlement of this claim against the Canadian Salt Herring Exporters Limited. These funds have been credited to the account of Mr. KIMURA. The file days not used the reason for the additional amount.

He reported \$2500.00 in Victory Bonds at the Royal Bank, Main and Hastings; two \$10.00 War Savings Certificates in his own possession; 30 \$5.00 War Savings Certificates in the names of his five children. These were in his possession at the time of his declaration. He also reported an account of a few dollars in the Royal Bank, Main and Hastings Branch, and three policies with the Manufacturers' Life Insurance Company. None of these items were brought under the control of the Custodian.

The file shows that this man holds one share in the Matsuyama Company Limited. No funds have been paid in to his account from this source.

On December 18, 1942, the sum of \$200.00 was credited to the account of Mr. KIMURA in full settlement of indebtedness of Mr. Kumjiro NAKATSU, File No. 1156. These funds were remitted to Mr. KIMURA on February 24, 1943.

On March 5, 1943, Mr. KIMURA sent to this office a remittance of \$257.80 to be used in settling the liabilities of Katsuji MAKINO, File No. 5927. Settlement of these liabilities was made from the funds.

Prior to the repatriation of Mr. Ryotara KITA, Enemy File No. 1385, and Mrs. Maki KITA, Enemy File No. 1386, the life policies of this couple were assigned to Mr. KIMURA, who was to pay the premiums on the policies. This office, in letter of January 19, 1944, informed Mr. KIMURA that the Custodian would not recognize this assignment except to the extent of the premiums paid by him. At the request of the Custodian, the New York Life Insurance Company Policy #15327296, issued to Mrs. Maki KITA was sent to this office for safe keeping. On December 20, 1944, two Sun Life Assurance Policies, No. 661192 and No. 2214314, on the life of Ryotara KITA were sent to the Custodian for safe keeping. On December 25, 1945, we received a cheque for \$2,000.00 representing the maturity value of Sun Life Policy No. 661192. On February 20, 1945, we sent to Mr. KIMURA a cheque for \$93.27 to cover premium payment of \$89.22 made by him on November 3, 1943, on Sun Life Policy #661192 and interest at 3½% on this payment from

November 3, 1943, to February 20, 1945. It is understood that in accordance with the agreement reached between Mr. KIMURA and Mr. and Mrs. KITA, the premium payments on the other two policies are being paid by Mr. KIMURA who is to receive interest at 32%. On December 25, 1946, the account of Mr. KIMURA was debited with the sum of \$175.00 in payment of a Munro Calculator and an adding machine which he purchased from the Canadian Salt Herring Exporters Limited. The R.C.M.P. turned over to the Custodian on January 27, 1944, a radio and a camera and case which had been surrendered by this man. The radio was sold at auction for the not sure of 200 (2) net sum of \$86.68 which has been credited to the account of Mr. KIMURA. The camera and case were stored at 992 Powell St. but it was discovered in May, 1945, that these articles were missing from the camera and case were missing from the case were articles were missing from our warehouse and are believed to have been stolen during a break-in at these premises. The account of Ryotaro KITA in this office shows a credit balance of \$33,494.80, and we hold in our safety deposit box yen 130 in Japanese currency. We have in our possession, Sun Life Policy #2214314, mentioned in Kimura's letter, and Kita's file shows that he was the registered owner of:-



Dear Sir: With reference to your enquiry contained in your letter of the 12th ultimo regarding a miniature kodak, we have been making a search for your camera and regret to advise you that it is missing. We have taken all reasonable measures for protection of personal goods, involving considerable expense in the employment of caretakers, watchmen and night patrol, but in spite of this a certain amount of breaking-in and vandalism has occurred in our storage from time to time resulting in some items being stolen. It would appear that your camera might have been taken under such circumstances. Burglary and theft are, of course, circumstances which sometimes happen to the most careful property owners even when the owner is in residence and after taking every precaution against such possibilities. The police have been made aware of this situation and if the missing article should be recovered you will of course be advised. Dear Mr. Kimura: With reference to the claims filed by fishermen in regard to expenses incurred in bringing their vessels to the impounding areas, we have been endeavouring to place on the files of the individuals concerned a record of the claim. We have run into some difficulties in this connection and are hopeful that you may be able to help us. We believe you have a list of the claims. Therefore we are not enclosing a list. If you do not have a list we can let you have one, if it is required. We are not clear as to whether the individual claimants filed claims in connection with the vessels concerned, or whether the fishermen filed their claims and these were later tied in with the vessels. Or it may be that, it being known that these particular vessels were brought to the impounding areas by their crews, the list of claims were made up without the individual fishermen having filed claims. We note that in some cases men who owned more than one vessel have claims for each of their vessels, which would indicate that the expenses of the men who brought the vessels in were paid by the boat-owner; for example, Masajiro SHIN, ex penses from Nanaimo in the case of the vessels "HINO ISAKI" and "KIYO S". In a case such as that of Mrs. Riyo HAMA ISHI, and the vessel "S.U." (this also is in the Nanaimo list) we take it that this vessel was broughtin by a fisherman acting on Mrs. HAMANISHI's behalf, and that she paid his expenses. In some cases, the claimant is not the man who owned the vessel, but is a member of the owner's family. In such cases, we understand that the claimant incurred the expense and has not received recompense from the boat-owner. In all cases such as the foregoing, we have filed the claims under the names of the individuals listed, taking it for granted that you had reasonable proof that these particular persons had incurred expense in connection with the vessels named in their claims.

In certain other cases, however, some question has arisen. We deal with these individually, as follows:

In the Ucluelet List:

Hisajiro MOCHIZUKI claiming \$12.25 expenses in connection with vessel "WADEMAR. We have no record of a man of this name. This vessel was registered in the name of Ku itaro MOCHITSUKI, of Ucluelet, B. C.

Toichi NITSUI claiming \$12.25 expenses in connection, with vessel "MIOWERA" - this vessel was not moved from the Ucluelet district, being unseaworthy at the time of impounding.

Tsunetaro OYE - claim of 312.25 in connection with vessel "T.O." Victoria 1614" We believe this man died in hospital in Vancouver in December, 1941, and that we could not justify a claim for expenses incurred.

Ishimatsu YOSHIDA, claiming \$12.25 in connection with vessel "TSUKIMI" - This man is listed in our records. The boat-owner, we believe, was Iwakichi YOSHIDA. It is possible that an error was made in the given name of the claimant.

In the Prince Rupert to Steveston List:

Tasuke TSUJI, claiming \$50.25 in connection with "CARLISLE 136" - we have no record of a man of this name. The vessel was one of those released to the Canadian Fishing Co., licence being in that company's name. We have not been able to locate the fisherman who had been operating this vessel, and who is shown as "T.TSUJE" on the Canadian Fishing Company's list of fishermen operating company boats.

N. SAKAMOTO, claiming \$50.25 in connection with "N.S." Vancouver 4035. This vessel was released to B. C. Packers Limited, licensed owners. The name of Unosuke SAKAMOTO had been connected with this vessel in our boat records, although according to the B. C. Packers Limited list of vessels, this boat had been operated by "N. SAKAMOTO". We have a record of a Machiko SAKAMOTO, who was employed at Claxton Cannery, Skeena River, and who may be the man in question.

OKI

Claim of \$50.25 in connection with vessel "T.M." or "Alma" Prince Rupert 398, filed in name of Jitsuo UYEDA (T. Matsumoto). This vessel was licensed in the name of Tatsuo MATSUMOTO. The purchaser believed it was owned by Jitsuo UYEDA, but he denied ownership. We do not know who the claimant is in this case.

With vessel "TSUKINODE". This vessel was owned by Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd.; that company purchased her in November, 1941. We do not know if Katsuichi YAMAMOTO was using this vessel. He was the former owner. He did own another vessel but did not file a claim for expenses in connection with the other boat.

In the Quathiaski Cove List:

"MAYNE ISLAND" - We have no record of a man by this name. The vessel was owned by Ishimatsu ATAGI.

Susumu KOYAMA or F. KOYAMA, claim of \$10.35 in connection with vessel "KATHLEN". Fujikazu KOYAMA was the licensed
owner of the vessel. The proceeds of the sale were paid to
Susumu KOYAMA on instructions of Fujikazu KOYAMA. We do not
know who brought the vessel to New Westminster.

Mankichi TANINO, claim of \$10.35 in connection with vessel "M.T." Mansuke TANINO has claimed ownership of this vessel. We have no record of Mankichi TANINO.

In the Port Essington to Prince Rupert List:

Two claims of \$5.00 each have been listed under the name of Seiichi MAYEDA in connection with the "KIYOKO #2" We believe this claim has been listed twice in error, and unless we get evidence to the contrary we shall record only one claim.

We realize that over two years has elapsed since you made up this list of claims. It is possible that from your records or from memory you may be able to give us some information, however, or give us the names of persons who could supply information in connection with the individual claims that have been questioned.

We have hopes that recompense will be obtained for the men who assisted in bringing their vessels in to Steveston and Prince Rupert, and we are anxious to see that the person who is actually out-of-pocket gets the money; and not some other person who, while he may have had some connection with the vessel, did not bring the boat in and did not pay out any money in returning home or in paying the fareof the fisherman who brought the boat down in the owner's behalf.

Any assistance you can give us will be greatly appreciated. For your convenience, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope.





Prior to repatriation but in anticipation of same they endeavoured to assign the above numbered policies to their friend Kishizo KIMURA. The assignment was acknowledged by the New York Life with respect to their policy as noted on Form "D" and we advised them in our letter of January 20th, 1944 as follows: "We beg to advise you that the Custodian is agreeable to allow the assignment of this policy in favour of Kishizo KIMURA to stand, provided that no benefits of the policy are paid to the Assignee without the written permission of the Custodian." Assignment of the Sun Life policies were not recognized by the Company, but they have on file a letter from the assured, Ryotaro KITA dated July 21st, 1943, which in part reads as follows: "I wish to take this opportunity in making an arrangement whereby the above policies be vested in the hands of my friend, Mr. Kishizo Kimura of this community, who will pay for me the premiums as they become due --- payable to him upon maturity) and have this amendment in both cases approved of by you." As stated the Sun Life did not put through the assignment and on August 11th enclosed a copy of the above letter from Ryotaro KITA asking us for a ruling. They were given no definite ruling on the matter and on November 20th, 1944, they wrote to us in connection with the matured endowment #661192. On November 1st, 1944, we wrote to the Sun Life quite fully, which need not be repeated here, but tell them in that letter that the Custodian cannot recognize the assignment of the above noted policy to Kishizo KIMURA except to the extent of the premiums paid by him from his own funds and we directed the Sun Life to pay to the Custodian the proceeds of the matured endowment.

February 20, 1945 Memorandum to Mr. Wright Incidentally, before writing that letter to the Sum Life I had discussed the case with you and it had been agreed that I should write the Sun Life as I did and also to Mr. KIMURA, advising him that we could not recognize the assignment, except to the extent of premiums paid plus a fair rate of interest from the funds obtained on maturity of the policies. Insofar as the rate of interest is concerned, we sugested 4% as being a compromise of 6% that would have been charged by the Sun Life under Automatic Premium Loans and 22% that they now agree to pay on pre-paid premiums on deposit. We also in our letter of November 1st to Mr. KIMURA asked him to send the matured policy #66192 and the Sun Life policy still in force #2214314. I might mention also that we already had received the New York Life policy from Mr. KIMURA attached to his letter of February 7th, 1944. The arrangement as it now stands is that we hold the two unexpired policies #2214312 (Sun Life) on Ryotaro KITA's life and #15327296 (New York Life) on Mrs. Maki KITA's life and that Mr. KIMURA is agreeable and wishes to continue to pay the premiums on these policies and to be finally reimbursed to the extent of such payments plus interest of 32%. This arrangement is in line with the agreement between Mr. KIMURA and his friends Mr. and Mrs. KITA as set out in his letter of January 10th, 1944 on File 1385. You will find attached to File 1386 requisition payable to Kishizo KIMURA in the amount of \$93.27. This amount represents the premium paid by Mr. KIMURA on Sun Life Policy #61192 of \$89.22 on November 3rd, 1943 plus interest from November 3rd, 1943 to and including February 20th, 1945 of 32% amounting to \$4.05. This payment to Mr. KIMURA carries out our agreement with him insofar as this policy is concerned which you will note matured on October 1st, 1944, and for which we received a cheque from the Sun Life amounting to \$2,000.00 attached to their letter of January 22md, 1945. This money has been placed to the credit of Ryotaro KITA, File 1386.
