I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your despatch No. 722 J.604 of September 17th, concerning enquiries which may be made regarding the acquisition of Japanese nationality by Japanese children born during the war.

I note that the Japanese Government has informed you that for children born during the war applications for Japanese nationality may be made after the termination of hostilities in accordance with paragraph 2 of Article II of the Regulations of the Nationality Law, and that for children born before the war the general procedure governing such cases should be followed.

Applications for those born before the war may also be made under the general procedure for such cases.
