



Further to your letter of September 24th re application of Hideo NISHIMURA to purchase property at 1874 Dorchester St. West in Montreal. We have interviewed Mr. Nishimura once again, and we understand that immediately upon receipt of the license from Ottawa, Nishimura will take possession of the property and will under no circumstances evict any of the present tenants, nor will he reside at this premises.

It is Nishimura's intention to run the house as it is, that is to say as a rooming house. It is also his intention to take in people of Japanese origin as soon as any of the tenants vacate their rooms.

We have looked into Nishimura's reputation here in Montreal since mailing the application to Vancouver. At first we were rather dubious, due to the fact that Nishimura had been here for only a short time. However, we have secured several names as references from Nishimura himself, and it would seem that the people he is connected with are among the higher ranking Japanese of our community. We are of the opinion that there would be no repercussions, should a license be granted, and Nishimura, like his cousin Frank EBATA who is also running a rooming house here in Montreal, will operate as a quiet citizen without any disturbances to this office or to the community in which he resides. It is difficult to say whether the purchase of this property and operating of the same as a rooming house will have any harmful effects upon the Japanese placements in Montreal. However, judging from other purchases upon which we have given our approval, we might say that there is a little chance of this happening in this case.

We trust we have given you the information required, and that the license will be coming within the next few days.

We are receiving a good many letters and telegraus from Japanese, their lawyers and others concerning delay in issuing property licenses

In some cases the application takes three weeks or a month to reach this Office. In the case of one recent complaint the application was completed June 15, reached this Office July 15, and license was issued July 17.

In some cases this delay is, of course, the result of the applicant leaving off essential information which requires referring the application back to him for more information. This can be corrected by giving the applicant instructions on completing the form.

Applicants have complained that they are in danger of losing their cash deposits because of the delay in granting licenses.

It would be appreciated if these application forms could be, if possible, given attention and forwarded on by Air Mail within 48 hours when received. When they reach this Office, every effort is made to have them considered and licenses issued and mailed within two or three days. Thus it would be possible to have licenses reach applicants within 10 days or two weeks after the forms are completed.

Re: Property Licence: Toraryu Shimotakahara (No. 0022)

The above-noted naturalized Canadian Japanese was one of the leading Japanese businessmen in Vancouver up to the time of evacuation, when he voluntarily came east to Montreal and set up in residence and business.

He has resided at 93 Stratford Road in Montreal since 1942. He has spent considerable sums of money renovating this property on the understanding that he would be able to rent it until he could legally purchase it. Now he is informed that the property is to be put up for sale shortly, and unless he can buy it he will lose all the money expended. The vendor is the Clairvale Construction Company Limited of Montreal, and the price is \$19,000.

Shimotakahara is the leader of the Japanese Community in Montreal and has cooperated loyally with the Government in every way since moving east voluntarily. He has done a great deal to assist our Placement Office in Montreal to re-establish numerous other Japanese evacuee families and has served on the Nisei Sponsoring Committee in this work. He has also purchased thousands of dollars worth of Victory Bonds. At the time of the repatriation survey, he declared his intention to remain in Canada and be a loyal citizen.

There has been no local hostility to the residence of Japanese in Montreal, and it is understood that Shimotakahara's house is of a type which the ordinary Occidental family would be unwilling to rent or buy. The local officials who are in close touch with these matters are in favour of a licence being granted to Shimotakahara.

I would therefore recommend issuance of a licence in this case.

With reference to our recent discussion regarding the request of the above to purchase residential and business property in Montreal, I now attach application made on the old type of form for purchase of the residential property, signed by the above.

If you consider it undesirable to put forward the application as it now stands, perhaps you would forward one of the new forms to Mr. Beaudet for completion and return to you.

I have explained to Mr. Shimotakahara that it is impossible for him to obtain a permit to purchase business property without all details of the proposed transaction being made available to the Department.

In support of Mr. Shimotakahara's application, Mr. Beaudet makes the following comments which are entirely favourable and which can be endorsed by me:

"The above-mentioned person has requested this office to make an application at Ottawa for a permit so that he could buy a home and a business. He claims that the house he occupies at present has cost him plenty for renovation and there is a chance that the property will be for sale in the near future with the consequences that SHIMO will lose the money invested on it. Furthermore, the store where he runs

his business on St. Catherine St. is liable to change hands and if it does he will be out of business because there is no other store available in that district.

Considering that SHIMO was very cooperative with this office furthermore, that he is a very good asset to our community, we would recommend that an exception be made in his case and that he be allowed to buy his home and business property."



In the absence of Mr. Fammett, I bog to acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 19th re the above noted subject.

I am afraid that the policy presently being followed with respect to the issuing of permits for the purchase of property by Japanese is so restricted in character that there is no prospect of a permit being granted in this case although the application for permit will as a metter of course be filed with the Department of Justice. I would suggest that rather than keep the Japanese applicant in suspense, you had better tell her that you have received advice from Ottawa that the permit will not be issued at the present time.

We are hopeful that within a reasonable period of time a less restricted policy will be followed but we are not in a position to indicate just how soon this may be expected.

We would suggest that in cases where a Japanese person can afford to buy a property he should be permitted to do so provided the property in question does not affect the Housing Situation to the white or local people.

In this enclosed application the property in question is vacant and there is no other Japanese in the vicinity. We feel that the MACHIDA should be granted a permit and as they have only a thirty days option, we would ask you to advise us as soon as possible.

It will be noted that a purported conveyance of land has been made to a Japanese, contrary to the provisions of regulation 39E of the Defence of Canada Regulations, and, also, that the transaction involved payment of \$2,500 and the giving of a mortgage for \$5,000. It will also be noted that the conveyance involved would not be effective under paragraph (2) of the said regulation.

It would appear that all parties to the transaction may have contravened one or more of the provisions of the said regulation. However, there does not appear to be any information as to why the regulation was contravened, and it is thought possible that your Department may have further information in connection with the same.

Will you kindly return the enclosed correspondence, together with any information or recommendation which you may care to furnish and which might assist me in determining whether or not any prosecution should be instituted.

We received your memorandum of June 2nd and further memorandum from Mr. MacNamara, signed by Mr. Pammett, of June 5th, about the illegal purchase of property in Montreal by a Japanese national.

We note that you are delaying sending a supply of mimeographed forms on which Japanese would make application to the Department of Justice for leasing or purchasing property, as no action is to be taken on this for a couple of weeks.

We discussed this case with Deputy Commissioner Mead when he was here yesterday, and he suggested that on his return to Ottawa, he would like to discuss it with you further, and then decide what action should be taken by the R.C.M.P. to notify the vendor of the illegal sale of this property to the Japanese national without first obtaining proper authority from the Minister of Justice.

Re: Furchase of Montreal Property by

We have your letter of May 28th with reference to the purchase of property in Montreal by one Ebata.

Our reading of the Defence of Canada Regulations, Section 39E, is that the section declares that a contract for transfer of real property including sale thereof has no legal validity unless a licence from the Minister of Justice has been issued covering the transaction. This means that the Japanese who purchased the property in this case has no enforceable legal rights with respect to the property arising out of the alleged sale or contract.

The Regulation also declares it illegal for any party to dispose of property to a Japanese unless a licence has been obtained and imposes a penalty for infraction of this provision upon such vendor but there is no penalty imposed on the Japanese who attempts to purchase the property. Therefore, if any legal action were contemplated in this instance, it would have to be undertaken against the vendor of the property.

In discussing this case with Mr. Mactavish, who was in the office yesterday, he advised that Ebata had a very poor record and there was considerable evidence of pro-Japanese activity on his part. If this is so, there is little likelihood of this Department recommending a licence by the Minister of Justice for the purchase of property by Ebata in order to validate the action which has taken place.

It is not the responsibility of this Department to either recommend or suggest the initiation of criminal

proceedings for infraction of the Regulations in this case and since the facts in this case are in the hands of the police, it would seem that our responsibility is confined to determining what action, if any, should be taken to protect the interests of the Japanese who is involved in this case. Presumably, the vendor disposed of the property in good faith. If the Japanese were a Canadian Japanese or even a Japanese National with a good record, which would warrant a recommendation that he be allowed to stay in this country, we would be disposed to support an application for issue of a licence by the Minister of Justice but in the present circumstances, there does not seem to be justification for doing this.

Our present view would be that the R.C.M.P. should advise the vender of the property of the provisions of the Regulations and that they be required to make suitable arrangements between them which would put the matter on a proper legal status or our office in Montreal would be prepared to act with the police at that point to this end. However, in the meantime, we would like to have your report on Ebata and to obtain your further comments on this matter.

Results, the lawyer advised his client to forget about the eviction and wrote to Mr. Rigby telling him that he could remain in his house.

I am reporting this case so that you will be informed that the Ebata family has bought a property which is contrary to the law.
