As the Japanese government's power becomes stronger, our restriction will be more lenient. On the contrary if Japan is to weaken, we only face death. We must think of our future plan. I am tired of the policy of this country. Is it necessary for us always to work as 3rd class labourers?"

"If we decide to return, I think we will receive more help from Japan than those who continue to stay on in this country."

Letter from neice to uncle and aunt. Writer charges that her father was a victim of assault.

Translated Extract: "Sorry for the anxiety we have caused you. Father is getting better now. Recently a letter came from Mrs. Tanaka to Mr. Miyata asking about father. Mr. Miyata told me that he replied to her. We fear he (Mr. Miyata) may not have told the truth so please tell Mrs. Tanaka in detail. Those who perpetrated the foul play on father were Shinsui Kawazoi of Kochi Ken and Teijiro Baba of Shiga Ken (two provinces back in Japan.) When father was in an argument with Mr. Kawazoi, Mr. Tanaka came up behind him and struck him on the head and knocked him unconscious. Then they both struck him as he lay on the ground. They put a thick rope around his neck and were consulting about throwing him into the Lake when Mr. Sugano came along and persuaded them to desist. Later these two said over and over again before Mr. Sugano, mother and myself that the quickest way would be to throw him in the Lake. Although there are good witnesses it is case we cannot take to the courts as two or three members of the Japanese Community asked the B.C. police and R.C.M.P., without father's consent but in his name, not to take the case to court. It was Kazuo who asked Mr. Sugano to come to father's assistance. We could not do anything about it so we were simply onlookers until Mr. Sugano stopped the affair. Translated extract: "We have been anxious now for three years. Every morning from 10 to 10.30 we hear the short wave broadcast from Japan. Ever since D day in Europe last year the Germans have been on the run. Since the capture of Saipan the Americans have been on the offensive in the Pacific. Today the news from Manila and Iwo jima is very bad. This last week 4 or 5 of our great cities have been largely destroyed. With great loss of weapons our leaders are having a hard time. But we do not know their final strategy. They keep saying to us 'The end is not yet'. Will the final victory be with the East or West? We believe it will be with us if there is any God or Buddha in the universe. Now here in Canada they are discussing what to do with us Japanese. They are able to do with us as they wish. We used to be counted one of the three strongest nations but now --. But let us not be too much discouraged."

"There is no sign of the money which you mention having sent about the middle of January. Perhaps it has been seized. Everything is opened en route so we must be careful. Our four children were born in this country but owing to the severe racial prejudice in Canada and because being Japanese they would have been oppressed and not have been able to prosecute their studies. It was fortunate that we sent them to Japan. There are great hopes for their future there. Ambitious no doubt but then we have great ambitions. When I think of all this it is best for them to live and serve under the powerful Government of Japan. After the war Japan will be very active in the control of world affairs so for the young people there are great prospects which they have not in this country. Even in my middle age I have hopes of regaining what I have lost through this war. The war has entered its last phase. Putting my absolute trust in our Mother country's real strength and without being misled I am passing my days contentedly. Every one of us must keep in good health so that when the day of peace comes we shall be able to return to tread the ground of our native land. I think this is a very important thing."

"I wake up at two or three in the night and am so cold I cannot get to sleep again. Our home has so many cracks that this cannot be helped. They covered the house with building paper once but did it so roughly that what with the wind and rain we have here it is as bad as ever. They did it as cheaply as possible, putting on very thin paper. Our house is like a beggar's hut. I asked to have some slabs nailed over the cracks but nothing is done as yet. Our supervisor is most unkind. He has electricity in his own home and office only but not even on the street corners. Re: Nationalistic Sentiments and War News.

Raymond, Alberta,
February 19, 1945.

Dear Sir:

How are you getting on since I last heard from you?

The Japanese residents like a Prussian carp in the muddy ricefield are ignorant of their course. Their fine quality of the Japanese spirit characteristic of our race has totally disappeared. The incompetent and cunning gang are intent on establishing arbitrary power, and the bestial fellows are working havoc among our countrymen and contend that wrong is right and would make no concession.

Ah! If we are at the mercy of this bestiality and if there is no one that will effect the salvation of the world, how can the descendants of our nation at last be graced with a paradise? If both the awe-inspiring men and patriotic women of our country, who would first proclaim this to our residents, can stamp out the social evils and exhibit the naive beauty of life, well, they must be the most pious people in society.

As quoted from the New Canadian paper, "If you enter a village you must observe the custom of that village," these are nothing but peace-time words. And many are the idiots that mimic the words of Ambassador Nomura and fools that are ignorant of the wartime foreign policy. They who forget our Fatherland are fools and they who scorn our Diving Emperor are traitors. The Japanese people in Canada must think no more of the craft and bestiality. They must manifest their right mind wholeheartedly no matter how difficult it may be and effect a settlement.

Last year from July up to January 6th, the enemy raided our

mainland 21 times and dropped 600 lb. bombs. They lost 840 planes and 13,500 pilots and expended \$235,900,000. I wonder how much damage did they inflict upon us.

About 300 tanks and 10 enemy divisions were landed at the port of Lingayen in Luzon Island. Impossible to break through the mountainous terrain, the enemy advanced southward along the coast but they were counter-enveloped. Our shock troops landed at Lingayen and Sato's raiding units went into furious action.

About 4 enemy divisions landed at a point 30 kilometers from Manila and tried to cross Karin River but lost nearly half their number. They advanced northward, but found great difficulties in crossing the river as four bridges at the same place were demolished, and lost a great number of their men. Being under fire from the fortifications at the foot of the hill facing Nicholas (15 kilometers from Manila) they turned southward. Many of their troops that re-landed at this place were captured, and Yamashita's forces were in front and in the rear of them. Our one month's fighting from January 9th to February 9th resulted in taking 20,000 prisoners and inflicting a loss 30,000 upon the enemy. They are confirmed figures, but actually the estimates exceed these. There were 190 tanks, 68 mortars, and anti-aircraft guns, machine guns and army trucks lying in heaps. I have very pleasing news that on February 15th, a special raiding unit of 7 killed 78 enemy at Nicholas.

On February 11th, an enemy task force of 30 ships including 10 airplane carriers passed the offing of Formosa and attacked Iwo Island in the Mid-Pacific. They attempted to make a landing, but our garrison supported by carriers and submarines surprised the Americans and sank a total of 23 ships comprising carriers, cruisers, battleships, transports and fast boats. After fighting for nine hours they were in hot pursuit of the enemy. A thousand planes from the 10 enemy carriers raided Shizuoka, Kanto and Nagoya, but they were intercepted along the coast and could not penetrate inland. Up to the afternoon of February 17th, 275 raiding planes were shot down and 39 damaged. They became rubbish of the sea since they could not return to their carriers. The foe lost a total of 314 planes. It is estimated that we lost 17 planes and 2 planes self-exploded.

A Tokyo broadcast says the American Government made a radio announcement that bombs of the newest type marked "Made in Japan" have been dropped seven times on the American Mainland over an area of 200 miles causing deaths and extensive damages. The Japanese military authorities tacitly admitted it. Look it up in the Rocky Shimpo Newspaper. On January 23rd, in reply to question, Foreign Minister Shigemitsu stated it is true that Chiang Kai Shek is seeking peace. According to an announcement made by the Wang Government (Nanking) on February 16th, members from CHIANG KAI SHEK and one or two members from the Communist Party will join its cabinet, and a parley to discuss the setting up of a Communist government in the interior is in progress.

"The only unsatisfactory thing is the wages problem. We do not get the same pay as last year, as soon as we came back to work this year we discovered that our minimum wages had been cut down to 65 cents an hour. We all expressed deep resentment at it. This vital problem affects both Japanese and the white men. After two meetings they negotiated that they should get the same pay as last year. The Japanese and the white men have unanimously agreed that if they are turned down as a last and best resort they would go on strike.

We expect to have our reply in two or three days time, at the latest we shall know by the 10th, our pay day.

The food in this camp compared with that we had in Donak last year is worse."

"This democratic country's hypocritical administrators are like a grave stone painted white. The outside looks beautiful but the inside is like a dead man's bones and full of filth.

Oh! If only these administrators will change their mind and become really democratic. When we think of the people living east of the prairies they have plenty of trouble ever since the (other) Japanese have come in. All this is because there is no good leadership. How could I describe them to you, they are like lunatics.

Towards the end of last year the o o (Japanese trans) cabinet decided about the relief money for 60,000 comrades overseas. I heard that the Spanish Consul sent a letter to the Parent Teacher's association over here. They had a big meeting to vote for the money. Have they any right to vote when it was already agreed on by the cabinet.

End of last year a certain Japanese Military Lieutenant-General broadcast to the overseas comrades. They heard, but closed their ears to it. OO group of people came to my place as I am the chief of the information office. I get up at 8 and after breakfast I study for a couple of hours, then gradually the people start coming to my place. I give information on different subjects. I explained to them about the richest country in the world but now they have a shortage of Tungsten. The use of tungsten in present day fighting is a vital point, considering the trajectory of naval guns.

Six and a half tons of poison gas in 60 billion cubic metres of air is sufficient to kill sixty thousand people in one half hour. It's use is forbidden by international law.
