MR. McMASTER: My lord, in this case I would ask for
 leave to amend the claim by striking out item No. 1
 on the back of the claim form, the fishing boat.
 The boat was sold with the consent of the claimant.
 That will bring his gross claim to \$418.00. The
 credit to the Custodian should be \$230.00. That
 would make the net claim \$188.00. With regard to
 the credit to the Custodian, that is with reference
 to the credit on the car and the credit on the radio,
 10 apparently the Custodian's file admits the camera
 has disappeared --?

MR. HUNTER: That is correct, my lord.

MR. McMASTER: With regard to the credit on the radio,
 that has, I understand, been placed in the suspense
 account and not received, but that is a matter of
 accounting between the claimant and the Custodian.
 The reason for that is they are waiting for the
 receipt on the radio and it has now been found
 and I expect the man will now get his money.

YUKIO HASEBE, the claimant herein,
 being first duly sworn, testified
 through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. McMASTER:

Q Witness, did you instruct me to prepare this state-
 ment with regard to your car, radio and camera?

A Yes.

Q Would you be good enough to sign it, please?
 Are the statements contained therein true to the
 best of your knowledge and recollection?

MR. McMASTER: I file that as Exhibit No. 1, my lord.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. McMASTER: On behalf of my learned friend, I would file as Exhibit No. 2 the analysis of personal property claim. I would ask my friend to be good enough to produce to me, if he doesn't have it now, the appraisal on the camera.

THE COMMISSIONER: The appraisal on the camera?

MR. McMASTER: Yes, my lord. Have you the receipt for the car, Mr. Hunter?

MR. HUNTER: I don't think so.

MR. McMASTER: Q: Witness, is this document which I now produce to you the receipt which was received from the R.C.M.P. for your car when you delivered it?

A Yes.

Q And the ink printing on there, is that your printing or was it put on by the R.C.M.P. official?

A I wrote it.

MR. McMASTER: I file that as the next exhibit, my lord.

This is a receipt of the R.C.M.P. dated March 10th, 1942, for a 1931 Ford coach, speedometer reading 62040 miles, extra equipment, front seat covers. Five tires, condition appears fair.

(RECEIPT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

MR. McMASTER: My lord, referring to Exhibit 1, the car is described there and it explains the purchase price. He traded in an old car and paid \$325.00, and he added two new tires in 1941, and on the radio he traded in a good 15-tube radio to acquire the one he is claiming for in 1941 at a value

of \$90.00 to \$100.00. The camera was purchased in 1933 for \$15.50. He says it was in good condition. All these goods were handed to the R.C.M.P.

THE COMMISSIONER: What is the camera's description? Does he know the make of the camera? One Kodak does not mean much.

MR. McMASTER: I take it 116 is the type of camera. It was a folding camera and the serial number is 490171.

10 THE COMMISSIONER: "Kodak" is a trade name, is it not?

MR. McMASTER: I took it from the receipt of the R.C.M.P., my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes, all right.

MR. HUNTER: It is submitted, my lord, that the car and the radio were sold for their fair market value. It is submitted that the price asked for the Kodak is exorbitant. The Kodak which was lost, my lord, consisted of a 1(a) pocket Eastman Kodak, 116, folding camera, serial number 490171. It was appraised at
20 \$5.00.

THE COMMISSIONER: You concede it is missing?

MR. HUNTER: Yes, my lord, it is stolen.

MR. McMASTER: My friend will produce the appraisal.

MR. HUNTER: If I can find it. The radio, my lord, was an R.C.A. mantle radio, serial number 415-A-3, which was appraised at \$27.55 and was sold at
\$55.00.

THE COMMISSIONER: As a matter of curiosity, Mr. Hunter, when was the sale?

THE COMMISSIONER: The appraisal probably was much earlier.

MR. HUNTER: I think probably it was. They were appraised much earlier.

MR. McMASTER: Can you tell me who it was appraised by, Mr. Hunter?

MR. HUNTER: No, I can't. The car was appraised at \$200.00 and sold for \$200.00, sold the 2nd of
10 September, 1942, at \$175.00, I am sorry.

THE COMMISSIONER: No questions?

MR. HUNTER: No questions, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: Thank you, Mr. Hasebe.



