MR. COBUS: The claim of Mrs. Tanaka, No. 96 on the Secretary's list, and it becomes case No. 330.

(MRS) MICHIYO TANAKA, the Claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the official interpreter as follows:

MR. COBUS: I would ask leave, your honour, to amend the claim which is a claim for personal property only. I don't think it is necessary, your
10 honour, to indicate the changes in values of the individual items from numbers 1 to 10, it would seem just as well if I amended the total of them.

THE COMMISSIONER: Give me the total, yes.

MR. COBUS: The total is now \$466.00 and the credit to the Custodian, \$65.50, leaving a net claim of \$400.50.

THE COMMISSIONER: Amendment allowed.

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. COBUS:

20 Q: Witness, I produce to you a statement respecting the personal chattels for which you are claiming. Did you instruct Mr. Leckie to prepare this statement for you and is that your signature?

A: Yes.

Q: In one portion of your statement, after you have listed a number of individual items, you make reference to certain clothes in two dunnage bags, gramophone records and canned goods in box, and books in box as per itemized list attached, and
30 you show a value of \$188.00. I produce to you

a written list. Is this the list to which your statement makes reference? A: Yes.

Q: And are the statements contained in the statement and list attached true to the best of your knowledge and recollection?

A: Yes.

MR. COBUS: I ask leave to file the personal chattels statement with list attached as one exhibit.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1)

10 MR. COBUS: The goods, the witness says, were left in the Japanese hall at Fanny Bay, British Columbia. The witness says that the items claimed and listed above packed in bags and boxes and detailed on the lists attached hereto were never received by her. She says that she received a letter in August, 1946, from Mr. Matt Brown, a Custodian agent at Cumberland, that these items and other items were shipped to her care of the B.C. Security Commission, Vancouver, B.C. on May
20 26, 1942. She says that she received the other goods but not the items claimed at Greenwood when she was evacuated earlier in May 1942.

Would my learned friend produce the Analysis?

(Handed to Mr. Cobus)

MR. COBUS: I have had produced the Analysis of Personal Property Claim from the Custodian's file. I would ask to file it on behalf of the Crown.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2)

MR. COBUS: I would make this one comment, your honour,
30 with regard to the three items listed under the

heading "No record at any time." The first item, \$100.00, the Custodian has a comment about the books in box. Now, in the first column, Item 13 is this item. I mean, it is found there, there is no question about that. Item No. 5 under #Details of Claim," refers to clothes, and clothes I find listed in the first column under items 14 and 32. The third item, under "No record at any time," has reference to a certain

10 phonograph and records and canned goods in a box, and that is item No. 15 under the first column. I would suggest that the placing of those three items on the Custodian's list under "No record at any time" is likely an error.

Your witness.

MR. McINNES: It is submitted, your honour, that a great many of the goods claimed for were shipped to the claimant at her request. It is submitted that as to those which remained in the

20 custody of the Custodian, they were sold for their fair market value.

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. McINNES:

Q: Witness, where did you go when you were evacuated?

A: At HastingsPark I was evacuated.

Q: I beg your pardon?

THE COMMISSIONER: To what place, Kaslo, Greenwood, or where?

MR. McINNES: What is the name of the town?

30 THE COMMISSIONER: Hastings Park, she said she went to.

- Q: Hastings Park. Well, that is not an answer to the question. Did she go to Greenwood, Kaslo, or where did she go? A: From Hastings Park she came to Greenwood, she said.
- Q: Well, when you were at Greenwood, you sent for a great many of your things, didn't you?
(Interpreter to Witness)
- Q: Yes or no. A: I asked while I was at Hastings Park and also at Greenwood.
- 10 Q: For? A: For some of the things to be sent to me.
- Q: And they were sent to you, were they not?
A: The things that I asked to be sent from Hastings Park, they were sent there.
- Q: Did you get a Singer sewing machine?
A: Not at Hastings Park.
- Q: I don't care where you got it; did you get it?
A: Yes.
- Q: It was shipped to you, wasn't it?
20 A: Yes.
- Q: Did you receive a gramophone at Greenwood?
A: Yes.
- Q: Did you receive your books at Greenwood; you are claiming here for \$100.00 for books, weren't they shipped to you? A: There were several boxes, I don't know which one you mean.
- Q: You have a claim here in your Analysis, you claim for \$100.00 for books, that is your claim.
- THE INTERPRETER: "Books," did you say?
- 30 MR. McINNES: Books -- B-o-o-k-s.

A: No, I did not receive any books.

Q: Well, you just told us a few minutes ago you did.

THE INTERPRETER: Yes, but I interpreted it as "box" because I thought that is ~~what~~ it was.

MR. McINNES: Q: What were these books?

A: They were Japanese books.

Q: Well, what kind of Japanese books?

A: Some of history and some fiction.

10 Q: Where did you buy them? A: I have been collecting them for many years.

Q: Yes. Well, did you buy them in Japan or in Canada? A: I bought some in Japan and also some in Canada.

Q: How long have you been in Canada?

A: I haven't been here very long, but my husband has been here about twenty years.

Q: Well, it doesn't make any difference. Where did you buy this gramophone for which you are claiming? A: In Vancouver.

20 Q: Who did you buy it from? A: I don't quite remember, but from some white person.

Q: Where -- in Steveston or in Vancouver?

A: Yes, in Vancouver.

Q: You bought it in 1939? A: Yes.

Q: It was a straight gramophone, no radio?

A: It was only a gramophone.

Q: Did you buy it new? A: Yes.

Q: How did you pay for it? A: She was at

30 Fanny Bay and she was working there, my husband

and my father-in-law were working at Fanny Bay.

Q: Well, look, let's get back to this. We are investigating a claim of yours, and I have asked you a simple question. Where did you buy the gramophone? A: I bought it in Vancouver.

Q: Well, from whom?

THE INTERPRETER: She just mentioned it was a white person.

10 MR. McINNES: Q: Well, there are about 350,000 of them in Vancouver. Which one?

A: I don't know the name.

Q: But you do know that you paid \$100.00, but you have no idea to whom? A: Yes.

MR. COBUS: \$135.00, Mr. McInnes.

MR. McINNES: Yes.

Q: You paid \$135.00? A: Yes.

Q: Now, the great majority of the goods you left behind you were shipped to you at Greenwood, weren't they? A: Yes.

20

MR. McINNES: I think that is all, thank you.

MR. COBUS: Just a moment, witness.

RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. COBUS:

Q: I am showing you Exhibit 1 again, witness. This is your statement which shows the list of major items for which you are claiming. Just a moment ago you said you received a great majority of the goods you left behind you, that they were shipped to you at Greenwood. Were any of these

30

items shipped to you at Greenwood or any other place?

A: The things that I am claiming now have not been sent to me.

MR. MCINNES: Well, now, you mean have not been received.

THE INTERPRETER: A: Have not been received yet by me.

MR. COBUS: That is all, your honour.

THE COMMISSIONER: All right.

10 MR. COBUS: If your honour please, I have one final question.

Q: Witness, you lived at Fanny Bay, didn't you?

A: Yes.

Q: When you were evacuated, how much time were you given to be over to Hastings Park, or at any rate, out of Fanny Bay, B.C.?

A: She said, my husband evacuated about a month ago, and had only a few hours.

20 THE COMMISSIONER: Well, that is a very simple question. I can't understand what she is trying to tell you. It will be assumed she didn't have very much time, anyway. I wouldn't bother with her any more.

MR. COBUS: That is all, your honour.

(Witness aside)
