MR. COBUS: The claim, your honour, of H. Koyanagi,
which is No. 30 on the Secretary's list.

HIROYUKI KOYANAGI, the Claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the official interpreter as follows:

MR. COBUS: I would ask leave to amend the claim,
your honour, which is a claim for personal property only. Attached to the claim is a list,
10 the first item of which is a gas fishing boat,
the claim for which is being abandoned, subject to the Terms of Reference being broadened.

THE COMMISSIONER: On the list attached there is the fishing boat, yes.

MR. COBUS: That is abandoned, your honour; the last three items, beginning with 'one net drum and accessories', down to 'one water tank' are also abandoned as they were boat gear and were surrendered with the boat to the Navy. The remaining
20 items remain, totalling \$600.00.

THE COMMISSIONER: That credit you have there, I presume was for the boat and boat gear, was it?

MR. COBUS: Yes, your honour, and that is changed to \$275.00, and it leaves a net claim of \$325.00.

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. COBUS:

Q: Witness, I produce to you a statement concerning certain personal property in the nature of fishing equipment for which you have submitted a
30 claim. Did you instruct Mr. Leckie to prepare

this statement for you and is that your signature?
A: Yes.

Q: Is the information contained therein true to the best of your knowledge and recollection?

A: Yes.

MR. COBUS: I would ask leave to file the statement, your honour, as the first exhibit.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1)

MR. COBUS: Q: Now, witness, I produce to you a
10 list which appears to be a cannery form under date of March 31st, 1942, and it bears the name of Terra Nova Cannery or Camp, and the name Hiroyuki Koyamagi; there-after are a number of nets and lines, corks, rowboat, web and manila rope, and against each item a value is shown. Can you tell me where you got that list?

A: I received this from the watchman of the cannery.

Q: The watchman of the Terra Nova Cannery?

A: Yes.

20 MR. COBUS: On the list which the witness has just identified are five nets fully described -- I am sorry, four nets are fully described, one bunch of salmon web, one rowboat, 350 corks, 2 lead lines, 2 cork lines, and finally, four pieces of manila rope.

THE COMMISSIONER: Well, that coincides with the statement of personal property.

MR. COBUS: That coincides with the statement of personal property, your honour.

30 I would ask that this list be filed as an

exhibit, your honour.

MR. COBUS: Referring to the statement, exhibit 1,
your honour, the witness has listed with full
descriptions and details four nets and certain
salmon web, lead lines, corks, rowboat, and man-
ila rope, indicating for each item its estimated
value at the date of evacuation. I point out
that number 2 net, near the top of the state-
ment, was a net complete with lead and cork lines.
10 The witness says that all of the items claimed
were left in the net house of the Terra Nova
Cannery, B.C. Packers at Eburne, British Col-
umbia, and that all items were tagged with his
name. He says that he has allowed for deprecia-
tion on all articles claimed and that while the
Custodian states that he had no record of his
four lengths of manila rope, this item is inclu-
ded on the receipt given me on March 31st, 1942
by the Terra Nova Cannery. At any rate, that
20 pink slip which is now marked Exhibit 2 does
show four pieces of manila rope.

Perhaps my learned friend would produce the
Analysis of Personal Property Claim.

(Handed to Mr. Cobus)

MR. COBUS: Filed on behalf of the Crown, your honour.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3)

MR. COBUS: Your witness.

MR. MACDONALD: Your honour, I submit that the chat-
tels that were sold were sold for their fair
30 market value, and that the claim for the other

articles is exorbitant, and that as regards the rest, they never came into the control of the Custodian as set out in the Analysis sheet. Certain items were declared but not found, certain articles there is no record of, and one is shown "No account, theft."

MR. COBUS: Mr. Macdonald, I would suggest that that last statement is not quite accurate. I beg your pardon, perhaps there is something in that.
10 However, we have a receipt for that; we are not worried. We have abandoned the other item, though.

THE COMMISSIONER: The \$7.00 is down as "No account, theft," for the six inch corks.

MR. COBUS: Yes, "No account, theft." I am sorry to have interrupted.

THE COMMISSIONER: The others apparently were simply declared "Not found"; the others were missing.

MR. MACDONALD: The others "Declared and not found,"
20 are set out in the proper column.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes.

MR. MACDONALD: No questions, your honour, in this case.

MR. COBUS: I have nothing further, your honour.

THE COMMISSIONER: Well, there is just a point as to whether this list that he obtained from the cannery was followed in the J.P. form. Is there any detail on the J.P. form?

MR. COBUS: The Analysis sheet, your honour, the first
30 column, indicates three new nets, two old nets,

two lead lines, 2 cork lines, 350 corks, 1 rowboat.

The only item, as he stated in his statement concerning chattels, that was not declared in the J.P. form was these four pieces of manila rope, but that item is found on that pink slip.

THE COMMISSIONER: There is a different number of corks, too. Is that correct or is that a mistake?

MR. COBUS: In what way, your honour?

THE COMMISSIONER: Well, 2350 is given there, and
10 350 is given on the receipt. Which is correct?

MR. COBUS: Isn't that "2" your honour a typographical error?

THE COMMISSIONER: Well, the J.P. form would show it, wouldn't it?

MR. MACDONALD: The J.P. form shows 350.

THE COMMISSIONER: There is a four in front of it on the pink slip; I suppose that is Parcel No. 4.

MR. COBUS: I think that is Parcel No. 4, your honour.
That is all, your honour.

20 THE COMMISSIONER: That is all, thank you.

(Witness aside)
