THE SECRETARY: Case No. 531, Yeikichi Matsumura.

YEIKICHI MATSUMURA, the claimant herein,
being first duly sworn,
testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. HUCKVALE:

- Q Will you speak up, Mr. Matsumura, so that we
can all hear you?
- A All right.
- Q Now, Mr. Matsumura, you were a fisherman in
10 British Columbia? A: Yes.
- Q And your claim is for fish nets only?
- A Yes.
- Q And you have given in your original claim a com-
plete list of the nets for which you are claiming?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q And opposite the first four items you have given
your own valuation? A: Yes.
- Q And the amount for which the Custodian sold?
- A Yes.
- 20 Q Is that correct? A: Yes.
- Q Now will you look at this form, please (indicating)?
Does that form cover all the fish nets for which
you are claiming? A: Yes.
- Q And have you read it over?
- A Yes.
- Q Have you signed it? A: Yes.
- Q And is it true to the best of your knowledge,
recollection and belief?
- 30 A Yes.

Y. Matsumura,
In Chief.

Q Now all those nets, I think, with one exception,
were what is known as Barbour manufacture?

A Yes.

Q And the last one is a Kingfish manufacture, is
that right? A: Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I tender that form, sir.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: I think that is all, Mr. Matsumura.

10 Will you answer Mr. Rice, please?

MR. RICE: I will put in the analysis of personal
property.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

MR. RICE: May it please your Honour, we submit that
the nets which were sold by the Custodian were
sold for their fair value and the nets that were
not declared, then the Custodian is not responsible
for the same as they were turned over to some other
person than the Custodian, and any claim that
has been placed against the Custodian that
20 the Custodian might be responsible for is un-
reasonable so far as the price of these nets is
concerned.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q Where did you leave the nets?

A In Steveston.

Q Whereabouts there? A: The
Canadian Pacific Warehouse.

Q You turned them over to the Canadian Pacific
30 Warehouse? A: Yes.

Q You declared only 7 nets, I believe?

A Yes.

Q And you are now claiming for nine. This list shows nine nets here ? A: Yes.

Q And you originally declared in your declaration of loss or your registration, at least, you stated that you had 7 nets. I will show you that document (indicating). I will show you the J.P. form, and is that your signature on it?

10 A Yes.

Q Dated the 27th of April, 1942?

A Yes.

Q And in this form under the statement of personal property owned you say in (1) "7 fishing nets value \$1,000.00"?

A Yes.

Q How is it you have it as nine now?

A It is nine.

Q And you understand all that, do you? If there is anything you don't understand be sure and say so and we will help you out.

20 A Yes, all right.

MR. RICE: I would like that marked as an exhibit, sir.
(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

MR. RICE: Q: You say you left your nets with the Canadian Pacific Cannery? A: Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: It is stated right on your analysis.

MR. RICE: Well I want to get it from him.

THE SUB -COMMISSIONER: Did he explain why the original declaration was 7 and he is now claiming

nine to you?

MR. RICE: No.

MR. HUCKVALE: I will ask him about that.

RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. HUCKVALE:

Q You have seen that form that Mr. Rice showed you where you stated 7 nets?

A Yes.

Q Why are you now claiming nine?

10 A Well, I had nine and I am claiming for nine.

Q When you left why did you declare only 7?

A Well I made a mistake.

Q But you are positive you left 9 nets in this particular warehouse? A: Yes.

Q Did anybody instruct you to leave them in that warehouse? A: Yes.

Q Who? A: The caretaker.

Q The caretaker of the warehouse?

A Yes.

20 Q Now I want to show you a letter from the Custodian dated the 3rd of July, 1944. Would you read that, please? A: Yes.

Q That mentions 13 nets, doesn't it?

A Yes.

Q Now how many nets did you leave in the warehouse?

A 13, but I sold some before I came out.

Q How many did you sell?

A I sold four.

Q So that you have nine left in the warehouse?

30 A Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I will put that letter in, sir.

(LETTER MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 4).

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: Now I want to show you a copy of a letter written by the Custodian to the B.C. Security Commission on the 21st of July, 1943. Did you get a copy of that?

A Yes.

Q You recognize that? A: Yes.

Q And that shows, does it not, that some of these
10 nets were sold directly by the Custodian to this particular cannery, is that right?

A Right.

MR. HUCKVALE: I will put that in, too, sir.

(COPY OF LETTER MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 5).

RE-CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q Have I got this right, that you originally took 13 nets to the cannery?

A Yes.

20 Q And then you went and sold four of them yourself?

A Yes.

Q And you left the others there? A: Yes.

Q How long after you left your nets there was it before you sold four of them?

A About 2 years, one or two.

Q One or two years? A: Yes.

Q And then you sold four of them yourself?

A I sold four before I came out.

30 Q I mean, you say you put 13 nets or left 13 nets with the cannery?

A Yes.

Q How long was it before you sold four of them, or how long after, at least, was it that you sold four of them?

A Oh, about a week.

Q A week later you sold four of them?

A Yes.

Q And you could have, if you had a chance, you would have sold the whole 13 of them, would you?

10 A Yes.

Q While they were in the cannery? A@ Yes.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is that all?

MR. HUCKVALE: That is all, thank you, sir.



Dear Sir:-

We have received via the B. C. Security Commission your letter of June 21st making further enquiries about your nets. We regret that we have no more information to give you other than that already enclosed with our letter of June 9th. Your original declaration on April 27th, 1942, only gave seven fishing nets and of these we were only able to find and sell four. In 1943 you listed in greater detail thirteen fishing nets which you claimed to have left behind, but some of which we feel sure you must yourself have disposed of between the date of registration on April 27th and your evacuation in May. The B. C. Packers refused to take any responsibility for nets left in their net houses and while, therefore, we removed and sold all we could find, there is nothing that can be done about those that were missing.
