THE SECRETARY: Case No. 592, Ukiyoshi Yasui.

UKIYOSHI YASUI, the claimant herein,  
being first duly sworn, testified  
through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. HUCKVALE:

Q Mr. Yasui, you have a claim for certain fishing  
nets and other equipment; is that correct?

A Yes.

Q And also a claim for other household chattels?

10 A Yes.

Q Now respecting your fishing equipment I want you  
to take a look at this form (indicating), if you  
will, please. A: Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I point out in this case there is not  
net statement on the Custodian's file nor any  
personal property analysis again.

MR. RICE: Well, it is the same thing again, your  
Honour, my learned friend could have asked for  
those instead of burying the information in the  
20 file.

MR. HUCKVALE: It is stated on the form which my friend  
has had for at least five weeks.

Q Have you read this form over, or had it read to  
you? A: Yes.

Q And are the contents contained in it true and  
correct? A: Yes.

Q And is this your signature on it?

A Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I tender that, sir.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

U. Yasui,  
In Chief.

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: Now in that form which you have just read, Mr. Yasui, you state that you have a total of 23 nets of various sizes, a complete list of which was given to the Custodian?

A Yes.

Q Now I show you this scribbler. Is this a copy of the record that you gave to the Custodian before you were evacuated?

A Yes.

10 Q That is an exact copy of what you gave the Custodian?

A: Yes.

Q And this showed the fishing nets and the cork and lead lines and the bluestone?

A Yes.

Q Is that correct?

A: Yes.

Q And those 23 nets and these cork and lead lines that you are claiming are all set forth in here?

A Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I will file this, sir.

20 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: What are those on? Is it pages 1 and 2 or separate pages?

MR. HUCKVALE: Page 1 and page 3 will cover it, sir. There are some other items written in Japanese that cover the chattels as well.

THE WITNESS: They are written on two pages, the first two pages.

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: That page (indicating) and that page?

A: Yes.

Q That will be pages 1 and 3, really.

30 A Yes.

U. Yasui,  
In Chief.

Q And also includes a statement of your fishing twine that you stored at the Imperial Cannery?

A Yes.

(SCRIBBLER MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

MR. HUCKVALE: Now in addition to advising the Custodian, did you also get for the twine that receipt (indicating) from the Imperial Cannery?

A Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I tender that receipt as well as an  
10 exhibit, sir.

(RECEIPT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: When was the memoranda contained in this scribbler made? Immediately before he evacuated?

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: When did you make those references in that scribbler?

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Q: When did he make those (indicating)?

A: Some time

before evacuation.

20 MR. HUCKVALE: Q: Some time before evacuation. Well a matter of days, weeks or months before evacuation?

A I was evacuated in April and I may have written that in February or March; I don't know for sure.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: I see.

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: Having written that did you immediately give that information to the Custodian?

A About a week after I entered these details.

Q Now did you ever touch or see your nets and fishing gear again? Did you ever use them in any way

30 again?

A: No, I did not.

U. Yasui,  
In Chief.

Q Now in addition to your claim for fishing equipment you also claim for some personal chattels, is that right?

A I am also claiming for a rowboat.

Q Where did you leave the rowboat?

A At the Canadian Pacific Cannery.

Q Did you advise the Custodian of that fact?

A Yes.

10 Q What did you do, go and see him and tell him what you were leaving behind?

A A representative of the Custodian came up to Steveston and we reported the matter then to him.

Q And you told him about your nets and your lines and your rowboat then?

A Yes, he asked for particulars and I gave them to him then.

Q And at the same time did you tell him about your personal chattels, too?

A Yes.

20 Q Now to your original claim you attached a supplement which listed your personal chattels, is that correct?

A: Yes.

Q Now will you take a look at this form (indicating)?

A Yes.

Q And have you read that over or had it read over to you?

A: Yes, I have.

Q Have you signed it? A: Yes.

30 Q And are the particulars you have given in that form true and correct to the best of your knowledge, information and belief?

U. Yasui,  
In Chief.

A Yes.

MR. HUCKVALE: I tender that, sir.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 4).

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: Now you had three stoves, Mr. Yasui?

A Yes.

Q Where did you leave them?

A At the Canadian Pacific Cannery.

Q Were they in the net house or in some other building,  
or where?

10

A: It was left in  
either House No. 1 or House No. 2, I am not sure,  
but it is mentioned on the list.

Q Now your wife, I believe, also had some furniture;  
is that correct?

A I am claiming on her behalf.

Q She is not filing a separate claim is what I am  
trying to get at; is that right?

A No.

Q Were those stoves in good condition?

A Yes, they were quite useable.

20 MR. RICE: Stoves?

A Yes.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Are you referring to the analysis  
of personal property?

MR. HUCKVALE: Yes, where they say they have no record  
of them at any time.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Are you going to file it?

MR. HUCKVALE: If my learned friend is going to file  
it, he can file it now.

MR. RICE: If my friend wants it.

30 MR. HUCKVALE: He is filing it. It isn't mine to file.



THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Well I can't see it down there on the desk; that is one thing sure.

MR. RICE: I will file it, your Honour.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 5).

MR. HUCKVALE: If you will look at it, sir, under the column "no record at any time", it shows one stove and then it shows on the declaration that there were two stoves and his wife had one, so that accounts for all three. In addition to that she claims the kitchen utensils which makes it more binding than ever.

10

Q Now you claim for four complete beds, is that correct?

A: Yes.

Q Well by complete beds, do you mean complete with springs and mattresses; is that what you mean?

A There were two beds with springs and mattresses and the other two just mattresses, they were boards.

Q Now were any of these beds broken in any way?

A No.

20 Q Well what condition were they in?

A They were being used at the time we left.

Q What condition were they in, good shape, bad shape, indifferent shape, how?

A Some were new and others were old, they were in fair condition because they were being used.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: I suppose these were iron beds, too, were they?

MR. HUCKVALE: Q: Were they steel or iron, or what were the beds made of?

30 A Two wooden and two iron bedsteads.

Q I think that is all. Will you answer my friend, please.

MR. RICE: I am submitting, your Honour, that the chattels that came into the Custodian's hands were sold for their fair market value, and the other chattels, such as the rowboat and two additional stoves, were not declared.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

10 Q You stored your goods, I believe, with two other Japanese, Tangami and Akazuki?

A No.

Q Where did you store your chattels when you left Steveston?

A: It was in No. 2 House and in No. 1 House.

Q Was not Tangami's property and Akazuki's property, that is the chattel property, stored along with yours in the same house?

A Yes, I lived in the same camp; also he stored them  
20 in the same house.

Q But the chattels were also put in the same house in the same room?

A I don't know about the others but I left mine in No. 2 House.

Q Did you put your name on all your nets?

A Yes.

Q Your name was on all your nets, on every net? Your name was on it; who it belonged to?

A Yes, I put my name on pieces of cardboard and  
30 attached them to the nets.

Cross-Exam.

Q Securely fastened?

A Yes, I tied them with twine.

Q All right.

MR. HUCKVALE: That is all, thanks.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: You see this scribbler gives some more information here on the following pages, if that will be of any value to either one of you for examination.




