THE SECRETARY: Case No. 645, Zentaro Arizono.

ZENTARO ARIZONO, the claimant herein,
being first duly sworn, testified
through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. VIRTUE:

Q Are you the father of the last claimant?

A Yes.

Q Now I show you a form of summary of evidence
in support of your claim (indicating). Look at it.
10 This is page 1, this is page 2, claiming for two
nets, this is page 3, claiming for your vessel,
"Hinata No. 1"; this is page 4 with your personal
property and your household furniture, and this is
page 5 (indicating). Did you sign that?

A Yes.

Q Now was this claim prepared for you in my office
with the help of an Interpreter?

A Yes.

Q Are the statements that are made in this claim true?

20 A Yes.

Q And are the prices you have put on your property
fair prices?

A Yes.

MR. VIRTUE: I will put that in as an exhibit.

(SUMMARY MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. VIRTUE: Q: Now you were a fisherman, were you?

A Yes.

Q And before you were evacuated, did you make your
home in Vancouver?

30 A Yes.

Z. Arizono,
In Chief.

- Q And did you do your fishing out of the Port of Vancouver? A: Yes.
- Q And the name of your boat was "Hinata No. 1"?
- A Yes.
- Q And your son's boat was "Hinata No. 2"?
- A Yes.
- Q And each of you had your own boat and fishing equipment? A: Yes.
- Q When you left your nets, when you were evacuated and left your nets did you mark your nets with your name? A: Yes.
- Q And left them hung up?
- A Yes.
- Q All right. I want to ask you one more question. When you left your boat, where did you leave it?
- A On the Naas River at the Mall Bay Cannery, and the Navy took it away.
- Q The Navy took the boat away?
- A Yes, it was towed away by the Navy.
- 20 Q So that you left your boat in charge of the Navy?
- A Yes.
- Q What condition was it in when the Navy took it?
- A I was in Vancouver at that time but from what I heard it was towed away by the Navy, taken off the ways, and towed away.
- Q When the boat was last in your possession was it in good sailing condition, seaworthy condition?
- A The last time I used it, it was in good condition.
- Q And was that just a little while before the Navy took it?
- 30

A I was catching coho salmon with it, but I don't know when the Navy took it away.

Q Well all we will say is this, up to the last time that you used it, the boat was in good seaworthy condition?

A Yes.

Q And the Navy took it a few days after that? Well, put it this way: Was the boat in good, seaworthy condition when you were evacuated, as far as you know?

10

A As far as I know, but I was in Vancouver.

Q You were in Vancouver and where was the boat?

A In Prince Rupert.

Q In Prince Rupert; is that where you fished from, Prince Rupert? Just a moment, let us clear this up. I think I can clear this up very quickly.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: I hope so.

MR. VIRTUE: I hope so, too.

Q Where did you leave the boat when you last saw it?

20 A At the cannery.

Q At the cannery? A: At the cannery.

Q At where, Vancouver, or Prince Rupert?

A Naas River.

Q Where is that?

A Mall Bay Cannery, B.C. Packers Mall Bay Cannery.

Q Is that near Prince Rupert or is it near Vancouver?

A About eighty miles from Prince Rupert.

Q About eighty miles from Prince Rupert?

A Yes.

30 Q And was the boat in good condition then?

Cross-Exam.

A Yes.

Q And the Navy took it from there?

A Yes.

Q All right.

10 MR. RICE: I am submitting, your Honour, that the fishing vessel or boat was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee and the claim is not within the terms of reference. I am submitting that the nets appear to be the property of the son and they were kept by the Mall Bay Cannery of the B.C. Packers Company for a debt which was owing of \$250.00, and that the son was interviewed with regard to these chattels and he refused to give any information to the Custodian. I submit that the nets that were declared and not found, the Custodian is not responsible for the same.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

20 Q You told the Custodian that you left your boat at the B.C. Packers' Cannery, Naas River, did you not? A: Yes.

Q As a matter of fact, you left your boat with the Suyehiro Boat Works, didn't you -- S-u-y-e-h-i-r-o (spelling) Boat Works?

A Suyehiro asked me for the loan of the boat.

MR. RICE: I wish to submit as an exhibit, your Honour, an analysis of personal property claim.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

30 MR. RICE: Q: I show you a J.P. form (indicating). Is

that your signature?

A Yes.

Q That is your form, and that was completed on the 9th of April, 1942?

A Yes.

MR. RICE: I would like to submit that, your Honour, as an exhibit.

(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

MR. VIRTUE: Have you a copy of that, Mr. Rice?

10 MR. RICE: Just a minute.

MR. VIRTUE: If it has been marked, may I see it?

(Exhibit No. 3 to Mr. Virtue).

MR. RICE: Q: You are claiming for the value of two nets, a spring net valued at \$200.00, which you say you paid \$350.00 for, and a cohoe net which you say is valued at \$150.00, and which you claim you paid \$350.00 for. Did you own those nets?

THE INTERPRETER: I am afraid I can't remember all those figures; if I could have that form.

20 MR. RICE: Perhaps you had better refer to Exhibit 1, the second page.

A Yes.

Q You owned them? A: Yes.

Q I notice in your J.P. form that you valued the cohoe net at \$100.00 and the spring net at \$50.00. Why is it that you have raised your price on both of these nets now?

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is there any answer?

THE INTERPRETER: There is no answer, your Honour.

30 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: He is not answering that, Mr.

MR. RICE: All right. I would point out, your Honour, that no furniture was declared by this claimant. There was furniture declared by his wife which was disposed of by her.

Q I think you made it clear in your evidence that you did not see the Navy or anyone take away your boat?
A: No.

Q All right.

10

RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. VIRTUE:

Q Did you and your wife live in the same house?

A Yes.

Q Did you use the same furniture?

A Yes.

Q And when you were evacuated you didn't show any furniture on your J.P. form but your wife showed the furniture on her form?

A Yes, I believe so.

20 MR. VIRTUE: Now, I would like my learned friend to show me the report dated April 6th, 1942, which was in the Custodian's file, a report regarding the boat.

MR. RICE: Yes, here it is.

MR. VIRTUE: This is a report dated April 6th, 1942, which I would like to put in, and it reads:

"Re 'Hinata 1' P.R. 1210, owner Zentaro Arizono. "

It is dated April 6th, 1942.

30

"The owner claims that the vessel was left

"at Suyehiro Boat Works in Prince Rupert and reported same to the Navy. Mr. Suyehiro now in Hastings Park clearing pool stated that the vessel was still there when he left Prince Rupert on or about March 20th. As much as there is no watchman now, please advise the Navy to look after the boat."

MR. RICE: That is a memorandum that is unsigned.

10 It is just a blank statement that my learned friend is going to put in and I am certainly objecting to this statement going in against the Custodian.

MR. VIRTUE: It comes from my learned friend's own file.

MR. RICE: Yes, but because it comes from my file or a memorandum that is on one of my files, it does not say that that is evidence against my client, the Custodian, at all.

(MEMORANDUM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 4).

20 MR. VIRTUE: That is all, thank you, Mr. Arizono, as far as I am concerned.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is he abandoning his claim here for furniture, do I understand you?

MR. VIRTUE: I didn't get that, sir.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is he abandoning his claim for furniture?

30 MR. VIRTUE: Yes, I think he is, or I can say that that is the case. It was evidently declared by his wife. Well, I can't say that we are abandoning it, sir. I was under the impression that his wife had put in a claim but I am informed now that no

claim has been put in for the furniture by the wife and that is the reason that he is claiming for the furniture now. That is, it was a joint family affair. She declared it and he did not, and that is why he didn't declare it because she had. She put it in her J.P. form. I think my learned friend has her J.P. form and I think we had better put that in. That is why he is claiming for the furniture now.

10 MR. RICE: It is up to her to file it. She filed the form.

MR. VIRTUE: Well, you know how husbands and wives' furniture is. There might be a technical objection there but nothing practical, the husband and wife living in the same house and they are called into the same office and so she puts the furniture down on her form so he doesn't put it on his. I will put that in and at the same time declare on her behalf that she is making no claim
20 for furniture as long as he is.

(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 5).

MR. RICE: I am not filing it.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: You are not filing it, are you, Mr. Rice?

MR. RICE: No, I am not filing it, your Honour.

MR. VIRTUE: I am filing it as part of my case.

That will be all, thank you, Mr. Arizono.

MR. RICE: Just a moment, please.

MR. VIRTUE: Oh, pardon me.

30 MR. RICE: I would like to ask him a question or two.

Z. Arizono,
Re-Cross Exam.

RE-CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q I show you a letter (indicating). Is that your wife's signature on it there?

A I believe it is. I can only read the last part of the name.

Q Why can't you read the first part of it?

MR. VIRTUE: Perhaps if my learned friend will show me the letter, I will show it to the son who has some little knowledge of English.

10 MR. RICE: Just a minute. He is doing all right. If I get stuck, I will ask for your help.

A Yes, it is my wife's writing.

Q It is your wife's writing?

A Yes.

MR. RICE: This is a letter, your Honour, dated January 18th, 1943, written to Mrs. Zentaro Arizono at New Denver, B.C., by George B. Spain, Protection Department of the Custodian's office, and it reads as follows:

20 "Dear Madam:

In your registration" --

MR. VIRTUE: -- Let me understand this. I thought some letter was shown to this witness and he was asked if that was his wife's handwriting.

MR. RICE: No, his wife's signature.

MR. VIRTUE: His wife's signature?

MR. RICE: Yes, his wife's signature and he said it was.

30 "In your registration with the Custodian you declared personal property at 355 Powell

"Street, and at the same time you expressed your intention of selling your chattels.

We have heard nothing further from you on the subject and, in the meantime, our representative has visited your former residence and was there informed that you had disposed of your chattels prior to your evacuation.

If this is correct, we assume that you have no other personal property remaining in the restricted area of British Columbia requiring our protection -- in which event we would ask you to kindly sign and return the attached copy of this letter for our records.

Your prompt reply will be appreciated.

Yours truly."

And that letter is signed by the claimant's wife.

I would like to file that as an exhibit, your Honour.

(LETTER MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 6).

20 MR. RICE: That is all.

MR. VIRTUE: Q: Do you know yourself if your wife did sell your furniture before she was evacuated or did she leave it there?

A I don't know, I was away at camp.

Q Oh, I see, you were away, too. That explains it. All right, thank you.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is that all, Mr. Rice?

MR. RICE: Yes, your Honour.

(Witness aside)

We are mailing this letter to you in duplicate so that you may have one for each of the above boat files.

These boats were supposed to have been seized by the Navy on the Naas or in Prince Rupert. Our Mr. Quisenberry received a Bill of Sale for each of them and took a delivery order from your offices early this spring. These delivery orders were forwarded to our representative in Prince Rupert to take possession of these boats together with eleven boats which had been seized from Wales Island. This man received the eleven from Wales Island and turned all of the delivery slips into the Navy but was unable to locate the above-mentioned two boats. Our man was in error delivering these two delivery slips to the Navy before the boats were produced and these slips are now on the files of Commander Reed and yourself. This was explained to you verbally ~~over~~ the telephone this date.

These two boats were afterwards located under the roadway crossing Cow Bay in Prince Rupert. The boats apparently had been left there

by the Japanese and they were in such shape that it was not advisable to move them as we could see very little salvage had they been taken from where they were beached. Each tide was going in and out of them, making the engine and the boat quite useless for future use. This condition was given to Commander Reed's department verbally by the writer upon his arrival in Prince Rupert about the end of April this year.

"HINATA #2": We paid into your department the sum of \$225.00 in order to get a Bill of Sale for the boat. We also paid an additional \$100.00 previously to the Japanese to purchase the boat. Therefore, we are making claim to the Navy through your department in the amount of \$325.00 and trust this will receive your favourable consideration in deciding to make payment of this amount to our Company. We are merely asking for the amount we paid for the boat the summer before and no more.


The "K Y #1" was purchased by the Japanese with our funds for the sum of \$200.00 in the fall of 1940. The late Mr. Matheson, who was in charge of Tallheo Cannery at the time, gave the Japanese \$200.00 with which to purchase this boat and as the Navy cannot deliver it to us in good condition we are making a claim on you for the amount of \$200.00.

As a matter of record we left with you this date the complete file for these two boats, including Bills of Sale, licenses and sundry papers.
