THE SECRETARY: Case No. 687, Toyohisa Koyanagi.

MR. RUSSELL: Your Honour, at the outset it appears that there will be an amendment of the proof of claim downward. In the proof of claim it was first requested or claimed in the sum of \$1586.00 and the amendment is now to \$1547.09.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: How much is it?

MR. RUSSELL: \$1547.09.

10

TOYOHISA KOYANAGI, the claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. RUSSELL:

Q Mr. Koyanagi, I am showing you a statement of your claim (indicating).

A Yes.

Q Is this your signature (indicating) at the end of that statement? A: Yes.

Q Is this statement true and correct?

A Yes.

20 Q And it was made under your instructions?

A Yes.

Q And you are familiar with its contents and know it to be true to the best of your belief?

A Yes.

MR. RUSSELL: I am putting that in, sir, as an exhibit.

(SUMMARY MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. RICE: May I ask my learned friend just what part  
30 of the claim has been deleted to reduce the amount

-- is it the vessel?

MR. RUSSELL: I believe the fishing gear was reduced a matter of about \$25.00, that was the one change. Actually there was not one but several changes on that.

MR. RICE: Well, I have it totalled \$1517.30, but it is really a little more.

MR. RUSSELL: Here it is (indicating).

MR. RICE: That is \$1547.09?

10 MR. RUSSELL: Yes. I am going to ask my learned friend to admit the sale of the vessel for \$284.00; the sale of the nets , corks, cork lines and leads, for \$183.51.

MR. RICE: Well, I will put in, your Honour, an analysis of personal property claim which will show these items.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: You will file that now, Mr. Rice?

MR. RICE: I will file it now if my learned friend asks for it.

20 MR. RUSSELL: All right.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

MR. RUSSELL: Will you also be putting in the J.P. form, Mr. Rice?

MR. RICE: Yes, all right. I would like him to identify that as being the document.

MR. RUSSELL: Q: This is your signature, Mr. Koyanagi?

A Yes.

Q And that document was signed by you on the 3rd of April, 1942, or thereabouts?

30 A Yes.

Cross-Exam.

MR. RUSSELL: I simply point out, sir, that on the back of this document there was listed the nets, the lines and the boat which have been subsequently claimed by the claimant.

(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Are you filing this document, Mr. Rice, or is Mr. Russell filing that?

MR. RICE: Mr. Russell has asked to have it filed.

It is part of the Custodian's file or the document is from the Custodian's file.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Very well.

MR. RICE: I am submitting, your Honour, that the fishing vessel was sold for its fair market value.

I am submitting that the chattels were sold for their fair market value.

I am submitting the nets were sold for their fair market value.

I am submitting that any claim made by the claimant that the Custodian may be held in any way responsible for is exorbitant.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q Where did you reside at the time you were evacuated? A: Eburne.

Q At Eburne? A: Yes.

Q What house number? A: House number 18.

Q How far is that from Steveston?

A Oh, about three or four miles, I think.

30 Q About how many miles?



A Three or four miles, Terra Nova Cannery.

Q What cannery?

A Terra Nova.

Q Terra Nova?

A: Yes.

Q Is Tadashi a son of yours?

A Tadashi.

Q Tadashi Koyanagi?

A: No.

Q He is not?

A: No.

Q Do you know him?

10 A Yes, I know.

Q You know him?

A: Yes.

Q He was a boy at that time going to school?

A Yes.

Q He wasn't fishing and had no nets?

A No.

MR. RICE: It would appear, your Honour, that a net tagged No. 4 had the name of Tadashi Koyanagi instead of the claimant's name, Toyohisa Koyanagi. This net, as I say, was tagged as No. 4 and sold for \$175.00 to the B.C. Packers. It has developed that Tadashi, who was a school boy apparently at that time of sixteen years of age, had no nets and it is felt that this net should belong to the claimant here, and this money apparently has been put in a suspense account until this matter has been dealt with.

Q You were moved to Hastings Park first?

A Yes.

Q And after you had been there for some time you went back to your place, did you not?

30



T. Koyanagi,  
Cross-Exam.

- A Yes.
- Q When you did, you took several articles that you owned in the way of chattels and food?
- A No, I did not.
- Q Did you take any articles or chattels or household effects or food from your place at that time?
- A No. There was illness in the house and therefore I wasn't able to move anything at all. I wasn't able to move out of the house because of illness.
- 10 Q Who was ill, and what was the illness?
- A My wife was ill at the time.
- Q And what was her trouble? Was it some contagious disease?
- A No, she had a miscarriage.
- Q There would be nothing to prevent you from moving chattels if you wanted to then, would there?
- A No, but I did not do so.
- Q When would that be? How long after you had been in Hastings Park did you go back there?
- 20 A I was in Hastings Park from the 28th of May until September.
- Q Who is Otohashi Koyanagi?
- A He is a relative of mine.
- Q Did he live with you in House 18?
- A Yes.
- Q And his chattels were in the same house?
- A Yes.
- Q Well who is Ryushin Koyanagi?
- A He was a child of this Otohashi.
- 30 Q How old a child? A: About twenty.



T. Koyanagi,  
Cross-Exam.

Q Twenty? A: Yes.

Q He lived there with you?

A That was a mistake. Otohashi wasn't living with us but had left his furniture with us and that also applies to Ryushin.

Q Was Ryushin a married man?

A No.

Q But he had chattels or effects of his own?

A Yes.

10 Q And Ryushin's chattels were left in your house?

A Yes.

Q And who was H. Negro? A: He lived in the same block with us.

Q And he left his chattels in your house?

A No, he did not.

Q None of his chattels were left in your house?

A No.

Q Now you say positively that after you went to Hastings Park you never returned to your home and removed an article?

20

A No, I didn't, but I may have gone to my own house.

Q You have already told me that you went home but you didn't take anything away on account of illness in your family?

MR. RUSSELL: I don't think that is correct.

MR. RICE: Well let the record speak.

A I don't quite clearly recollect. I may have gone home.

Q You may have gone home, but you don't clearly recollect that you went home? A: No.

30



Q Did your wife take the sewing machine?

A I think it was left at home.

Q You think it was left at home?

A Yes.

Q Well when your wife left though, did she take it?

A No, it wasn't possible to take a thing like that, just our suitcases and shoe bags.

Q Did you ever have it sent to you?

A No. We wanted several things sent but nothing was sent to us.

10

Q Did your wife or you ever turn the sewing machine over to a friend to look after for you?

A No, it was too big to move.

Q How much did that sewing machine cost you?

A Around \$185.00.

Q Around \$185.00?

A: Yes.

Q Did you buy it new?

A: Yes.

Q What was it, an electric or a treadle machine?

A It was a treadle machine.

20 Q And it was a Singer machine, was it?

A Yes.

Q What kind was it, just a drop head or folded in at the top?

A It was a drop machine.

Q The head dropped in?

A: Yes.

Q Was it open or was it boxed?

A It was the kind that drops in and the lid went down over it.

Q The lid went down?

A: Yes.

30 Q And then dropped on either side?

- A Yes.
- Q And then the rest open, the treadle was?
- A There was a sort of cover just around the treadle.
- Q A cover around the treadle?
- A Yes, just where the feet fit in.
- Q Are you sure it wasn't \$85.00 that you paid for it?
- A Well it was some time ago so that I do not quite remember.
- Q When your wife left did she leave any rice there?
- 10 A Yes.
- Q How much? A: About one hundred pounds.
- Q How do you know?
- A It was a 100-pound sack.
- Q How do you know she didn't use it before you left?
- A No, she didn't use it.
- Q All right.

RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. RUSSELL:

- 20 Q Mr. Koyanagi, there is a statement (indicating) showing eight nets which you claim are yours?
- A Yes.
- Q Are all of those nets yours?
- A Yes, mine, they are all tagged.
- Q All eight of them? A: Yes.
- Q You know them also by description as well as by your own tag, is that correct?
- A Yes.
- Q And those eight you identify as nets which you had
- 30 at the time of your evacuation?



T. Koyanagi,  
Re-Direct Exam.

A Yes.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Ask him about No. 4 there, how the other tag happened to be attached to it.

MR. RICE: I think, your Honour, perhaps an officer of the cannery just made a mistake in getting this man's name. He may have got the wrong name.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Perhaps that is what happened.

10 MR. RICE: With regard to the No. 4 net, this boy was then sixteen years of age, was not fishing, and had no interest in any nets at all and it was felt that that net belonged to this claimant.

MR. RUSSELL: I have no further questions.

(Witness aside)
