THE SECRETARY: Case No. 757, Katsujiro Narukami.

KATSUJIRO NARUKAMI, the claimant herein,
being first duly sworn, testified
through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. VIRTUE:

Q Now, you were a fisherman, were you, before you
were evacuated? A: Yes.

Q And I show you a form here. Did you leave some
nets behind when you were evacuated?

10 A Yes.

Q Five nets? A: Yes.

Q And some net twine? A: Yes.

Q And here is a statement of the nets you left
behind and the value you put on them?

A Yes.

Q Where did you leave those nets?

A In the cannery.

Q Whereabouts? A: In the Imperial
Cannery.

20 Q In the Imperial Cannery? A: Yes.

Q Where is that? A: B. C. Packers,
Fraser River, Steveston.

Q Steveston? A: Yes.

Q Did you mark each net that you took with your
name and the price and so on? A: Yes.

Q Were they hung up? A: Yes, they were
hung in the cannery.

Q Now, is this price that you put on these nets a
fair price? A: Yes, they are
a very low estimate.

Q They are a very low estimate? A: Yes.

Q Now, you also left behind, I believe, some personal property, a little household furniture and some tools and fishing equipment, did you?

A Yes, I left everything.

Q And where did you leave your household furniture and tools and so on? A: I left it in one of the houses appointed by the cannery for such purposes.

10 Q At Steveston? A: Yes.

Q Now, are the prices you have put on your furniture and tools and so on fair prices, at the time you left? A: Yes, those are fair prices. I hadn't made them at all high. They are quite reasonable.

Q And you are claiming \$410.00 for that property?

A Yes.

Q Is that your name signed to the form?

A Yes.

20 MR. VIRTUE: I will put that in, sir, and I will ask leave to amend the claim according to the summary of evidence now put in. In other words, we are reducing the claim from the figures given in the proof of claim filed to the figures now given in the summary.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: What do they amount to?

MR. VIRTUE: In the proof of claim, sir?

MR. RICE: \$1300.00.

30 MR. VIRTUE: The nets were valued at \$550.00, and we are now reducing that to \$335.00; the net twine

was valued at \$250.00, and we have reduced it to \$194.00; and the personal property loss we have reduced from \$500.00 to \$410.00.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Yes. Very well.

(SUMMARY MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

10 MR. VIRTUE: I want to put in from our file, but apparently furnished by the Custodian, a copy of the net statement, showing three nets sold, not a tremendous difference in his value and their value. His value was \$205.00 and they sold them for \$165.00, \$40.00 difference, and then they were unable to account for two others valued at \$100.00 and \$30.00 respectively; and I will put that in.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

MR. VIRTUE: The proof of claim was first filed in general terms, sir, without giving details, and when we came to work out the details it was reduced. That is all, thanks.

20 MR. RICE: I am submitting, your Honour, that the chattels sold by the Custodian were sold at their fair market value. One item, the bed-room suite, there is no record of at any time. I notice in the amended claim it has now been dropped, or the claim made for the same.

I submit as an exhibit, your Honour, an analysis of personal property claim.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q I show you a J.P. form dated the 16th of April, 1942 (indicating); does that bear your signature?

A Yes.

MR. RICE: I tender that as an exhibit.

(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 4).

MR. RICE: Q: You sold one of your nets to the B. C. Packers, did you not, direct?

A Before evacuation or after?

10

Q It doesn't matter when. Did you sell a net to the B. C. Packers? A: Yes, I did.

Q In your J.P. form you only declared four nets, in the claim filed today by you you are claiming five? A: Yes. Altogether

I had before I left thirteen nets, but I sold some and at the time I left there were five there, and there is a record of those five on the books of the cannery.

Q Why did you in your J.P. form declare only five?

20

A This J.P. form I think must have been a mistake, because there were actually five nets left at the cannery.

Q I believe you are right on that. I have a statement here, your Honour, which says, "The following table is extracted from record books received from the B. C. Packers Company covering their Imperial Cannery (K; Saimoto) net house." Is that where you left your nets, at the Imperial Cannery, B. C. Packers Company? A: Yes.

Q "The Japanese Fish Collectors were instructed

to have the Japanese fishermen enter in these record books the nets which were left by them in the company net houses.

"The original record books are in the hands of Mrs. F. G. Shears, Director," and then there is a list of the nets, which are, apparently, listed in the name of Narukami, and these nets were listed there. I will submit the list. It doesn't correspond very well with the list set forth in Exhibit 1.

MR. VIRTUE: How many nets were there?

MR. RICE: Oh, there were five nets, apparently.

MR. VIRTUE: Well, I think that is as near as we can get to it, sir.

MR. RICE: I am going to submit that, if I may, sir, for the record. It is taken from the record in the Imperial Cannery.

(DOCUMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 5).

MR. RICE: I submit another list, it might be well to do so, for the record, and it reads,

"The following list of fishing equipment was sold direct to the B. C. Packers Company Limited by the Japanese fishermen, or credited to their accounts for money owing to the cannery.

"In accordance with arrangements made with the Cannery these lists were obtained direct from them on February 14th, 1946, by the Custodian and the original records remained with the B.C. Packers Company. The Custodian had no information from the Japanese fishermen of their selling or

receiving money direct from the cannery,"
and these are sales that were made of cork and
lead lines and floats amounting to \$138.00, and a
rowboat, oars and lock \$20.00. I don't think the
rowboat is the property of this man.

MR. VIRTUE: Apparently he sold some stuff for which
he is not now claiming for.

MR. RICE: But there is a net in this list that was
sold you will notice.

(DOCUMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 6).

MR. RICE: And then there is the appraisal of one net
made by Mr. C. P. Lecki, or a copy of an appraisal
made of a net, and I ask that that go in as an exhibit.

(APPRAISAL MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 7).

MR. RICE: And then there is a net statement showing the
value placed by the owner on three nets and what
they were sold for; one net not found, and one net
sold direct.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 8).

MR. RICE: That is all, thanks.

RE DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. VIRTUE:

Q Here is a list of stuff that the Pacific Cannery
says they bought from you before you were evacuated,
including one net. Now, look at that and see if
that is correct, and then tell us if your present
claim includes the net sold to the cannery, or
any of the other stuff sold to the cannery. I
would like to know the description of the net
too. Perhaps you had better first ask him, Did

he sell that stuff to the Pacific Cannery, and then I will follow up with the next question.

A This is a list of stuff that I left with the cannery and the prices, but I didn't sell it to them.

Q Did you get that money from them?

A Yes, I received \$20.00 for the rowboat.

Q Well, the other stuff that has been sold, take the net, did you sell that particular net to the

10 Pacific Cannery?

A: No, they didn't

buy it from me.

Q They didn't buy it from you? A: No, the cannery didn't buy any sockeye nets from me at all.

Q All right.

MR. RICE: Q: There was one matter I had overlooked.

I was under the impression that the bed-room suite was dropped, but apparently it is in the claim.

When did you buy your bed-room suite?

A I bought it and used it for three years before I was evacuated.

MR. VIRTUE: What was that answer again?

A I bought it and used it for three years before I was evacuated.

MR. RICE: Q: Did you buy it new? A: It was secondhand.

Q How much did you pay for it? A: \$95.00.

Q And you are valuing it today after using it three years, \$100.00?

A: Oh, did I put

\$100.00?

Q That is what your summary of evidence says.

A That is too much; it should be about half.

MR. VIRTUE: What did you intend to value it at?

A About half.

Q About half. All right, we have got that.

MR. RICE: Q: \$50.00? A: I bought it
for \$95.00.

MR. RICE: All right.

MR. VIRTUE: All right, thanks.
