THE SECRETARY: Case No. 776, Yoshiharu Toyoda.

YOSHIHARU TOYODA, the claimant herein,  
being first duly sworn, testified  
through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. RUSSELL:

Q Mr. Toyoda, I am showing you this -- can't you  
talk English? A: No.

Q I am showing you this summary of evidence in which  
you are claiming \$46.30; you are familiar with  
the contents of it? A: Yes.

10

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: How much did you say that his  
total claim is?

MR. RUSSELL: There are some nets for which he is  
claiming \$540.00 for; that was just the personal  
property.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Very well.

MR. RUSSELL: Q: And you are claiming \$545.00 for  
the nets, are you? A: Yes.

Q That is your signature at the end of this document?

20

A Yes.

Q And the same is true to the best of your knowledge,  
information and belief? A: Yes.

Q And it was prepared on your own instructions?

A Yes.

(SUMMARY MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. RUSSELL: All right.

MR. RICE: I am submitting, your Honour, that the nets  
and personal property were sold for their fair  
market value. I am submitting if the Custodian  
is responsible for any of these articles that

the claimant is claiming for that his claim is exorbitant, and I am submitting that the Custodian is not responsible for the same.

I would point out, your Honour, that certain nets that apparently belonged to the claimant were stored at the A.B.C. Packing Company and an offer was submitted to the claimant for the same which he refused, and after that it was impossible to sell the nets.

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I submit an analysis of personal property claim.  
(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q I show you a registration card dated the 7th of May, 1942 (indicating); does that bear your signature? A: Yes.

Q And in this card you state that you have no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in British Columbia? A: Yes.

MR. RICE: I tender that as an exhibit.

(CARD MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

MR. RICE: Q: I show you a proof of claim form, dated the 12th of November, 1947 (indicating); did you complete that form or was it completed under your instructions and does it bear your signature?

A Yes.

MR. RICE: I tender the proof of claim form.

(PROOF OF CLAIM FORM MARKED EXHIBIT No. 4).

MR. RICE: Q: There was a mortgage against your nets for \$250,64, was there not?

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A Yes.

Y. Toyoda,  
Cross Exam.

Q You left your nets at the Anglo-British  
Columbia Packing Company, did you not?

A Yes. It was called the A.B.C. Cannery.

Q The A.B.C. Cannery? A: Yes.

Q And they wrote you and made you an offer for your  
nets? A: Yes.

Q And you refused to accept the offer?

A Oh, I didn't do anything about it.

Q You didn't do anything about it?

10 A No.

Q Is the A.B.C. Cannery the same as the Knight Inlet  
Cannery? A: Yes.

Q The same thing. The A.B.C. Cannery is located at  
Knight Inlet? A: Yes, it was.

Q When you filed your claim last November, the  
12th of November, at that time you swore that  
your nets were worth \$360.00, today you swear  
that the same nets are worth \$605.00. Just what  
has raised the price of nets in that short length  
of time? A: I was informed

20 by the cannery that the nets were worth that much.  
That amount, I believe, includes some cord wood  
on it.

Q No, I left the cord wood out. Well, if it included  
cord wood, there is no mention of cord wood in the  
claim that you filed, and you were asked to complete  
a J.P. form and you declared that you had no  
property whatever in the protected area of  
British Columbia? A: I believe I declared

30 my nets.

Y. Toyoda,  
Cross Exam.

Q Well, last November you declared that your nets amounted to \$360.00 and the house belongings \$50.00? A: Yes.

Q Today you swear that the same nets are worth \$605.00? A: Well, that amount includes all the rest of my chattels.

Q I should think it would. Why didn't you declare your household effects instead of signing that card?

A I didn't declare those articles because the cannery said they would look after these nets for me, and I believe they reported my personal effects to the Custodian; I didn't have time to do so myself.

10

RE -DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. RUSSELL:

Q Is that the reason you signed that release saying you had no personal property?

A Yes, and I had no house of my own; it was just my personal property.

Q Why did you not do anything in regard to this offer of the purchase of the nets that my learned friend mentioned? A: Well, I never

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received any definite offer from the cannery.

Q You received no definite offer?

A I later wrote and asked them if they could sell the nets for me and I got a reply saying that the nets in the meantime had been stolen, had disappeared.

MR. RICE: Q: Have you got that letter?

A Well, I did have a letter, but I have lost it, but I definitely did receive a letter to that effect.

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Y. Toyoda,  
Re Direct.

MR. RUSSELL: Have you such a letter or a copy of it?

MR. RICE: No. You have gone through the file.

MR. RUSSELL: There is no such letter there, but that is only a portion of your entire file. We haven't got a copy.

MR. RICE: It might be well to bring it out, that they wrote and asked him about selling the nets, and they got no reply to that. He answered me that way on cross-examination.

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MR. RUSSELL: I looked through the correspondence about that offer and so far as I could see there was no definite offer made for the nets at all. There was some correspondence saying there was an offer, but there was no value put on the nets or anything of that nature.

MR. RICE: Well, all we know, your Honour, is the information of the Anglo-British Columbia Packing Company, who wrote the Custodian's office under date of August 25th, 1946, and I quote from part of the letter,

20

"We beg to advise that these nets are hanging here at this plant for disposal. Last Spring an offer was made to this man of his gear which he at that time refused to accept. At the time this offer was made we had a chance for disposal of same but now at this late date it is impossible for us to get return of same."

MR. RUSSELL: Of course, you can understand him not authorizing the sale with no figure set.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: He did not know what he was going to receive.

MR. RUSSELL: No.

MR. RICE: Their letter says "last Spring an offer was made to this man."

MR. RUSSELL: I looked through Mr. Rice's file and there is no mention of a sum, and we have evidence from this man that there were no figures set at all.

10 Q Mr. Toyoda, you say that you received a letter that the nets had been stolen? A: Yes.

Q Who was that letter from? A: From the manager.

Q The manager of what? A: The cannery, Norman Croker.

MR. RICE: Corker? A: Yes.

MR. RUSSELL: Q: When did you receive that letter?

A I think it was about two years ago I received that letter.

20 MR. RICE: I think perhaps I had better refer my learned friend to a letter received by the Custodian from the Anglo-British Columbia Packing Company Limited signed by Mr. W. N. Corker, under date of August 8th, 1946, which reads,

"Reference your No. 8467; of July 24th, re Yoshiharu Toyoda, we find that an old Cohoe net of Toyoda's was sold in 1943 for \$60.00, and that amount has been carried in our books since that date to the credit of the Japanese Custodian, and we enclose our draft for that amount. We still have on hand an old Sockeye net, and part of one Cohoe net."

MEMORANDUM

June 24/48

Re: TOYODA, Yoshiharu, Reg. No. 10344

Papers on File, following Miscellaneous Correspondence filed at back, are as follows:

1. Apr. 25/42 Ltr. and Inventory of goods of "Y. Toyoda". As no person of this name reported goods at Knight Inlet owner of goods could not be identified.
2. May 7/42 "J" Card "I have no property of any kind" signed "Y. Toyoda"
3. Aug. 17/43. Ltr. replying to inquiry of B.C. Security Commission re goods of Yoshiharu Toyoda.
4. Aug. 25/43. Ltr. from Knight Inlet Cannery Manager - offers to purchase made to Toyoda in 1942 refused - nets hanging at plant for disposal.
5. Sept. 1/43 Custodian to Mgr. Knight Inlet Cannery "Accept any offer which appears at all reasonable."
6. Sept. 1/43 Custodian to B.C.S.C. reporting on information received from Knight Inlet.
7. Nov. 29/43 Undated ltr. rec'd from Toyoda expressing annoyance that his goods had not been sold by Custodian - for first time reporting his goods to Custodian - ending "If you don't want to help -- I will handle this by myself."
8. Dec. 6/43 Custodian to Toyoda - Outlining history of his property to date - ending with "We do not see there is anything further that can now be done and in view of your last paragraph we shall take no further steps unless we hear further from you."
9. Apr. 25/45 Ltr. from Toyoda re nets and wood - reporting for first time kitchen goods at 2590 Eton St.
10. May 4/45 Ltr. to Toyoda referring to previous correspondence. Reporting goods sold at auction and stating that two boxes of books were held in warehouse.
11. Aug. 8/46 Ltr. from Anglo-British Columbia Packing Co., Knight Inlet enclosing \$60.00 for net sold in 1943, reporting 2 nets still on hand and referring to mortgage on net account. (The mortgage referred to, according to Mr. Matthews who was Mgr. of Knight Inlet Cannery in 1942 and 1943, was actually a net contract on which Toyoda owed \$250.64 - which is still unpaid)
12. Aug. 14/45 Ltr. to Toyoda re nets and mortgage of \$250.64.
13. June 23/48 Ltr. from Anglo-B.C. Packing Co. stating nets still at Knight Inlet Cannery, rotted away and useless for fishing.

Verbally, Mr. Matthews has informed this office that after the offers received in 1942 had been refused by Toyoda, there was no chance for sale of these nets because of seine-fishing having supplanted gillnet-fishing.

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HOUSEHOLD GOODS

14 & 15 - Auction Sheets July 12/44 & Dec. 21/45. 3 boxes & 1 carton identified as property of Yoshiharu Toyoda were found at 2590 Eton St. There is no record of the abandoning of the Japanese books, but Japanese books were not saleable, suffered deterioration from storage and, when warehouses were sold, books generally were abandoned.
