THE SECRETARY: Case No. 790, Yazaemon Tamura.

YAZAEMON TAMURA, the claimant herein,  
being first duly sworn, testified  
through the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. VIRTUE:

Q Where did you make your home before you were  
evacuated? A: Haney, B. C.

Q At Haney? A: Yes.

Q Did you live with your son? A: Yes, I lived  
10 on the same land as the previous witness. No,  
close to the previous witness; he is my son.

Q Close to the previous witness, and he is your son?

A Yes.

Q Now, did you leave behind you some personal  
property when you were evacuated in 1942?

A Yes, I asked the Custodian to take care of it  
before I left.

Q And I show you a J.P. form called a summary of  
evidence, which contains your name and so on,  
20 and a list of all your personal property and  
the values. Is that your signature (indicating)?

A Yes.

Q Did you prepare that form with the help of an  
interpreter? A: Yes.

Q And are the statements of the property left  
behind and the other statements in this form  
true statements? A: Yes.

Q How about the values you have shown here on this  
amounting to \$699.50; are those fair values?

30 A Yes. That is when I put them in that was my

idea that they are reasonable.

Q Is this your signature on this form?

A Yes.

MR. VIRTUE: I will offer that as an exhibit.

(SUMMARY MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. VIRTUE: That is all, thanks.

MR. RICE: I am submitting, your honour, that the chattels sold by the Custodian were sold for their fair market value.

10

I am submitting that the chattels claimed for by the claimant were turned over by the claimant to persons other than the Custodian and the Custodian is not responsible for the same, and I am submitting if the Custodian is responsible for any part of the claimant's claim, the claim made to the same is exorbitant.

I tender as an exhibit an analysis of personal property claim.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q I show you a J.P. form completed on the 23rd of April, 1942 (indicating); will you look at that document and tell me if it was prepared by you and completed and signed by you?

A Yes.

MR. RICE: I tender the J.P. form of the claimant as an exhibit.

(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

MR. RICE: Q: When you were evacuated where did

you leave this personal property, the chattels  
that you are now claiming for?

A In my house.

Q Did you own a house? A: It belonged  
to another son, a Canadian-born son.

Q Did you live with him? A: Yes.

Q You made your home with your son?

A Yes.

Q What is his name? A: One was named  
10 Makato and the other one was Yukio.

Q Did both sons own the property where you lived  
or did one of them? A: They owned it  
jointly.

Q What did they do with the property when they were  
evacuated? Did they rent it?

A They rented it and then reported all the details to  
the Custodian.

Q Who did they rent to? A: It was some white  
man but I have forgotten his name by this time.

20 Q Did the white man move in as you moved out?

A I believe he moved in right after we moved out.

Q And your chattels, where did you leave them, in  
the house? A: Yes, they were in  
one room.

Q And were your sons' chattels in the same room?

A Yes. Well, all the furniture and the personal  
property was practically -- practically all of the  
personal property was mine; my sons owned the  
house and land.

30 Q You don't mean to say that the incubators and all

those things were left in one room, do you?

A No, the incubators were left in the incubator house.

Q And you turned the key to the property over to the tenant; you don't know who he is?

A No, I brought the keys with me. It was my intention to return to the Coast after the war.

Q How did the tenant get in if you brought the keys with you?

A: No, I brought away the key to the room in which my personal effects were locked up, but the key to the house I left with the tenant. I handed the key of the house to the tenant.

10

Q The incubators that you are claiming for, were they electric or oil burning?

A No, those were oil burning.

Q And out of date, I take it? A: I don't know that they were out of date. Anyone in the chicken business in a very large way would use electric incubators but anyone, practically everyone handling about two to three thousand chickens are using oil burning incubators.

Q How old were these incubators?

A Three of them were ten years old and one was about two years old.

Q And this pipe that you are claiming for,  $1\frac{1}{4}$ -inch pipe,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch pipe and the  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe, how long had you been using that pipe?

A Oh, used it for about one month a year for about four or five years.

Q And the automatic water pump, how old was that?

A About a year and a half.

Q And your stove, when did you buy your stove?

A Which stove?

Q The kitchen range? A: About ten years.

Q And your beds, were those ten years too?

A Three of them were about four years old and one was about ten years old.

Q All right, thanks.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is that all?

10 MR. VIRTUE: Yes, sir.

I just want to call attention to the analysis filed by my learned friend, sir. Now, we are told that this man didn't have any real property, and he makes no claim for real property, yet we find under "sold with real property" four, six, seven, eight different chattels, all of them totalling about \$155.50 sold with the real property.

MR. RICE: There is a reason for that. These articles were attached to the real property. The claimant was living there.

20

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Have the owners of the real property made a claim?

MR. VIRTUE: Not that I know of.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: If the owners filed a claim I suppose then if the property was sold it would go with the real property.

MR. VIRTUE: That is a matter between the Custodian and the owners of the real property. It was up to the Custodian to find out about it, as this man left a list showing that he owned certain chattels and

where they were, and it was up to the Custodian to protect him. That is a matter of argument, but I am calling attention to that.

Then under "No account, theft, etc.," we find a list of fifteen or twenty articles totalling \$165.25; so that I merely call it to your attention for the record, sir.

- (b) The said personal property was left  
in the various buildings on the said  
land described above and the buildings  
were locked or padlocked.
- (c) The said property was left in the care  
of The Custodian of Enemy Alien Prop-  
erty.
- (d) An itemized description of the property  
with itemized list of values follows,  
the values being those at the time the  
property was handed over to The Custodian,  
some of the property having subsequently  
been sold and some of the property having  
been lost by the said Custodian, to the

(e) The amount of loss which I sustained was the sum of \$614.61 as the total amount which I received from The Custodian for the sale of such chattels as he did not lose was the sum of \$84.89.

(5) I would prefer to have this claim heard at Lethbridge, Alberta. I will require an interpreter, but my sons will be present at the Hearing and they have a good knowledge of the English language and would serve as interpreters.




