Q Where were the stoves left? A: In the cannery  
house.

30 Q When you say the cannery house, that means a

and which you occupied? A: My father occupied.

Q Your father? A: Yes.

Q But this property was your property?

A The personal property, yes.

Q Now, are these prices that you have put on  
showing the present value, \$243.00, what do you  
say about those prices? Are they reasonable or  
fair or high or low? A: It isn't fair.

10 Q Is it too high or too low? A: It is low, I  
think.

Q It is low, you think? A: Yes.

Q So that you think \$243.00 is a low selling price  
for the articles you left behind?

A Yes.

MR. VIRTUE: I will submit that as an exhibit.

MR. VIRTUE: I would like if my learned friend would

Q I believe some goods were shipped to you? Some

Then there is a pencilled memorandum on the bottom,

"Hold till other replies come in re goods stored in Fukushima's house and then a re-check may be necessary",

and another memo on the bottom,

"Do not follow up at present owing to change in policy."

Those are pencilled memoranda. I will put that in.

(LETTER MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3).

MR. RICE: That is that the goods had to be sold, they couldn't be shipped, your Honour, the change in policy.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Yes.

MR. VIRTUE: All right, thank you.

MR. RICE: I am submitting, your Honour, that the chattels were sold, the chattels that were sold by the Custodian were sold for their fair market value. I am submitting if there are any chattels that the Custodian is responsible for to this

I tender as an exhibit an analysis of personal property claim.

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. RICE:

Q I show you a J.P. form dated the 22nd of April, 1942; did you complete and sign that form? You can look over it, if you wish. Can't you say whether it is your signature or not?

A Yes, it is my signature.

Q It is your signature? A: Yes.

Q That document was completed by you, was it?

A Yes.

MR. RICE: All right. I tender the J.P. form as an exhibit, your Honour.

MR. RICE: Q: I show you a release~~x~~ dated November 9th, 1943 (indicating); was that release completed by you or for you?

A That is terrible, I think.

Q You had used it for six years and it cost you \$180.00?

A: Well, half of the time I didn't use it, you see.

Q The mirror that you value at \$10.00 was sold at auction for \$4.50?

A: It is terrible I think.

Q What kind of a bed-room screen was it that you paid \$8.00 for?

A: It was in three folds and it was a very nice one.

Q I should think it would be. Was it solid metal? A screen costing \$8.00 would be a pretty good one, would it not?

A: It had hand-painting on it.

valued at \$6.00, sold for \$1.50, and you still

you are claiming \$12.00 for an article that you say  
you paid \$12.00 for, or do you consider it wouldn't  
depreciate at all in value when it was used a year?

bought it and left it.

Q Well, you had it a year; apparently, you bought  
it in '41, and were evacuated in '42?

A It was the first year, and I bought it late in  
November.

Q Do you do sewing? A: Yes.

Q As an occupation? A: Yes.

Q All right, thanks.






