ZENNOSHIN OIKAWA, the claimant herein, being
first duly sworn testified as follows:-

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. CHERNIAK:

Q Mr. Oikawa, I show you a typewritten statement,
was this prepared in accordance with your
instructions? A Yes.

Q Did you go over this with your son this afternoon
or this morning? A Yes.

Q And is that your signature? A Yes.

10 Q Are the contents of this statement true to the
best of your knowledge and recollection?

A Yes.

MR. CHERNIAK: I tender the statement referred to
as Exhibit 1, Your Honour.

(PERSONAL PROPERTY STATEMENT, EXHIBIT 1.)

MR. FERG: They are both personal property?

MR. CHERNIAK: There is only one personal property
statement. Your Honour, on behalf of my learned
friend I tender the Custodian's Analysis as
20 Exhibit 2.

(ANALYSIS, EXHIBIT 2.)

MR. CHERNIAK: Your Honour will note that there is
some ink writing on this Exhibit 2 and you will
see in Exhibit 1 the statement in regard to the
nets, that all nets for which claim is made are
fully set out in my J.P. Form copy of which appears
in the left hand column on the Custodian Analysis
sheet. I have written in my recollection of the
original value. The age and value of the nets was
30 given in my J.P. Form and is set out in the

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analysis. I have receipts for the 2 nets which are shown declared and not found." What he means by value, Your Honour is, we wrote in in the left hand column of Exhibit 2, the original values of these nets and in some cases the age at date of evacuation, and the ink writing on Exhibit 2, I believe, is my learned friend's copy of what I wrote in on my copy. As I have said, the claim further states in Exhibit 1 that "I have receipts for the 2 nets which are shown declared and not found." That is in reference to Exhibit 2 where there are two 'X's' showing declared , not found.

Q Mr. Oikawa, referring to one net for which you are making claim and which is shown as 320 fathoms, $6\frac{1}{2}$ x 5/50 x 30, 34 pounds, I show you a sheet of paper, it being a bill form of the Great West Packing Company Limited, can you identify that?

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A It is a receipt for nets for which I am making claim.

Q Was that receipt given to you?

A I received this from the Packing Company.

Q And was the signature 'J.C. Williamson - who is that person? A He is an employee of the Great West Packing Company, an office man.

MR. CHERNIAK: I tender as Exhibit 3 Your Honour, a receipt from the Great West Packing Company Limited, dated May 16th, 1942, having written on it 'Registration. 05509, which I might point out is the Royal Canadian Mounted Police number of

MR. CHERNIAK: Exhibit 3 reads as follows:

"Received from Z. Oikawa, 1 net 6½ x 5/50 x 30 34#, 320 F. Selvage." It also refers to the net which Your Honour will see mentioned as 67 pounds. It says further down "Held in storage for sale by Great West Packing Company, Steveston, price, 67 pounds \$240.00, 34 pounds \$130.00. This is in regard to the first net shown in Exhibit 2 as having been declared but not found.

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Q Mr. Oikawa, I show you another ink written paper, can you identify that sheet?

A This is a list of nets

Q I see written in pencil is handwriting "Nets below received for storage and sale at Ewen Company. Albert Olson", do you know who wrote that? A The Cannery watchman.

Q Does this represent a receipt for the nets shown listed on this piece of paper?

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A Yes.

MR. CHERNIAK: I tender as Exhibit 4, Your Honour, a sheet of paper which is headed Z. Oikawa #05509 Care of Ewens Cannery, B.C. and dated May 15th, 1942. It is a list of 11 nets and the first one is shown as number 69, 60 x 50/5 x 7 7/8 with lines (1 Season) \$10.00. That is in regard to the second item in the Custodian's Analysis marked declared and not found.

MR. FERG: Have you got the receipt, Mr. Cherniak
for the other articles claimed not found?

MR. CHERNIAK: Which one is that?

MR. FERG: 320 fathoms, 34 pound web, \$130.00

MR. CHERNIAK: That is the one that is filed as
Exhibit 3 and the second receipt is Exhibit
4.

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MR. FERG: Yes, right.

MR. CHERNIAK: In regard now, Your Honour, to this
boat. Exhibit 1 sets out the details as to the
boat. It was purchased in 1937 for \$5.00 but
the claimant sets out that he did a great deal
of work on it. He put a new keel on it about
one or two years after purchase at a cost of
about \$35.00, new keel and engine bedding and
he installed a 5 horse power Yale Engine at a
cost of about \$75.00 and there is a list of
additional equipment which he installed in the boat
bringing the total cost of the boat up to \$155.50
and he believes that the fair market value of
this boat at date of sale was about \$120.00
In this connection, Your Honour, we will have to
amend our claim in regard to the boat by reducing
the claim from \$150.00 to \$120.00 and showing
the same credit of \$50.00

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THE COMMISSIONER: You are amending by setting out
your claim for the boat at \$120.00, less \$50.00,

that is \$70.00?

MR. CHERNIAK: Yes, Your Honour. I think, possibly, I can do better than that, Sir, by showing you the net now aside from the boat. The total value of the gear comes to \$1,107.00, the sale price was incorrectly shown in our claim, it should be \$634.05 and the loss on the gear is therefore \$472.95. Adding the loss of the boat, \$70.00, the total loss is therefore \$542.95

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CROSS EXAMINED BY MR. FERG:

MR. FERG: It is submitted Your Honour that the boat sold at its fair market value, that the chattels were sold at their fair market value and that the articles claimed for, which were declared, not found, that the prices claimed are excessive. I will file an unsigned certificate report, or Survey Report of John Gould, Marine Surveyor and Appraiser in connection with the boat. I suppose there is a signed Report somewhere, but this one is dated August, 1942 and it is on John Gould's stationery and is a Survey Report which shows the value of the boat at \$50.00.

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(SURVEY REPORT, EXHIBIT 5.)

MR. FERG:

Q You and your boy fished together?

A My son did the fishing and I used the boat myself for other purposes.

Q Now the son that you refer to is Hiskashi?

A Yes.

- Q And this boat, you say you didn't use it for fishing purposes, that is the fishing vessel N.W.093 F? A Yes, that is the one I used myself N.W.093 F.
- Q For fishing? A No.
- Q Now you purchased this boat for \$5.00 in 1937?
- A Yes.
- Q And was it a second hand boat then?
- A Yes.
- 10 Q And the equipment that you put in, the engine and so on, was put in when?
- A I am not certain but I think 1939.
- Q Was the equipment, the engine and so on that you put in it new when you bought it?
- A No, it was old.
- Q Second hand equipment? A Yes, the engine only, I had to put in the shaft and propeller afterwards.
- Q Did you do the work yourself?
- 20 A No, I asked a carpenter to do it.
- Q That is to instal the engine?
- A Yes, and the keel and other things.
- Q What would you say would be the average life of the boat and equipment of this type?
- A I feel certain that it could be used for 20 years.
- Q From the time it was new of course?
- A From the time I got it and fixed it.
- Q Did you have anybody give you aprice or value the boat before or after the Navy took it over?
- 30 A No.

Q Now with regard to the fishing equipment you are claiming for, you say that you didn't fish yourself? A I did before I bought that boat.

Q But the equipment that you are claiming for, the fish nets and so on, would that be purchased before or after you bought the boat?

A Yes, I used it.

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Q You didn't use it yourself? A My father my son and myself were partners, but my son used the nets.

Q Would it be possible that any of this equipment you are claiming for would belong to your son?

A No, it was my equipment, it was my equipment.

MR. FERG: All right, that is all.


MR. CHERNIAK: There is only one thing and that is this Marine Surveyors Appraisal, that is filed subject to his attendance at Vancouver for cross-examination?

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


