being first duly sworn testified as
follows:

MR. CHERNIAK: In this case, Your Honour, I ask
leave to amend. I ask leave to show the total
value of this property at \$1,175.00; the
Custodian's sale price at \$225.00 - I am sorry,
Sir, the total value should be \$975.00;
Custodian's sale price \$225.00 and the loss is
therefore \$750.00.

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. CHERNIAK:

Q Mr. Kubota, I show you a typewritten statement,
was this prepared in accordance with your
instructions? A Yes.

Q Is that your signature? A Yes.

Q And you swear that the contents are true to the
best of your knowledge, information and belief?

A Yes.

20 MR. CHERNIAK: I tender the statement as Exhibit 1,
Your Honour.

(PERSONAL CHATTEL STATEMENT, EXHIBIT 1.)

MR. CHERNIAK: Your Honour will note that it consists -
the claim consists first of a 1936 $\frac{1}{2}$ ton Ford
truck which the Claimant state he bought in about
1938 for \$700.00 and about 1939 he bought four
new tires at a cost of an additional \$64.00. He
estimates its value at \$450.00. This truck was
sold by the Custodian for \$225.00. May I ask
my learned friend to produce the Royal Canadian

Mounted Police receipt for the truck. I produce from the Custodian's file, Your Honour the Royal Canadian Mounted Police receipt, Exhibit Report, dated March 9th, 1942, referring to this truck stating it appears in fair condition, the speedometer reading was 32094.

I will file that as an Exhibit, Your Honour.

(REPORT, EXHIBIT 2.)

MR. CHERNIAK: The next portion of the claim, Your honour, consists of three buildings which were on the land, on rented land. The Claimant sets out when the buildings were built, what they were like and his total estimated cost. He indicates what his consideration of the fair market value at date of evacuation was \$400.00 and he states that he has valued them on the basis of cost, less age and use and taking into consideration the fact that they would have to be removed to other land.

Q Mr. Kubota - - -

THE COMMISSIONER: You haven't filed an analysis as yet?

MR. CHERNIAK: I don't know that there is one?

MR. CHERNIAK: Yes.

MR. FERG: Yes, there is.

MR. CHERNIAK: Well, I haven't filed, it sir, but I can file it now. On behalf of my learned friend I file the Custodian's Analysis as Exhibit 3.

paper, dated November 17th, 1941, do you recog-
nize that? A I think this paper states
that this house belong to me.

10 Q When did you first obtain this paper? Would it
be the same date on which it is written?

A No answer.

Q There is a signature here T.Kubota, is that your
signature? A Yes.

MR. CHERNIAK: I tender this as Exhibit 4, Your
Honour, it reads as follows: "November 17th,
1941, I hereby agree to lease to Mr. T.Kubota
four acres more or less on Lot 11. Sec 25 at
Pitt Meds, Westminster District for the sum of
20 \$50 fifty dollars Per year for 3 years duration
1942 - 1943 - 1944 to be paid each year on the
1st day of October.

All buildings built by Mr. T.Kubota can be
removed by him to other property when lease
expires.

this lease was made up, is that right?

A Yes.

Q And you had other agreements of a similar nature with Mr. Mc Myn? A Yes.

10 MR. CHERNIAK: Your Honour, there is a memo which appears on the Custodian's file setting out certain facts which I would like to refer to. I am reading from the memorandum and my learned friend can confirm this information. It is to the effect that Mr. Kubota declared that he owned above buildings on the property leased by McMyn. It doesn't say when he declared it but I imagine it was on the J.P. Form and I believe my learned friend can confirm that. The buildings are itemized on the J.P. Form under the item of Statement on Real Property Occupied, under a three years lease of the property owned by McMyn. There is a yearly rental of \$50.00 which is paid up to date and he has a written agreement with Douglas McMyn that the house, 20 though on McMyn's land, belongs to T. Kubota. That is in the J.P. Form, Your Honour. Subsequently, after the Custodian had written letters to both Mr. McMyn and Mr. Kubota and not having received a reply the Custodian had its Mrs Moryson, its representative, interview Mr. McMyn and in April, 1943, Mr. Moryson received confirmation from Mr. McMyn that the house belonged to Kubota and that it had been agreed 30 that Kubota could tear it down or move the house

10 if he decided not to keep on renting the land. There is a further statement that Mr. McMyn advised Mr. Moryson he did not wish the house rented and in order to clear up the matter he might consider purchasing it for a reasonable price. The statement goes further that the Custodian wrote McMyn on June 25th, 1943 regarding the purchase of the building but no reply was received. The memo ends there, Your Honour and it appears if if nothing further was done by the Custodian. I am therefore asking the specific question to my friend as to whether he has any record of the Custodian having appraised this building or having advertised them for sale or in any way attempted to realize on the value of the buildings other than by writing a general letter to McMyn asking him if he is interested.

20 MR. FERG: There is nothing in the record, Your Honour, showing what has taken place, if anything, after that letter written to McMyn on the 25th of June, 1943.

MR. CHERNIAK: I wonder if we ought to file that letter to McMyn about the buildings since this appears to be the last step taken.

THE COMMISSIONER: What are you reading from?

MR. CHERNIAK: It is from the Custodian's file.

THE COMMISSIONER: Are you putting that in?

MR. CHERNIAK: No, we are just given a copy of it.

Mr. Ferg produces from his file a copy of this

letter of June 25th, 1943, addressed to Mr. McMyn from R.D. Richardson, a member of the Custodian's office "Dear Sir, Re: Takejiro Kubota.

According to our field men's report subject Japanese has a house built on your property and you do not wish to have this house rented. However, we understand you would consider purchasing the buildings to clear up the matter, and would appreciate your consideration of this matter. Yours truly"

(LETTER, EXHIBIT 5.)

MR. CHERNIAK: You will note, Your Honour that there is no price mentioned or no valuation of it at all. Coming now to the final portion of the claim, that is the claim for the chattels, the claimant sets out that he left the chattels at his home, 2273 McMyn Road, Pitt Meadows and that they were inventoried by the Custodian. He states that he has not shown a market value for the inventoried chattels but considers that if they were sold they would have brought in a minimum of \$125.00. In Exhibit 1 he does show certain of the larger items, showing the approximate date of purchase and the approximate price paid which, Your Honour will note, is in the neighborhood of \$225.00 to \$250.00 as the price paid for the items which he has shown in Exhibit 1. He feels himself incompetent to set a specific value for each item but he is claiming

\$225.00 for all items which items are set out in the Custodian's Analysis, Exhibit 3. I might say, Sir, that there is a claim made for Pacific Co-Op Union Shares, value unknown. We are withdrawing that. Thank you, Sir.

MR. FERG: It is submitted, Your Honour as to the Ford Truck claimed for, that this was sold at its fair market value and, in any event, in view of the fact that there was a ceiling price on these motor vehicles under the Wartime Prices and Trade Board regulations at that time, it is submitted that the amount claimed by the Claimant is in excess of the ceiling price and that therefore, the fair market value referred to in the terms of reference would be, in any event, not more than the ceiling price.

MR. CHERNIAK: May we know what the ceiling price was?

20

MR. FERG: I don't know, I am sorry, we would have to get that from the Wartime Prices and Trade Board. I expect that matter will be disposed of at the Coast. The truck was appraised by the McDermott Motors at \$225.00 and it was sold to C.H.Effinger for this amount. I will file the Appraisal, Your Honour, by the McDermott Motors Limited.

[APPRAISAL, EXHIBIT 6.]

MR. FERG: And while on the matter of submissions, I submit that the prices claimed for the other chattels is excessive and unreasonable.

Q Have you ever had an independent valuation made of the house and garage and other premises on McMyn's property? A No.



A Yes.


