2 YOSHIO MATSUI, the claimant herein, being first
duly sworn, testified as follows:

3 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BREWIN:

4 Q. You are making a claim in regard to a car?

5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. And is this your signature on a document
7 entitled "Personal Chattels" and are the facts set out
8 there correct? A. Yes.

9 Q. It says you bought the car in May 1940
10 for \$395.00; is that right? A. Yes, sir.

11 (PARTICULARS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY FORM
12 MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1)

13 Q. And have you any document that shows that
14 is what you paid for it? A. The only document is
15 this one here.

16 Q. The only document you are able to produce
17 is an insurance policy, No. 56227, dated the 25th.
18 of April, 1941. It says it was a used car, a coach,
19 and the purchase price to the claimant was \$395. and
20 that apparently was from information furnished by
you at that time, was it? A. Yes, sir.

21 Q. You haven't any other documents?

22 A. No.

23 Q. Who did you buy it from? A. I don't
24 recall now; I know the salesman but I don't recall
25 the firm.

26 Q. Where was it you got it? A. Vancouver.

27 Q. You don't recall the firm you got it from?

28 A. No.

29 Q. At the time of the evacuation had you driven
30 this car very much after you received it?

2 A. It was in constant service, but it was
3 kept in good shape because we had two stores and we
4 used to commute between the stores.

5 Q. You say it was kept in good shape?

6 A. Oh, yes.

7 Q. Q. I wonder if my friend has the report
8 of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on the seizure
9 of the car.

10 MR. CHRISTIE: I tender as Exhibit 2, the
11 report of the R.C.M.P.

12 (REPORT OF R.C.M.P. ON SEIZURE OF CAR
13 MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2)

14 MR. BREWIN: I notice on this report it gives
15 some of the details and refers to the condition of
16 the car as being poor, at the time this report was
17 made, and it says the appearance was poor?

18 A. I think it was just as good as any car
19 for its age. It wasn't poor, it was good, it was in
20 good shape.

21 Q. Then did you put in any new repairs or new
22 equipment after you bought it? A. Yes, we had a
23 new carbureator, and one new tire on it, and I think
24 the engine was rebored -- it was kept in shape anyway.

25 Q. It says something here about the fuel
26 pump. A. Yes, that is it, the fuel pump.

27 Q. Did you offer this car for sale to
28 anybody? A. No; well --

29 Q. Or agree to sell it to anybody before your
30 evacuation? A. Yes.

Q. What were the particulars in regard to
that?

2 A. We used the car until the last minute;
3 we had to use it. In fact we had two stores and we
4 had to close one and move the merchandise from one to
5 the other, and that is why we used it until the last
6 minute.

7 Q. Tell us first of all who you sold it to
8 or agreed to sell it to? A. This was James Marr;
9 he comes from Nanaimo. I got to know him, he bought
10 something in the store and he asked me if I had a car
11 to sell and I just happened to have my car to offer
12 him.

13 Q. For how much? A. I am not sure.

14 Q. I understand from the records that it was
15 \$225.00; is that correct? A. Yes.

16 MR. CHRISTIE: What records?

17 MR. BREWIN: It is referred to in your files.

18 Q. Did he actually pay anything? A. I believe
19 he left a deposit.

20 Q. There is a letter on file dated
21 March 9th, 1942, and it says that you received a
22 deposit of \$50. A. That is correct, sir.

23 Q. And the total amount to be paid for it
24 was \$225.? A. That is right.

25 Q. Did you return the deposit? A. Yes.

26 Q. To Mr. Marr? A. Yes.

27 Q. And the sale to Mr. Marr didn't go
28 through? A. No.

29 Q. Did you consider the price you sold it to
30 him for was a fair price? A. It was a matter of
just selling the car.



1 Q. What do you mean, it was just a matter of
2 selling the car? Was there any reason why you would
3 have to sell it at less than its fair value?

4 A. That was the price offered and there was
5 no alternative.

6 Q. Why was there no alternative?

7 A. Because everybody else was selling their
8 cars.

9 Q. You expected to have to turn it in, to
10 surrender it? A. Yes.

11 Q. And it was under those circumstances you
12 agreed to sell it for \$225.? A. Yes.

13 Q. My friend has produced from his file a
14 letter dated March 9, 1942, signed by yourself, and it
15 is a receipt saying you received the sum of \$50. as
16 a deposit to hold one Ford for Mr. James Marr, and
17 the balance to be paid was \$175? A. Yes.

18 Q. That document sets out the transaction
19 you had with Mr. Marr in respect to the car? A. Yes.

20 Q. When you had to surrender the car to the
21 R.C.M.P. you gave the \$50.00 back to Mr. Marr?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. They wouldn't let you sell it? A. It
24 was too late then.

25 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

26 Q. I am showing you the J.P. Form, dated
27 13th of April, 1942; is that your signature?

28 A. Yes.

29 (J. P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 4).

30 Q. Now, when you bought this car did you know

2 what the mileage was? A. I am not sure, sir, it
3 is such a while ago.

4 Q. When you went down to buy it wouldn't you
5 look at the speedometer to see how many miles the
6 car had been used before you would buy the car?

7 A. It was the first car I bought so I wasn't
8 familiar with those details. I bought it from a
9 Japanese salesman we trusted so I didn't inquire into
10 the mileage.

11 Q. You didn't look at the speedometer?

12 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: It wouldn't get him
13 very far if he did, would it?

14 MR. CHRISTIE: What was the condition of the
15 tires when you bought it? A. Very good.

16 Q. You did look at the tires? A. Oh, yes.

17 Q. Did you look at the body?

18 A. It was all right too.

19 Q. You looked at everything except the
20 speedometer? A. Yes.

21 Q. Then in the period that you had it, from
22 the time of purchase until it was taken over by
23 the custodian, how many miles did you put on it?

24 A. I don't know that.

25 Q. You don't know? A. No.

26 MR. CHRISTIE: I think it is a question of
27 valuation, your honour. That is all, thank you.

28 MR. CHRISTIE: Your honour, the defence is
29 the car was sold for its fair market value, and I
30 now have certain filings I wish to make.



This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 13, 1942. He was evacuated on June 1, 1942.

CHATTELS

MATSUI declared badminton and tennis sporting equipment left at 112 Main Street, in his own possession. On October 10, 1942, we wrote to MATSUI advising him that on investigation we had found that he had disposed of this equipment, or taken it with him, and if this was the case to sign and return the attached copy of the letter. The signed copy was received on November 16, 1942.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES

Car

MATSUI reported a 1933 Ford V8 car in custody at Hastings Park. MATSUI was advised on January 13, 1943, that his car had been sold for the net sum of \$112.56. On January 14, 1946, the sum of \$2.56 was deducted from the net proceeds of the sale to pay a claim in that amount filed against MATSUI by the B. C. Telephone Company. Authorization for this payment had been received from MATSUI on January 14, 1946. The remaining \$110.00 was remitted to MATSUI on September 3, 1947.

According to our letter of December 8, 1942, to MATSUI, the Liquid Air Company, at the request of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, was anxious to obtain particulars of any welding and cutting equipment which MATSUI may have left in the protected area. Our records showed that although MATSUI was the manager of a bicycle shop he did not declare ownership of any equipment of that nature. A form prepared by the Canadian Liquid Air Company was enclosed in our letter to MATSUI and he was asked to provide us with complete information by return mail. No reply was received by us in this connection.

MONIES OWING

In July, 1945, the sum of twenty-three cents was credited to MATSUI's account. This amount represented refund of B. C. Electric security deposit for light. These funds were remitted to MATSUI on September 3, 1947.

BONDS

MATSUI reported one \$100.00 Victory Bond. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

BANK ACCOUNT

MATSUI reported a \$500.00 account with the Bank of Montreal, Main and Hastings. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

LIFE INSURANCE
