Q. Mr. Hatanaka, is that your signature?

A. Yes.

Q. And was that form prepared upon your
instructions?

Q. And do you swear the contents of that are
true? A. Yes, sir.

MR. BEST: I submit as Exhibit 1 the Personal
Chattels Claim form.

(PARTICULARS OF PERSONAL CHATTELS, MARKED
EXHIBIT NO.1)

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Q. I understand you are making a claim before
this Commission on a 1941 Ford Tudor Coach. Is
that right?

18

A. Yes.

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Q. I am showing you a sales slip of Empire
Motors, Limited, Burrard and Dunsmuir, dated April 21,
1941, \$850.75, and a receipt from Vancouver Motors,
Limited, June 4, 1941, in favour of yourself for \$450.
And attached thereto is an invoice, One Ford Tudor,
Serial No. 015313, \$850.75. Do I understand that
you paid the \$850.75 in cash and this \$450. was the
trade-in value of your old car?

A. This \$850.75 was in connection with the
old car and then when I bought the new car this is
the amount of cash which I paid, this \$450.

Q. So that actually the trade-in value of your



1 old car was \$850.75 and you paid \$850. cash. Is
2 that correct?

3 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: No;. \$450.

4 MR. BEST: I am sorry; \$450., your honour.

5 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Ask him how much he got
6 for his old car.

7 THE WITNESS: \$850. for the old car, which
8 was the trade-in value of the old car.

9 MR. BEST: Q. And you paid \$450. cash as well
10 as the old car for the new one?

11 A. Yes.

12 MR. BEST: Exhibit 2 would be a sales slip of
13 Empire Motors Limited, together with a receipt and an
14 invoice attached.

15 (SALES SLIP, RECEIPT & INVOICE, MARKED
16 EXHIBIT NO.2)

17 MR. CHRISTIE: I tender as Exhibit 3 the
18 R.C.M.P. report, dated March 14, 1942, in respect of
19 a 1941 Ford Tudor car, Serial No. 2A10475, with a
20 speedometer reading of 5,854 miles.

21 (R.C.M.P. REPORT, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.3)

22 MR. BEST: Q. Apparently you turned your car
23 in to the R.C.M.P. on March 14, 1942. Is that correct?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. And, had the speedometer been working properly
26 ever since you bought the car?

27 A. Yes.

28 Q. So that you say you drove it about 5,800
29 miles. Is that right? A. Yes.

30 Q. I think that is all.



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CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

Q. I am producing a J.P. Form dated April 13, 1942. Whose signature is that?

A. That is my signature.

MR. CHRISTIE: I am filing the J.P. Form as Exhibit No. 4.

(J.P. FORM, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.4)

Q. When you bought this car did you ascertain the prices of Ford cars, if you bought them without a turn-in value?

A. Yes.

Q. And what was the usual sales price for a 1941 Ford Tudor Coach?

A. \$1,300.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Q. How much?

A. \$1,300.

MR. CHRISTIE: Q. What kind of car did you turn in? A. A 1939 Ford.

Q. And how far had it gone when you turned it in? A. I only used the previous car for about a month or two before turning it in. I do not remember what the speedometer reading was.

Q. Well, you bought the other car in 1939?

A. No. I bought it the same year I bought this one.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: He said he only ran it about a month.

MR. CHRISTIE: I understood him to say it was a 1939 car.



1 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: A 1939 model.

2 MR. CHRISTIE: Q. It was a used car when you
3 bought it? A. Yes.

4 Q. And, was this car driven mostly around the
5 city of Vancouver? Is that where you put on the
6 mileage? A. Yes.

7 Q. I think that is all, thank you.

8 MR. BEST: That is all, thank you, Mr.
9 Hatanaka.

10
11 MR. CHRISTIE: I have certain exhibits to file,
12 your honour.

13 There are two appraisals, one made by A.W. Cruise,
14 on March 16, 1943, and the appraised value is \$950.

15 They had a subsequent appraisal made by
16 McDermott Motors and it was appraised at \$695.

17 (TWO APPRAISALS, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.5)

18 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: They did not buy it?

19 MR. CHRISTIE: No.

20 MR. BEST: What is the date of the second
21 appraisal?

22 MR. CHRISTIE: There is no date on here. It is
23 just an extract from it.

24 MR. BEST: Do you know when the car was sold,
25 Mr. Christie?

26 MR. CHRISTIE: Yes. I have that part.

27 MR. BEST: It was sold for \$695.

28 MR. CHRISTIE: It was sold to the R.C.M.P.
29 August 31, 1942.

1 MR. BEST: On August 15 the proceeds were paid
2 to him, so, it was obviously before that.

3 MR. CHRISTIE: Perhaps I had better put in
4 this memorandum which indicates the date of the sale
5 of the car. I am putting in as Exhibit 6 a memorandum
6 in which it notes that it was sold to the R.C.M.P.
7 The selling price was \$695.

8 (EXHIBIT NO. 6: MEMANDUM OF SALE)

9 I think that is all the exhibits, your honour.

10 It is submitted that this car was sold at its
11 fair market value.

12 That concludes the defence, your honour.

13 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Very well.


