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YOSHIKAZU FUJIMOTO, the claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BEST:

Q. Is that your signature (Indicating)?

A. Yes.

Q. Was that form prepared upon your instructions?

A. Yes.

Q. And do you swear the contents are true?

A. Yes.

MR. CHRISTIE: I am filing as Exhibit 1 the Personal Chattels Claim form.

(PARTICULARS OF PERSONAL CHATTELS, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.1)

Q. I understand before evacuation you owned a 1936 Chevrolet truck?

A. Yes.

Q. And that truck was turned over to the R.C.M.P. in March 1942? A. Yes.

Q. Apparently you paid \$600. for it in October, 1941, just about five months before?

A. Yes.

Q. And, did you use it constantly for that five months? A. I think the mileage during that time was about 2,000. miles.

Q. I take it you used it for business purposes?

A. Yes. I was a farmer and I took chicken-manure to different places.

Q. From whom did you buy the car?

A. I think from some people by the name of



1 James Motors, Vancouver, on Main street.

2 Q. I see. Now, when did you buy these two new  
3 tires for which you paid \$45.?

4 A. I bought it some time in 1941 after I bought  
5 the truck. I am not quite certain; I think about  
6 Christmas.

7 Q. Was this wooden rack on the truck when you  
8 bought it?

9 A. No.

10 MR. CHRISTIE: I tender as Exhibit 2 the Analysis  
11 of Personal Property claim.

12 (ANALYSIS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY CLAIM, MARKED  
13 EXHIBIT NO.2)

14 MR. BEST: Q. You valued it at \$25. Did you  
15 pay \$25. for that rack?

16 A. That was made by my boy and I reckoned the  
17 cost of materials and paint and he used to do a  
18 certain amount of work and I put a value of \$25. on it.

19 Q. And these overload springs attached, \$15?  
20 When was that done?

21 A. That was done after. I put them on in the  
22 years after I had bought the car.

23 MR. CHRISTIE: I tender as Exhibit 3 the Vehicle  
24 Report of the R.C.M.P. This report is dated March 9,  
25 1942.

26 (R.C.M.P. VEHICLE REPORT, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.3)

27 There must be an error in the speedometer reading.  
28 It is up to 5 million, here.

29 MR. BEST: Underneath is probably the correct  
30 one. 2,053 is probably the distance he drove it.



1 He said he drove it about 2,000 miles.

2 MR. CHRISTIE: You might ask him.

3 MR. BEST: Q. The R.C.M.P. report on this car  
4 shows a speedometer reading of 2,053 miles. Did you  
5 turn the speedometer back when you bought the car?

6 A. No, I did not do anything to the speedometer.  
7 I did not have anything to it.

8 Q. Do you remember when you bought it what the  
9 reading on it was?

10 A. I think about 150 or 200 miles, I do not know.

11 Q. Well, now, according to the R.C.M.P. Report  
12 the only extra equipment on the truck is the fog-light  
13 and you have listed this wooden rack and the fog light  
14 and the back-up light and these overload springs.

15 Were they on the truck at the time the R.C.M.P. took

16 it over? A. They were all there when I delivered  
17 it to the Mounted Police.

18 MR. BEST: I should explain, perhaps, your  
19 honour, that this claim has been amended downwards  
20 slightly in view of the fact that the claimant included  
21 two fire-arms in his original claim, a Winchester .22  
22 valued at \$5, and a 12 gauge shotgun valued at \$25.  
23 Of course those were taken by the R.C.M.P. but they do  
24 not come within the terms of reference, so that the total  
25 value of the claimant's claim is now \$725.75, instead  
26 of \$755.

27 Q. You understand that you can get your rifle and  
28 your shotgun from the R.C.M.P. if you send them this  
29 receipt, that the Custodian is not responsible for them?

30 A. Yes.

Q. That is all.

---



1 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

2 Q. I am showing you a J.P. Card, dated June 12,  
3 1942. Whose signature is that?

4 A. I think that is my signature.

5 Q. You think that is your signature?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. I notice you say you did not have any  
8 property in the protected area. Did you forget about  
9 the car?

10 A. I was under the impression that this was my  
11 wife's card.

12 MR. CHRISTIE: We will file that as Exhibit 4.

13 (J.P. CARD, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.4)

14 Q. What was your occupation?

15 A. I was a farmer. The property belonged to  
16 my wife and I worked it.

17 Q. Were you present when the R.C.M.P. took  
18 this car?

19 A. I took it there, myself.

20 Q. And when you took it there was the back-up  
21 light on it?

22 A. Yes; I think so. Everything was on.

23 THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Q. Did this car belong to  
24 you or to your wife?

25 A. It was mine.

26 MR. CHRISTIE: Q. Where were these two new  
27 tires? Were they on the car or was one on the spare  
28 tire frame?

29 A. They were at the back of the car, both of  
30 them.



1 Q. Do you know what the speedometer reading  
2 was when you bought the car?

3 A. To the best of my recollection 180 to 200  
4 miles.

5 Q. It was what? A. To the best of my  
6 recollection 180 or 200 miles.

7 Q. Where did you buy this car?

8 A. James Motors, Main Street, Vancouver.

9 Q. Why are they claiming for licenceplates,  
10 1942? Do they not go with the car?

11 A. It was very early in the year and the licence-  
12 plates had not even been put on. I did not utilize it  
13 at all.

14 Q. Was this wooden rack set up on the car when  
15 you turned it in?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. That is all, thank you.

18 MR. BEST: That is all.

19  
20 MR. CHRISTIE: I file as Exhibit 5 the appraisal  
21 of the car.

22 (MOTORVEHICLE APPRAISAL, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.5)

23 It is by McDermott Motors. The appraised value  
24 is \$350. There is no date on it. It is exhibit 5.

25 I would like to file as Exhibit 6 a letter dated  
26 March 31, 1942 from the Japanese Liaison Committee  
27 addressed to the Custodian. It says:

28 " Mr. Y. Fujimoto of R.R. No. 1, Milner, B.C.  
29 turned over, on March 2, a  $\frac{3}{4}$  ton light delivery  
30 1937 model Chevrolet to the authority. Now he is





1 "willing to sale the said truck if it is possible.

2 Please be kind enough to inform me if he is  
3 allowed to sale it and in that case who shall  
4 we get in touch with regarding the same.

5 I am, Sir,"

6 (LETTER, MARCH 31, 1942, MARKED EXHIBIT NO.6.)

7 I have certain tenders to follow as Exhibit 7.

8 There is a tender of Fred Erickson dated July 22,  
9 1942, in the amount of \$192.

10 There is a tender dated July 24, 1942, from Bloom  
11 & Sigalet, Limited, and is in the amount of \$180.

12 There is a tender dated July 25, 1942, from the  
13 Johnston Motor Company Limited, in the amount of \$250.

14 There is a tender from Cyril T. Pitt of Duncan,  
15 British Columbia, dated July 25, 1942, in the amount of  
16 \$250. I believe this last tender was the one which was  
17 accepted and the car was sold to Mr. Pitt.

18 It is submitted that this car was sold at its  
19 fair market value.


