3 TOSHKAZU KOBAYAKAWA, the claimant herein, having
4 been first duly sworn,
5 testified as follows:

6 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. OPPER:

7 Q. I am showing you a sheet entitled
8 Personal Chattels. A. Yes.

9 Q. Is that your signature? A. Yes.

10 Q. Was this sheet prepared under your
11 instructions? A. Yes.

12 Q. Do you swear the contents are true?

13 A. Yes.

14 (PERSONAL CHATTELS CLAIM FORM MARKED
15 EXHIBIT NO. 1)

16 Q. What was your occupation before the
17 evacuation? A. Ship skipper.

18 Q. You owned a boat, did you? A. Yes.

19 Q. Was that boat known as the "Sunrise K"?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Now, at the present time you are claiming
22 for a number of items which appear to be in connection
23 with the gear of your boat. In the claim form which
24 you filed, dated the 15th of November, 1947, you
25 listed a certain number of miscellaneous items such as
26 clothing, oil cloth etc, and carpenter's tools?

27 A. Yes.

28 Q. What was all that, was that gear in
29 connection with the operation of your boat, the
30 "Sunrise K"?

A. No, I was fixing the boat
and everything was ready by December 9th, that is
Monday, and the war started on December 7th, and on

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December 8th the Navy took everything away.

Q. Was this your own boat or somebody else's?

A. Yes.

Q. This is the "Sunrise K"? A. Yes.

Q. Then you are telling us you left certain equipment, tools and other equipment on the boat which was taken away on December 8th?

A. Yes.

Q. Can you elaborate on the gear that was left there, can you elaborate on what type of gear it was?

A. Dog fishing gear.

Q. Do you know what the value of all that fishing gear was?

A. It cost me over \$1000., but I only got bills for that much.

Q. You are pointing to some bills?

A. It was all new stuff.

Q. And it was all for equipment for the repair of the boat?

A. An fishing gear.

Q. What is the total of these bills. These were all paid by you? A. Yes.

(ACCOUNTS ABOVE REFERRED TO MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2)

Q. Where did you get the carpenter tools?

A. My trade was a carpenter.

Q. You value them at \$73. What tools were in there?

A. The complete tools are nearly \$200. there.

Q. Part of them were given to you by your father?

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A. Yes.

Q. And you say the value of the tools you had
was about \$150?

A. Yes.

Q. That is a complete set of carpenter tools?

A. Yes, ship's carpenter tools.

Q. So you lost all the tools, they were on the
boat when the Navy took them over?

A. Yes.

MR. CHRISTIE: I do not wish to interrupt
my friend but he files a group of invoices, and I notice
in the claim the first item is \$451.62 out of a total of
\$826.21. I don't know how in the world I am going to
be able to conduct a proper examination.

MR. OPPER: What is your objection?

MR. CHRISTIE: I am objecting now that I
should not begin now to prepare an inventory and make
a list separately. I would have to go over all these
items.

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: Is that signed by
the claimant.

MR. OPPER: Yes.

The invoices are merely put in as separate
items.

What about this clothing, what clothing is this?

A. Suit, overcoat, shoes.

Q. That is a fairly extensive amount for
clothing; was there anything else besides the three items
you mentioned?

A. The shoes cost \$15. in Vancouver.

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Q. Did you just have one suit?

A. No, two or three.

Q. On the boat?

A. Yes, I kept everything on the boat,

Q. All your personal effects were on the boat?

A. Yes.

Q. What kind of a watch was this?

A. A. Bulova.

Q. The dress suit, what was that, a tail coat or what?

A. A dress suit.
you

Q. Why didn't/ever fill out the form declaring these chattels at the time you were evacuated?

A. Well, I was walking on Powell Street and the Mounties picked me up and took me to the Immigration Shed.

Q. Did you have an opportunity to list these things later on or not?

A. No, you couldn't go out; this is like a jail.

Q. Q. How can you remember now what you left?

A. I can think back.

Q. Was your boat in a state where it could go into operation for fishing at the time it was taken over? Was it completely equipped with provisions and everything on board?

A. Yes, it was ready to go out on December 9th?

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CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

Q. I am showing you a J.P. Form dated the 7th of April, 1942; is that your signature?

A. Yes.

Q. Can you read English? A. Yes.

Q. Would you read this here?

A. I didn't read that at Hastings Park.

Q. Read that small print there?

A. You were forced to sign this.

Q. Will you read that out loud.

A. I was just given it to sign, I didn't know what it was, I didn't understand what it was.

(J.P. FORM MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 3)

Q. When was the first time you advised the Custodian you had any property?

A. Last year, I think. I went to Mr. Best.

Q. Why didn't you tell the Custodian before this?

A. I had no choice.

Q. Couldn't you write to him?

A. I thought there was no use.

Q. I am showing you a letter dated May 8th, 1948; is that your signature? A. Yes.

Q. That is the first time you wrote to him?

A. Yes.

Q. You say the reason for the delay was because you moved to a new address? A. Yes.

Q. Didn't you know any other friends among the Japanese had signed the forms and sent in letters containing their lists of goods; weren't you aware of

3 A. Yes, I had heard of that, and I got in
4 touch with Mr. Best and he said that my things had been
5 taken over by some Committee and it wouldn't be much
6 use. I paid my wife's fare from B.C.

7 Q. I am showing you a typewritten form here.
8 Is that your signature? A. Yes.

9 Q. Where were you when you signed that?

10 A. This is the interment camp.

11 Q. Now, are you sure where you signed that?

12 That is your signature? A. Yes.

13 Q. You don't know where you signed it?

14 A. In the interment camp.

15 Q. What date were you there?

16 A. July 1942 until November. I only signed
17 my name on it; I think the notes were put in after.

18 Q. I tender a letter dated May 8th, 1948,
19 signed by the claimant, to the Custodian.

21 (FORM LETTER ADDRESSED TO THE CUSTODIAN
22 MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 5)

23 Q. I am showing you another paper headed
24 "Inventory" -- is that your signature?

25 A. Yes.

26 Q. When was that made?

27 A. That is May, 1942, I think.

28 Q. Was that an inventory of the boat?

29 A. Yes, the boat was sold to a fishing company.

30 Q. Did you send this to the Custodian?

A. At that time there was no Custodian.

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Q. Did you send it to any committee?

A. Yes.

Q. Why didn't you mention about your personal goods on this. Why didn't you draw it to the attention of the Committee you had these goods on the boat?

A. This Committee was only handling boats at that time.

Q. You didn't tell them anything about your belongings?

A. No.

Q. And the boat?

A. It was registered in my name.

Q. Who was the owner?

A. Half and half.

Q. I am advised this boat was owned by your uncle, Yoshizo Kobayakawa; did he own this boat?

A. He owned a half share.

Q. Did he live on it too?

A. No, he went to Japan. He is a National; that is why he couldn't own a boat.

Q. Did you ever get a claim from a lawyer, A. H. Young, on behalf of your uncle? Did you ever get a letter from him?

A. No.

Q. Did this lawyer to your knowledge ever make a claim for monies allegedly owed by you to your uncle?

A. No.

Q. Did you owe your uncle any money?

A. No, nothing; he owed me my wages yet -- six years wages.

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3 Q. I am showing you a letter dated July 13th
4 1942, from A. H. Young, addressed to the Custodian, and
5 I will just read one or two paragraphs:

6 "This vessel was built by my client but was
7 registered in his nephew's name because the
8 nephew operated the vessel during its charter
9 period which lasted about seven months in
10 each year. The nephew was paid for his
11 services and he had no claim or interest in
12 the vessel. He merely was a trustee of my
13 client."

14 THE WITNESS: No, my wages were not paid.

15 Q. Were any of these items you are claiming
16 for under the invoices -- were any of these bought
17 by your uncle?

18 A. No, everything by me.

19 Q. Did you pay for all the fuel oil there?

20 A. Yes, everything.

21 Q. What about this anchor, you are claiming
22 \$89. for, who did that belong to?

23 A. That is a dog fish gear anchor.

24 Q. Did it go with the boat when it was turned
25 into the Government?

26 A. Oh yes, everything.

27 Q. Everything in the boat when it was turned
28 over to the Navy? A. Yes.

29 Q. How much oil was in this boat at the
30 time it was turned into the Navy?

A. 300 gallons.

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Q. Did you look at the gauge before you
gurned it in?

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A. I filled up the tank.

Q. Were these galvanized pipes in the boat?

A. Yes, they were in the boat.

Q. What were these nine coils?

A. Those were dog fishing gear.

Q. Would that be fastened to the boat too?

10

A. No.

Q. It would go with the boat when the boat
was sold?

A. I left it inside the hatch.

Q. Did you have any other place of residence
besides your boat?

15

A. No; I was single at that time.

Q. You lived nowhere else?

A. Only the hotel.

Q. You operated boats for seven months of the

year? A. In the winter time too.

Q. Did you live in the boat 12 months of the

to watch the boat -- he went every two years to
Japan.

Q. Is fishing gear something ordinarily apart
from the boat itself? A. Yes.

Q. You buy a boat and you buy the gear?

A. Oh yes, it is extra.

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Q. Is the gear removable, can you take the gear

A. You could do that, but I got no time to.


It is submitted, your honour, that the

valuations placed on these goods were excessive.


It is also submitted, for the record, that

The claimant was given no opportunity to get possessions of these chattels. The claimant worked at Great Northern Cannery shipyards from Dec. 1941 till April 1942. The claimant never filled out a U. S. P. form declaring his personal chattels. The claimant's boat was later sold by the J. V. F. D. C.

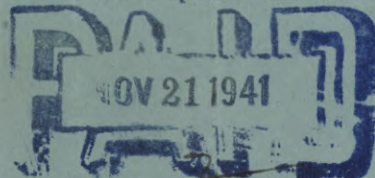

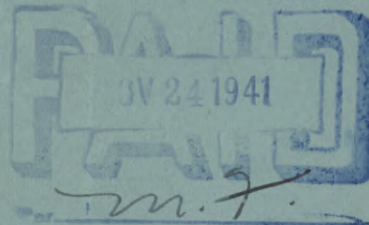

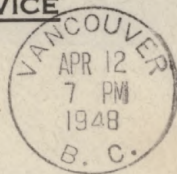

Dear Sirs:- I am acting for Mr. Yoshizo Kobayakawa,
boat-builder, formerly residing at Sherman, West Vancouver,
and now temporarily residing at #215 Gore Avenue, Vancouver,
B.C., to recover money from his nephew Toshikazu Kobayakawa, who
is now detained at the Immigration Building at Vancouver, B. C.
The claim is for the balance of proceeds of the sale of vessel
named "Sunrise K" which the nephew sold on or about the 24th
of March last, to the Canadian Fishing Company, Limited, for
the price of approximately \$3500.00.

This vessel was built by my client but was reg-
istered in his nephew's name because the nephew operated the
vessel during its charter period which lasted about seven
months in each year. The nephew was paid for his services and
he had no claim or interest in the vessel. He merely was a
trustee of my client.

My client was away in the interior, working in
a road-camp, when the vessel was sold and when he heard of it
he sent a request to his nephew to turn over the money. After
repeated demands the nephew turned over to an aunt of his the

Will it be possible for your department to hold the money that this nephew is wrongfully withholding from my client until such time as my client's claim can be arbitrated or adjudicated in Court?

I am instructed that the nephew either has the money on his person or it is kept in the Royal Bank, East End Branch, Vancouver, B. C.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

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Re: KOBAYAKAWA, Toshikazu - Reg. No. 00109.

The above signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 7, 1942 and was interned on June 2,, 1942. He was released from Angler Internment Camp on November 9, 1942.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

The vessel "Sunrise K." was registered in the name of Toshikazu and sold by him to the Canadian Fishing Co. Ltd. for the net sum of \$3,465.00. This money was remitted to him on March 18, 1942. Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA, File 13119, uncle of Toshikazu declared that he owned the boat. This is dealt with more fully in the Liability Summary.

Donald H. Bain have a lien of \$300.00 on this boat. This appears to be against Yoshizo as the Ship's registry showed no encumbrance. Yoshizo, being a Japanese National could not own a British Boat.

BANK ACCOUNT:

A.H. Young, acting on behalf of Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA in connection with the Sunrise K. advised that Toshikazu had an account or safety deposit box in the Royal Bank, East End Branch, Vancouver. This proved to be an error.

LIFE INSURANCE:

While he was interned, Toshikazu declared that he held a Life Insurance policy with the Mutual Life, in the amount of \$1,000.00. A premium notice was received from the Insurance Co. but Toshikazu had left the Internment Camp and we advised the insurance Co. that the Custodian had no further interest in the policy.

A notice of reinstatement was later received and forwarded to Toshikazu.

The file reveals no other property.

This summary is certified to be in accordancw with the information on file.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY FOR CLAIM

CLAIMANT: Toshikazu KOBAYAKAWA

Reg. No. 00109.

On April 7th, 1942, Toshikazu KOBAYAKAWA signed our Form "J" card stating that he did not own any property of any kind in the Protected Area.

Re claim on Page 1 amounting to \$462.51. It appears that Toshikazu KOBAYAKAWA is claiming on equipment and work done on the vessel "Sunrise K". According to Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA's JP Declaration, October 6th, 1942 (on claim file) and letter July 13th, 1942, signed by A.H. Young, Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA was the owner of "Sunrise K", but the vessel was registered in the name of Toshikazu KOBAYAKAWA. Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA being a Japanese national could not legally own a British boat. Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA was Toshikazu's uncle. This vessel was sold by Toshikazu and only \$1,500.00 of the sales money was paid to Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA. Sale price being approximately \$3500.00. This part of the claim is outside the Terms of Reference.

Re claim for Machinery and Tools amounting to \$73.00 and claim for Clothing etc., amounting to \$290.70. As stated above KOBAYAKAWA did not declare owning property of any kind at anytime, and we, therefore, have no record of same.

N.B. Yoshizo KOBAYAKAWA's R.C.M.P. form states he is owner of boat which is used by and is in the name of his nephew: Toshikazu KOBAYAKAWA.
